plague 3148 # mastix {mas'-tix}; probably from the base of 3145 (through the idea of contact); a whip (literally, the Roman flagellum for criminals; figuratively, a disease): -- {plague}, scourging. [q]

scourge 3146 # mastigoo {mas-tig-o'-o}; from 3148; to flog (literally or figuratively): -- {scourge}. [q]

scourging 3148 # mastix {mas'-tix}; probably from the base of 3145 (through the idea of contact); a whip (literally, the Roman flagellum for criminals; figuratively, a disease): -- plague, {scourging}. [q]

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
