alive 2227 # zoopioeo {dzo-op-oy-eh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and 4160: to (re-)vitalize (literally or figuratively): -- make {alive}, give life, quicken. [q]

beast 2226 # zoon {dzo'-on}; neuter of a derivative of 2198; a live thing, i.e. an animal: -- {beast}. [q]

captive 2221 # zogreo {dzogue-reh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and 64: to take alive (make a prisoner of war), i.e. (figuratively) to capture or ensnare: -- take {captive}, catch. [q]

catch 2221 # zogreo {dzogue-reh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and 64: to take alive (make a prisoner of war), i.e. (figuratively) to capture or ensnare: -- take captive, {catch}. [q]

give 2227 # zoopioeo {dzo-op-oy-eh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and 4160: to (re-)vitalize (literally or figuratively): -- make alive, {give} life, quicken. [q]

life 2227 # zoopioeo {dzo-op-oy-eh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and 4160: to (re-)vitalize (literally or figuratively): -- make alive, give {life}, quicken. [q]

live 2225 # zoogoneo {dzo-og-on-eh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and a derivative of 1096: to engender alive, i.e. (by analogy) to rescue (passively, be saved) from death: -- {live}, preserve. [q]

make 2227 # zoopioeo {dzo-op-oy-eh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and 4160: to (re-)vitalize (literally or figuratively): -- {make} alive, give life, quicken. [q]

preserve 2225 # zoogoneo {dzo-og-on-eh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and a derivative of 1096: to engender alive, i.e. (by analogy) to rescue (passively, be saved) from death: -- live, {preserve}. [q]

quicken 2227 # zoopioeo {dzo-op-oy-eh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and 4160: to (re-)vitalize (literally or figuratively): -- make alive, give life, {quicken}. [q]

stir 0329 # anazopureo {an-ad-zo-poor-eh'-o}; from 303 and a compound of the base of 2226 and 4442: to re-enkindle: -- {stir} up. [q]

take 2221 # zogreo {dzogue-reh'-o}; from the same as 2226 and 64: to take alive (make a prisoner of war), i.e. (figuratively) to capture or ensnare: -- {take} captive, catch. [q]

up 0329 # anazopureo {an-ad-zo-poor-eh'-o}; from 303 and a compound of the base of 2226 and 4442: to re-enkindle: -- stir {up}. [q]

Zara 2196 # Zara {dzar-ah'}; of Hebrew origin [2226]: Zara, (i.e. Zerach), an Israelite: -- {Zara}. [q]

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
