uncorruptness 0090 # adiaphthoria {ad-ee-af-thor-ee'-ah}; from a derivative of a compound of 1 (as a negative particle) and a derivative of 1311; incorruptibility, i.e. (figuratively) purity (of doctrine): -- {uncorruptness}. [q]

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
