

## Book of Job Chapter 32

18\_JOB\_32\_01 So these three men ceased to answer Job, because he [was] righteous in his own eyes.

18\_JOB\_32\_02 Then was kindled the wrath of Elihu the son of Barachel the Buzite, of the kindred of Ram: against Job was his wrath kindled, because he justified himself rather than God.

18\_JOB\_32\_03 Also against his three friends was his wrath kindled, because they had found no answer, and [yet] had condemned Job.

18\_JOB\_32\_04 Now Elihu had waited till Job had spoken, because they [were] elder than he.

18\_JOB\_32\_05 When Elihu saw that [there was] no answer in the mouth of [these] three men, then his wrath was kindled.

18\_JOB\_32\_06 And Elihu the son of Barachel the Buzite answered and said, I [am] young, and ye [are] very old; wherefore I was afraid, and durst not show you mine opinion.

18\_JOB\_32\_07 I said, Days should speak, and multitude of years should teach wisdom.

18\_JOB\_32\_08 But [there is] a spirit in man: and the inspiration of the Almighty giveth them understanding.

18\_JOB\_32\_09 Great men are not [always] wise: neither do the aged understand judgment.

18\_JOB\_32\_10 Therefore I said, Hearken to me; I also will show mine opinion.

18\_JOB\_32\_11 Behold, I waited for your words; I gave ear to your reasons, whilst ye searched out what to say.

18\_JOB\_32\_12 Yea, I attended unto you, and, behold, [there was] none of you that convinced Job, [or] that answered his words:

18\_JOB\_32\_13 Lest ye should say, We have found out wisdom: God thrusteth him down, not man.

18\_JOB\_32\_14 Now he hath not directed [his] words against me: neither will I answer him with your speeches.

18\_JOB\_32\_15 They were amazed, they answered no more: they left off speaking.

18\_JOB\_32\_16 When I had waited, [for they spake not, but stood still, [and] answered no more;]

18\_JOB\_32\_17 [I said], I will answer also my part, I also will show mine opinion.

18\_JOB\_32\_18 For I am full of matter, the spirit within me constraineth me.

18\_JOB\_32\_19 Behold, my belly [is] as wine [which] hath no vent; it is ready to burst like new bottles.

18\_JOB\_32\_20 I will speak, that I may be refreshed: I will open my lips and answer.

18\_JOB\_32\_21 Let me not, I pray you, accept any man's person, neither let me give flattering titles unto man.

18\_JOB\_32\_22 For I know not to give flattering titles; [in so doing] my maker would soon take me away.
