abroad 1289 # diaspeiro {dee-as-pi'-ro}; from 1223 and 4687; to sow throughout, i.e. (figuratively) distribute in foreign lands: -- scatter {abroad}. [q]

basket 4711 # spuris {spoo-rece'}; from 4687 (as woven); a hamper or lunch-receptacle: -- {basket}. [q]

issue 4690 # sperma {sper'-mah}; from 4687; something sown, i.e. seed (including the male "sperm"); by implication, offspring; specifically, a remnant (figuratively, as if kept over for planting): -- {issue}, seed. [q]

receive 4687 # speiro {spi'-ro}; probably strengthened from 4685 (through the idea of extending); to scatter, i.e. sow (literally or figuratively): -- sow(-er), {receive} seed. [q]

scatter 1289 # diaspeiro {dee-as-pi'-ro}; from 1223 and 4687; to sow throughout, i.e. (figuratively) distribute in foreign lands: -- {scatter} abroad. [q]

seed 4687 # speiro {spi'-ro}; probably strengthened from 4685 (through the idea of extending); to scatter, i.e. sow (literally or figuratively): -- sow(-er), receive {seed}. [q]

seed 4690 # sperma {sper'-mah}; from 4687; something sown, i.e. seed (including the male "sperm"); by implication, offspring; specifically, a remnant (figuratively, as if kept over for planting): -- issue, {seed}. [q]

seed 4701 # spora {spor-ah'}; from 4687; a sowing, i.e. (by implication) parentage: -- {seed}. [q]

seed 4703 # sporos {spro'-os}; from 4687; a scattering (of seed), i.e. (concretely) seed (as sown): -- {seed} (X sown). [q]

sow 4687 # speiro {spi'-ro}; probably strengthened from 4685 (through the idea of extending); to scatter, i.e. sow (literally or figuratively): -- {sow}(-er), receive seed. [q]

sown 4703 # sporos {spro'-os}; from 4687; a scattering (of seed), i.e. (concretely) seed (as sown): -- seed (X {sown}). [q]

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
