circumcise 4059 # peritemno {per-ee-tem'-no}; from 4012 and the base of 5114; to cut around, i.e. (specially) to circumcise: -- {circumcise}. [q]

circumcised 4061 # peritome {per-it-om-ay'}; from 4059; circumcision (the rite, the condition or the people, literally or figuratively): -- X {circumcised}, circumcision. [q]

circumcision 4061 # peritome {per-it-om-ay'}; from 4059; circumcision (the rite, the condition or the people, literally or figuratively): -- X circumcised, {circumcision}. [q]

uncircumcised 0564 # aperitmetos {ap-er-eet'-may-tos}; from 1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of 4059; uncircumcised (figuratively): -- {uncircumcised}. [q]

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
