dwel 4637 # skenoo {skay-no' -o}; from 4636; to tent or encamp, i.e. (figuratively) to occupy (as a mansion) or (specifically) to reside (as God did in the Tabernacle of old, a symbol of protection and communion): -- {dwel}. [q]

tabernacle 4636 # skenos {skay' -nos}; from 4633; a hut or temporary residence, i.e. (figuratively) the human body (as the abode of the spirit): -- {tabernacle}. [q]

tabernacles 4634 # skenopegia {skay-nop-ayg-ee' -ah}; from 4636 and 4078; the Festival of Tabernacles (so called from the custom of erecting booths for temporary homes): -- {tabernacles}. [q]
