## Page 1 Book of 1st Corinthians Chapter 14

46\_1CO\_14\_01 Follow after charity, and desire spiritual [gifts], but rather that ye may prophesy.

46\_1CO\_14\_02 For he that speaketh in an [unknown] tongue speaketh not unto men, but unto God: for no man understandeth [him]; howbeit in the spirit he speaketh mysteries.

46\_1CO\_14\_03 But he that prophesieth speaketh unto men [to] edification, and exhortation, and comfort.

46\_1CO\_14\_04 He that speaketh in an [unknown] tongue edifieth himself; but he that prophesieth edifieth the church.

46\_1CO\_14\_05 I would that ye all spake with tongues, but rather that ye prophesied: for greater [is] he that prophesieth than he that speaketh with tongues, except he interpret, that the church may receive edifying.

46\_1CO\_14\_06 Now, brethren, if I come unto you speaking with tongues, what shall I profit you, except I shall speak to you either by revelation, or by knowledge, or by prophesying, or by doctrine?

46\_1CO\_14\_07 And even things without life giving sound, whether pipe or harp, except they give a distinction in the sounds, how shall it be known what is piped or harped?

46\_1CO\_14\_08 For if the trumpet give an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself to the battle?

46\_1CO\_14\_09 So likewise ye, except ye utter by the tongue words easy to be understood, how shall it be known what is spoken? for ye shall speak into the air.

46\_1CO\_14\_10 There are, it may be, so many kinds of voices in the world, and none of them [is] without signification.

46\_1CO\_14\_11 Therefore if I know not the meaning of the voice, I shall be unto him that speaketh a barbarian, and he that speaketh [shall be] a barbarian unto me.

46\_1CO\_14\_12 Even so ye, forasmuch as ye are zealous of spiritual [gifts], seek that ye may excel to the edifying of the church.

46\_1CO\_14\_13 Wherefore let him that speaketh in an [unknown] tongue pray that he may interpret.

46\_1CO\_14\_14 For if I pray in an [unknown] tongue, my spirit prayeth, but my understanding is unfruitful.

46\_1CO\_14\_15 What is it then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding also: I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also

46\_ICO\_14\_16 Else when thou shalt bless with the spirit, how shall he that occupieth the room of the unlearned say Amen at thy giving of thanks, seeing he understandeth not what thou sayest?

46\_1CO\_14\_17 For thou verily givest thanks well, but the other is not edified.

46\_1CO\_14\_18 I thank my God, I speak with tongues more than ye all:

46\_1CO\_14\_19 Yet in the church I had rather speak five words with my understanding, that [by my voice] I might teach others also, than ten thousand words in an [unknown] tongue.

46 1CO 14 20 Brethren, be not children in understanding: howbeit in malice be ye children, but in understanding be men.

46 1CO 14 21 In the law it is written, With [men of] other tongues and other lips will I speak unto this people; and yet for all that will they not hear me, saith the Lord.

46\_1CO\_14\_22 Wherefore tongues are for a sign, not to them that believe, but to them that believe not: but prophesying [serveth] not for them that believe not, but for them which believe.

46\_1CO\_14\_23 If therefore the whole church be come together into one place, and all speak with tongues, and there come in [those that are] unlearned, or unbelievers, will they not say that ye are mad?

46\_1CO\_14\_24 But if all prophesy, and there come in one that believeth not, or [one] unlearned, he is convinced of all, he is judged of all:

46\_1CO\_14\_25 And thus are the secrets of his heart made manifest; and so falling down on [his] face he will worship God, and report that God is in you of a truth.

46\_1CO\_14\_26 How is it then, brethren? when ye come together, every one of you hath a psalm, hath a doctrine, hath a tongue, hath a revelation, hath an interpretation. Let all things be done unto edifying.

46\_1CO\_14\_27 If any man speak in an [unknown] tongue, [let it be] by two, or at the most [by] three, and [that] by course; and let one interpret.

46\_1CO\_14\_28 But if there be no interpreter, let him keep silence in the church; and let him speak to himself, and to God.

46\_1CO\_14\_29 Let the prophets speak two or three, and let the other judge.

46\_1CO\_14\_30 If [any thing] be revealed to another that sitteth by, let the first hold his peace.

46\_1CO\_14\_31 For ye may all prophesy one by one, that all may learn, and all may be comforted.

46\_1CO\_14\_32 And the spirits of the prophets are subject to the prophets.

46\_1CO\_14\_33 For God is not [the author] of confusion, but of peace, as in all churches of the saints.

46\_1CO\_14\_34 Let your women keep silence in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak; but [they are commanded] to be under obedience, as also saith the law.

46\_1CO\_14\_35 And if they will learn any thing, let them ask their husbands at home: for it is a shame for women to speak in the church.

46\_1CO\_14\_36 What? came the word of God out from you? or came it unto you only?

46 1CO 14 37 If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord.

46\_1CO\_14\_38 But if any man be ignorant, let him be ignorant.

46\_1CO\_14\_39 Wherefore, brethren, covet to prophesy, and forbid not to speak with tongues.

46\_1CO\_14\_40 Let all things be done decently and in order.
