

20_PRO_01_01 The proverbs of Solomon the son of David, king of Israel;

20_PRO_01_02 To know wisdom and instruction; to perceive the words of understanding;

20_PRO_01_03 To receive the instruction of wisdom, justice, and judgment, and equity;

20_PRO_01_04 To give subtlety to the simple, to the young man knowledge and discretion.

20_PRO_01_05 A wise [man] will hear, and will increase learning; and a man of understanding shall attain unto wise counsels:

20_PRO_01_06 To understand a proverb, and the interpretation; the words of the wise, and their dark sayings.

20_PRO_01_07 The fear of the LORD [is] the beginning of knowledge: [but] fools despise wisdom and instruction.

20_PRO_01_08 My son, hear the instruction of thy father, and forsake not the law of thy mother:

20_PRO_01_09 For they [shall be] an ornament of grace unto thy head, and chains about thy neck.

20_PRO_01_10 My son, if sinners entice thee, consent thou not.

20_PRO_01_11 If they say, Come with us, let us lay wait for blood, let us lurk privily for the innocent without cause:

20_PRO_01_12 Let us swallow them up alive as the grave; and whole, as those that go down into the pit:

20_PRO_01_13 We shall find all precious substance, we shall fill our houses with spoil:

20_PRO_01_14 Cast in thy lot among us; let us all have one purse:

20_PRO_01_15 My son, walk not thou in the way with them; refrain thy foot from their path:

20_PRO_01_16 For their feet run to evil, and make haste to shed blood.

20_PRO_01_17 Surely in vain the net is spread in the sight of any bird.

20_PRO_01_18 And they lay wait for their [own] blood; they lurk privily for their [own] lives.

20_PRO_01_19 So [are] the ways of every one that is greedy of gain; [which] taketh away the life of the owners thereof

20_PRO_01_20 Wisdom crieth without; she uttereth her voice in the streets:

20_PRO_01_21 She crieth in the chief place of concourse, in the openings of the gates: in the city she uttereth her words, [saying],

20_PRO_01_22 How long, ye simple ones, will ye love simplicity? and the scorners delight in their scorning, and fools hate knowledge?

20_PRO_01_23 Turn you at my reproof: behold, I will pour out my spirit unto you, I will make known my words unto you.

20_PRO_01_24 Because I have called, and ye refused; I have stretched out my hand, and no man regarded;

20_PRO_01_25 But ye have set at nought all my counsel, and would none of my reproof:

20_PRO_01_26 I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when your fear cometh;

20_PRO_01_27 When your fear cometh as desolation, and your destruction cometh as a whirlwind; when distress and anguish cometh upon you.

20_PRO_01_28 Then shall they call upon me, but I will not answer; they shall seek me early, but they shall not find me:

20_PRO_01_29 For that they hated knowledge, and did not choose the fear of the LORD:

20_PRO_01_30 They would none of my counsel: they despised all my reproof.

20_PRO_01_31 Therefore shall they eat of the fruit of their own way, and be filled with their own devices.

20_PRO_01_32 For the turning away of the simple shall slay them, and the prosperity of fools shall destroy them.

20_PRO_01_33 But whoso hearkeneth unto me shall dwell safely, and shall be quiet from fear of evil.

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20_PRO_02_01 My son, if thou wilt receive my words, and hide my commandments with thee;

20_PRO_02_02 So that thou incline thine ear unto wisdom, [and] apply thine heart to understanding;

20_PRO_02_03 Yea, if thou criest after knowledge, [and] liftest up thy voice for understanding;

20_PRO_02_04 If thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as [for] hid treasures;

20_PRO_02_05 Then shalt thou understand the fear of the LORD, and find the knowledge of God.

20_PRO_02_06 For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth [cometh] knowledge and understanding.

20_PRO_02_07 He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous: [he is] a buckler to them that walk uprightly.

20_PRO_02_08 He keepeth the paths of judgment, and preserveth the way of his saints.

20_PRO_02_09 Then shalt thou understand righteousness, and judgment, and equity; [yea], every good path.

20_PRO_02_10 When wisdom entereth into thine heart, and knowledge is pleasant unto thy soul;

20_PRO_02_11 Discretion shall preserve thee, understanding shall keep thee:

20_PRO_02_12 To deliver thee from the way of the evil [man], from the man that speaketh froward things;

20_PRO_02_13 Who leave the paths of uprightness, to walk in the ways of darkness;

20_PRO_02_14 Who rejoice to do evil, [and] delight in the frowardness of the wicked;

20_PRO_02_15 Whose ways [are] crooked, and [they] froward in their paths:

20_PRO_02_16 To deliver thee from the strange woman, [even] from the stranger [which] flattereth with her words;

20_PRO_02_17 Which forsaketh the guide of her youth, and forgetteth the covenant of her God.

20_PRO_02_18 For her house inclineth unto death, and her paths unto the dead.

20_PRO_02_19 None that go unto her return again, neither take they hold of the paths of life.

20_PRO_02_20 That thou mayest walk in the way of good [men], and keep the paths of the righteous.

20_PRO_02_21 For the upright shall dwell in the land, and the perfect shall remain in it.

20_PRO_02_22 But the wicked shall be cut off from the earth, and the transgressors shall be rooted out of it.



20_PRO_03_01 My son, forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments:

20_PRO_03_02 For length of days, and long life, and peace, shall they add to thee.

20_PRO_03_03 Let not mercy and truth forsake thee: bind them about thy neck; write them upon the table of thine heart:

20_PRO_03_04 So shalt thou find favour and good understanding in the sight of God and man.

20_PRO_03_05 Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.

20_PRO_03_06 In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

20_PRO_03_07 Be not wise in thine own eyes: fear the LORD, and depart from evil.

20_PRO_03_08 It shall be health to thy navel, and marrow to thy bones.

20_PRO_03_09 Honour the LORD with thy substance, and with the firstfruits of all thine increase:

20_PRO_03_10 So shall thy barns be filled with plenty, and thy presses shall burst out with new wine.

20_PRO_03_11 My son, despise not the chastening of the LORD; neither be weary of his correction:

20_PRO_03_12 For whom the LORD loveth he correcteth; even as a father the son [in whom] he delighteth.

20_PRO_03_13 Happy [is] the man [that] findeth wisdom, and the man [that] getteth understanding.

20_PRO_03_14 For the merchandise of it [is] better than the merchandise of silver, and the gain thereof than fine gold.

20_PRO_03_15 She [is] more precious than rubies: and all the things thou canst desire are not to be compared unto her.

20_PRO_03_16 Length of days [is] in her right hand; [and] in her left hand riches and honour.

20_PRO_03_17 Her ways [are] ways of pleasantness, and all her paths [are] peace.

20_PRO_03_18 She [is] a tree of life to them that lay hold upon her: and happy [is every one] that retaineth her.

20_PRO_03_19 The LORD by wisdom hath founded the earth; by understanding hath he established the heavens.
20_PRO_03_20 By his knowledge the depths are broken up, and the clouds drop down the dew.
20_PRO_03_21 My son, let not them depart from thine eyes: keep sound wisdom and discretion:
20_PRO_03_22 So shall they be life unto thy soul, and grace to thy neck.
20_PRO_03_23 Then shalt thou walk in thy way safely, and thy foot shall not stumble.
20_PRO_03_24 When thou liest down, thou shalt not be afraid: yea, thou shalt lie down, and thy sleep shall be sweet.

20_PRO_03_25 Be not afraid of sudden fear, neither of the desolation of the wicked, when it cometh.

20_PRO_03_26 For the LORD shall be thy confidence, and shall keep thy foot from being taken.

20_PRO_03_27 Withhold not good from them to whom it is due, when it is in the power of thine hand to do [it].

20_PRO_03_28 Say not unto thy neighbour, Go, and come again, and to morrow I will give; when thou hast it by thee.

20_PRO_03_29 Devise not evil against thy neighbour, seeing he dwelleth securely by thee.

20 PRO 03 30 Strive not with a man without cause, if he have done thee no harm.

20_PRO_03_31 Envy thou not the oppressor, and choose none of his ways.

20_PRO_03_32 For the froward [is] abomination to the LORD: but his secret [is] with the righteous.

20_PRO_03_33 The curse of the LORD [is] in the house of the wicked: but he blesseth the habitation of the just.

20_PRO_03_34 Surely he scorneth the scorners: but he giveth grace unto the lowly.

20_PRO_03_35 The wise shall inherit glory: but shame shall be the promotion of fools.



20 PRO 04 01 Hear, ye children, the instruction of a father, and attend to know understanding.

20 PRO 04 02 For I give you good doctrine, forsake ye not my law.

20 PRO 04 03 For I was my father's son, tender and only [beloved] in the sight of my mother.

20 PRO 04 04 He taught me also, and said unto me, Let thine heart retain my words: keep my commandments, and live.

20 PRO 04 05 Get wisdom, get understanding: forget [it] not; neither decline from the words of my mouth.

20 PRO 04 06 Forsake her not, and she shall preserve thee: love her, and she shall keep thee.

20 PRO 04 07 Wisdom [is] the principal thing; [therefore] get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding.

20 PRO 04 08 Exalt her, and she shall promote thee: she shall bring thee to honour, when thou dost embrace her.

20 PRO 04 09 She shall give to thine head an ornament of grace: a crown of glory shall she deliver to thee.

20 PRO 04 10 Hear, O my son, and receive my sayings; and the years of thy life shall be many.

20 PRO 04 11 I have taught thee in the way of wisdom; I have led thee in right paths.

20 PRO 04 12 When thou goest, thy steps shall not be straitened; and when thou runnest, thou shalt not stumble.

20 PRO 04 13 Take fast hold of instruction; let [her] not go: keep her; for she [is] thy life.

20 PRO 04 14 Enter not into the path of the wicked, and go not in the way of evil [men].

20 PRO 04 15 Avoid it, pass not by it, turn from it, and pass away.

20 PRO 04 16 For they sleep not, except they have done mischief; and their sleep is taken away, unless they cause [some] to fall.

20 PRO 04 17 For they eat the bread of wickedness, and drink the wine of violence.

20_PRO_04_18 But the path of the just [is] as the shining light, that shineth more and more unto the perfect day.

20 PRO 04 19 The way of the wicked [is] as darkness: they know not at what they stumble.

20 PRO 04 20 My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings.

20 PRO 04 21 Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart.

20 PRO 04 22 For they [are] life unto those that find them, and health to all their flesh.

20_PRO_04_23 Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it [are] the issues of life.

20 PRO 04 24 Put away from thee a froward mouth, and perverse lips put far from thee.

20 PRO 04 25 Let thine eyes look right on, and let thine eyelids look straight before thee.

20 PRO 04 26 Ponder the path of thy feet, and let all thy ways be established.

20 PRO 04 27 Turn not to the right hand nor to the left: remove thy foot from evil.



20_PRO_05_01 My son, attend unto my wisdom, [and] bow thine ear to my understanding:

20_PRO_05_02 That thou mayest regard discretion, and [that] thy lips may keep knowledge.

20_PRO_05_03 For the lips of a strange woman drop [as] an honeycomb, and her mouth [is] smoother than oil:

20_PRO_05_04 But her end is bitter as wormwood, sharp as a twoedged sword.

20_PRO_05_05 Her feet go down to death; her steps take hold on hell.

20_PRO_05_06 Lest thou shouldest ponder the path of life, her ways are moveable, [that] thou canst not know [them].

20_PRO_05_07 Hear me now therefore, O ye children, and depart not from the words of my mouth.

20_PRO_05_08 Remove thy way far from her, and come not nigh the door of her house:

20_PRO_05_09 Lest thou give thine honour unto others, and thy years unto the cruel:

20_PRO_05_10 Lest strangers be filled with thy wealth; and thy labours [be] in the house of a stranger;

20_PRO_05_11 And thou mourn at the last, when thy flesh and thy body are consumed,

20_PRO_05_12 And say, How have I hated instruction, and my heart despised reproof;

20_PRO_05_13 And have not obeyed the voice of my teachers, nor inclined mine ear to them that instructed me!

20_PRO_05_14 I was almost in all evil in the midst of the congregation and assembly.

20_PRO_05_15 Drink waters out of thine own cistern, and running waters out of thine own well.

20_PRO_05_16 Let thy fountains be dispersed abroad, [and] rivers of waters in the streets.

20_PRO_05_17 Let them be only thine own, and not strangers' with thee.

20_PRO_05_18 Let thy fountain be blessed: and rejoice with the wife of thy youth.

20_PRO_05_19 [Let her be as] the loving hind and pleasant roe; let her breasts satisfy thee at all times; and be thou ravished always with her love.

20_PRO_05_20 And why wilt thou, my son, be ravished with a strange woman, and embrace the bosom of a stranger?

20_PRO_05_21 For the ways of man [are] before the eyes of the LORD, and he pondereth all his goings.

20_PRO_05_22 His own iniquities shall take the wicked himself, and he shall be holden with the cords of his sins.

20_PRO_05_23 He shall die without instruction; and in the greatness of his folly he shall go astray.



20_PRO_06_01 My son, if thou be surety for thy friend, [if] thou hast stricken thy hand with a stranger,

20_PRO_06_02 Thou art snared with the words of thy mouth, thou art taken with the words of thy mouth.

20_PRO_06_03 Do this now, my son, and deliver thyself, when thou art come into the hand of thy friend; go, humble thyself, and make sure thy friend.

20_PRO_06_04 Give not sleep to thine eyes, nor slumber to thine eyelids.

20_PRO_06_05 Deliver thyself as a roe from the hand [of the hunter], and as a bird from the hand of the fowler.

20_PRO_06_06 Go to the ant, thou sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise:

20_PRO_06_07 Which having no guide, overseer, or ruler,

20_PRO_06_08 Provideth her meat in the summer, [and] gathereth her food in the harvest.

20_PRO_06_09 How long wilt thou sleep, O sluggard? when wilt thou arise out of thy sleep?

20_PRO_06_10 [Yet] a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep:

20_PRO_06_11 So shall thy poverty come as one that travelleth, and thy want as an armed man.

20_PRO_06_12 A naughty person, a wicked man, walketh with a froward mouth.

20_PRO_06_13 He winketh with his eyes, he speaketh with his feet, he teacheth with his fingers;

20_PRO_06_14 Frowardness [is] in his heart, he deviseth mischief continually; he soweth discord.

20_PRO_06_15 Therefore shall his calamity come suddenly; suddenly shall he be broken without remedy.

20_PRO_06_16 These six [things] doth the LORD hate: yea, seven [are] an abomination unto him:

20_PRO_06_17 A proud look, a lying tongue, and hands that shed innocent blood,

20_PRO_06_18 An heart that devise th wicked imaginations, feet that be swift in running to mischief,

20_PRO_06_19 A false witness [that] speaketh lies, and he that soweth discord among brethren.

20_PRO_06_20 My son, keep thy father's commandment, and forsake not the law of thy mother:

20_PRO_06_21 Bind them continually upon thine heart, [and] tie them about thy neck.

20_PRO_06_22 When thou goest, it shall lead thee; when thou sleepest, it shall keep thee; and [when] thou awakest, it shall talk with thee.

20_PRO_06_23 For the commandment [is] a lamp; and the law [is] light; and reproofs of instruction [are] the way of life:

20_PRO_06_24 To keep thee from the evil woman, from the flattery of the tongue of a strange woman.

20_PRO_06_25 Lust not after her beauty in thine heart; neither let her take thee with her eyelids.

20_PRO_06_26 For by means of a whorish woman [a man is brought] to a piece of bread: and the adulteress will hunt for the precious life.

20_PRO_06_27 Can a man take fire in his bosom, and his clothes not be burned?

20_PRO_06_28 Can one go upon hot coals, and his feet not be burned?

20_PRO_06_29 So he that goeth in to his neighbour's wife; whosoever toucheth her shall not be innocent.

20_PRO_06_30 [Men] do not despise a thief, if he steal to satisfy his soul when he is hungry;

20_PRO_06_31 But [if] he be found, he shall restore sevenfold; he shall give all the substance of his house.

20_PRO_06_32 [But] whoso committeth adultery with a woman lacketh understanding: he [that] doeth it destroyeth his own soul.

20_PRO_06_33 A wound and dishonour shall he get; and his reproach shall not be wiped away.

20_PRO_06_34 For jealousy [is] the rage of a man: therefore he will not spare in the day of vengeance.

20_PRO_06_35 He will not regard any ransom; neither will he rest content, though thou givest many gifts.



20_PRO_07_01 My son, keep my words, and lay up my commandments with thee.

20_PRO_07_02 Keep my commandments, and live; and my law as the apple of thine eye.

20_PRO_07_03 Bind them upon thy fingers, write them upon the table of thine heart.

20_PRO_07_04 Say unto wisdom, Thou [art] my sister; and call understanding [thy] kinswoman:

20_PRO_07_05 That they may keep thee from the strange woman, from the stranger [which] flattereth with her words.

20_PRO_07_06 For at the window of my house I looked through my casement,

20_PRO_07_07 And beheld among the simple ones, I discerned among the youths, a young man void of understanding,

20_PRO_07_08 Passing through the street near her corner; and he went the way to her house,

20_PRO_07_09 In the twilight, in the evening, in the black and dark night:

20_PRO_07_10 And, behold, there met him a woman [with] the attire of an harlot, and subtle of heart.

20_PRO_07_11 [She [is] loud and stubborn; her feet abide not in her house:

20_PRO_07_12 Now [is she] without, now in the streets, and lieth in wait at every corner.]

20_PRO_07_13 So she caught him, and kissed him, [and] with an impudent face said unto him,

20_PRO_07_14 [I have] peace offerings with me; this day have I payed my vows.

20_PRO_07_15 Therefore came I forth to meet thee, diligently to seek thy face, and I have found thee.

20_PRO_07_16 I have decked my bed with coverings of tapestry, with carved [works], with fine linen of Egypt.

20_PRO_07_17 I have perfumed my bed with myrrh, aloes, and cinnamon.

20_PRO_07_18 Come, let us take our fill of love until the morning: let us solace ourselves with loves.

20_PRO_07_19 For the goodman [is] not at home, he is gone a long journey:

20_PRO_07_20 He hath taken a bag of money with him, [and] will come home at the day appointed.

20_PRO_07_21 With her much fair speech she caused him to yield, with the flattering of her lips she forced him.

20_PRO_07_22 He goeth after her straightway, as an ox goeth to the slaughter, or as a fool to the correction of the stocks;

20_PRO_07_23 Till a dart strike through his liver; as a bird hasteth to the snare, and knoweth not that it [is] for his life.

20_PRO_07_24 Hearken unto me now therefore, O ye children, and attend to the words of my mouth.

20_PRO_07_25 Let not thine heart decline to her ways, go not astray in her paths.

20_PRO_07_26 For she hath cast down many wounded: yea, many strong [men] have been slain by her.

20_PRO_07_27 Her house [is] the way to hell, going down to the chambers of death.



- 20_PRO_08_01 Doth not wisdom cry? and understanding put forth her voice?
- 20_PRO_08_02 She standeth in the top of high places, by the way in the places of the paths.
- 20_PRO_08_03 She crieth at the gates, at the entry of the city, at the coming in at the doors.
- 20_PRO_08_04 Unto you, O men, I call; and my voice [is] to the sons of man.
- 20_PRO_08_05 O ye simple, understand wisdom: and, ye fools, be ye of an understanding heart.
- 20_PRO_08_06 Hear; for I will speak of excellent things; and the opening of my lips [shall be] right things.
- 20_PRO_08_07 For my mouth shall speak truth; and wickedness [is] an abomination to my lips.
- 20_PRO_08_08 All the words of my mouth [are] in righteousness; [there is] nothing froward or perverse in them.
- 20_PRO_08_09 They [are] all plain to him that understandeth, and right to them that find knowledge.
- 20_PRO_08_10 Receive my instruction, and not silver; and knowledge rather than choice gold.
- 20_PRO_08_11 For wisdom [is] better than rubies; and all the things that may be desired are not to be compared to it.
- 20_PRO_08_12 I wisdom dwell with prudence, and find out knowledge of witty inventions.
- 20_PRO_08_13 The fear of the LORD [is] to hate evil: pride, and arrogancy, and the evil way, and the froward mouth, do I hate.
- 20_PRO_08_14 Counsel [is] mine, and sound wisdom: I [am] understanding; I have strength.
- 20_PRO_08_15 By me kings reign, and princes decree justice.
- 20_PRO_08_16 By me princes rule, and nobles, [even] all the judges of the earth.
- 20_PRO_08_17 I love them that love me; and those that seek me early shall find me.
- 20_PRO_08_18 Riches and honour [are] with me; [yea], durable riches and righteousness.
- 20_PRO_08_19 My fruit [is] better than gold, yea, than fine gold; and my revenue than choice silver.

20_PRO_08_20 I lead in the way of righteousness, in the midst of the paths of judgment:

20_PRO_08_21 That I may cause those that love me to inherit substance; and I will fill their treasures.

20_PRO_08_22 The LORD possessed me in the beginning of his way, before his works of old.

20_PRO_08_23 I was set up from everlasting, from the beginning, or ever the earth was.

20_PRO_08_24 When [there were] no depths, I was brought forth; when [there were] no fountains abounding with water.

20_PRO_08_25 Before the mountains were settled, before the hills was I brought forth:

20_PRO_08_26 While as yet he had not made the earth, nor the fields, nor the highest part of the dust of the world.

20_PRO_08_27 When he prepared the heavens, I [was] there: when he set a compass upon the face of the depth:

20_PRO_08_28 When he established the clouds above: when he strengthened the fountains of the deep:

20_PRO_08_29 When he gave to the sea his decree, that the waters should not pass his commandment: when he appointed the foundations of the earth:

20_PRO_08_30 Then I was by him, [as] one brought up [with him]: and I was daily [his] delight, rejoicing always before him;

20_PRO_08_31 Rejoicing in the habitable part of his earth; and my delights [were] with the sons of men.

20_PRO_08_32 Now therefore hearken unto me, O ye children: for blessed [are they that] keep my ways.

20_PRO_08_33 Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not.

20_PRO_08_34 Blessed [is] the man that heareth me, watching daily at my gates, waiting at the posts of my doors.

20_PRO_08_35 For whoso findeth me findeth life, and shall obtain favour of the LORD.

20_PRO_08_36 But he that sinneth against me wrongeth his own soul: all they that hate me love death.

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20_PRO_09_01 Wisdom hath builded her house, she hath hewn out her seven pillars:

20_PRO_09_02 She hath killed her beasts; she hath mingled her wine; she hath also furnished her table.

20_PRO_09_03 She hath sent forth her maidens: she crieth upon the highest places of the city,

20_PRO_09_04 Whoso [is] simple, let him turn in hither: [as for] him that wanteth understanding, she saith to him,

20_PRO_09_05 Come, eat of my bread, and drink of the wine [which] I have mingled.

20_PRO_09_06 Forsake the foolish, and live; and go in the way of understanding.

20_PRO_09_07 He that reprove h a scorner getteth to himself shame: and he that rebuketh a wicked [man getteth] himself a blot.

20_PRO_09_08 Reprove not a scorner, lest he hate thee: rebuke a wise man, and he will love thee.

20_PRO_09_09 Give [instruction] to a wise [man], and he will be yet wiser: teach a just [man], and he will increase in learning.

20_PRO_09_10 The fear of the LORD [is] the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy [is] understanding.

20_PRO_09_11 For by me thy days shall be multiplied, and the years of thy life shall be increased.

20_PRO_09_12 If thou be wise, thou shalt be wise for thyself: but [if] thou scornest, thou alone shalt bear [it].

20_PRO_09_13 A foolish woman [is] clamorous: [she is] simple, and knoweth nothing.

20_PRO_09_14 For she sitteth at the door of her house, on a seat in the high places of the city,

20_PRO_09_15 To call passengers who go right on their ways:

20_PRO_09_16 Whoso [is] simple, let him turn in hither: and [as for] him that wanteth understanding, she saith to him,

20_PRO_09_17 Stolen waters are sweet, and bread [eaten] in secret is pleasant.

20_PRO_09_18 But he knoweth not that the dead [are] there; [and that] her guests [are] in the depths of hell.



20_PRO_10_01 The proverbs of Solomon. A wise son maketh a glad father: but a foolish son [is] the heaviness of his mother.

20_PRO_17_23 A wicked [man] taketh a gift out of the bosom to pervert the ways of judgment.

20_PRO_17_24 Wisdom [is] before him that hath understanding; but the eyes of a fool [are] in the ends of the earth.

20_PRO_17_25 A foolish son [is] a grief to his father, and bitterness to her that bare him.

20_PRO_17_26 Also to punish the just [is] not good, [nor] to strike princes for equity.

20_PRO_17_27 He that hath knowledge spareth his words: [and] a man of understanding is of an excellent spirit.

20_PRO_17_28 Even a fool, when he holdeth his peace, is counted wise: [and] he that shutteth his lips [is esteemed] a man of understanding.



20_PRO_18_01 Through desire a man, having separated himself, seeketh [and] intermeddleth with all wisdom.

20_PRO_18_02 A fool hath no delight in understanding, but that his heart may discover itself.

20_PRO_18_03 When the wicked cometh, [then] cometh also contempt, and with ignominy reproach.

20_PRO_18_04 The words of a man's mouth [are as] deep waters, [and] the wellspring of wisdom [as] a flowing brook.

20_PRO_18_05 [It is] not good to accept the person of the wicked, to overthrow the righteous in judgment.

20_PRO_18_06 A fool's lips enter into contention, and his mouth calleth for strokes.

20_PRO_18_07 A fool's mouth [is] his destruction, and his lips [are] the snare of his soul.

20_PRO_18_08 The words of a talebearer [are] as wounds, and they go down into the innermost parts of the belly.

20_PRO_18_09 He also that is slothful in his work is brother to him that is a great waster.

20_PRO_18_10 The name of the LORD [is] a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe.

20_PRO_18_11 The rich man's wealth [is] his strong city, and as an high wall in his own conceit.

20_PRO_18_12 Before destruction the heart of man is haughty, and before honour [is] humility.

20_PRO_18_13 He that answereth a matter before he heareth [it], it [is] folly and shame unto him.

20_PRO_18_14 The spirit of a man will sustain his infirmity; but a wounded spirit who can bear?

20_PRO_18_15 The heart of the prudent getteth knowledge; and the ear of the wise seeketh knowledge.

20_PRO_18_16 A man's gift maketh room for him, and bringeth him before great men.

20_PRO_18_17 [He that is] first in his own cause [seemeth] just; but his neighbour cometh and searcheth him.

20_PRO_18_18 The lot cause th contentions to cease, and parteth between the mighty.

20_PRO_18_19 A brother offended [is harder to be won] than a strong city: and [their] contentions [are] like the bars of a castle.

20_PRO_18_20 A man's belly shall be satisfied with the fruit of his mouth; [and] with the increase of his lips shall he be filled.

20_PRO_18_21 Death and life [are] in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.

20_PRO_18_22 [Whoso] findeth a wife findeth a good [thing], and obtaineth favour of the LORD.

20_PRO_18_23 The poor useth entreaties; but the rich answereth roughly.

20_PRO_18_24 A man [that hath] friends must show himself friendly: and there is a friend [that] sticketh closer than a brother.



20_PRO_19_01 Better [is] the poor that walketh in his integrity, than [he that is] perverse in his lips, and is a fool.

20_PRO_19_02 Also, [that] the soul [be] without knowledge, [it is] not good; and he that hasteth with [his] feet sinneth.

20_PRO_19_03 The foolishness of man perverteth his way: and his heart fretteth against the LORD.

20_PRO_19_04 Wealth maketh many friends; but the poor is separated from his neighbour.

20_PRO_19_05 A false witness shall not be unpunished, and [he that] speaketh lies shall not escape.

20_PRO_19_06 Many will entreat the favour of the prince: and every man [is] a friend to him that giveth gifts.

20_PRO_19_07 All the brethren of the poor do hate him: how much more do his friends go far from him? he pursueth [them with] words, [yet] they [are] wanting [to him].

20_PRO_19_08 He that getteth wisdom loveth his own soul: he that keepeth understanding shall find good.

20_PRO_19_09 A false witness shall not be unpunished, and [he that] speaketh lies shall perish.

20_PRO_19_10 Delight is not seemly for a fool; much less for a servant to have rule over princes.

20_PRO_19_11 The discretion of a man deferreth his anger; and [it is] his glory to pass over a transgression.

20_PRO_19_12 The king's wrath [is] as the roaring of a lion; but his favour [is] as dew upon the grass.

20_PRO_19_13 A foolish son [is] the calamity of his father: and the contentions of a wife [are] a continual dropping.

20_PRO_19_14 House and riches [are] the inheritance of fathers: and a prudent wife [is] from the LORD.

20_PRO_19_15 Slothfulness casteth into a deep sleep; and an idle soul shall suffer hunger.

20_PRO_19_16 He that keepeth the commandment keepeth his own soul; [but] he that despiseth his ways shall die.

20_PRO_19_17 He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the LORD; and that which he hath given will he pay him again.

20_PRO_19_18 Chasten thy son while there is hope, and let not thy soul spare for his crying.

20_PRO_19_19 A man of great wrath shall suffer punishment: for if thou deliver [him], yet thou must do it again.

20_PRO_19_20 Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that thou mayest be wise in thy latter end.

20_PRO_19_21 [There are] many devices in a man's heart; nevertheless the counsel of the LORD, that shall stand.

20_PRO_19_22 The desire of a man [is] his kindness: and a poor man [is] better than a liar.

20_PRO_19_23 The fear of the LORD [tendeth] to life: and [he that hath it] shall abide satisfied; he shall not be visited with evil.

20_PRO_19_24 A slothful [man] hideth his hand in [his] bosom, and will not so much as bring it to his mouth again.

20_PRO_19_25 Smite a scorner, and the simple will beware: and reprove one that hath understanding, [and] he will understand knowledge.

20_PRO_19_26 He that wasteth [his] father, [and] chaseth away [his] mother, [is] a son that causeth shame, and bringeth reproach.

20_PRO_19_27 Cease, my son, to hear the instruction [that causeth] to err from the words of knowledge.

20_PRO_19_28 An ungodly witness scorneth judgment: and the mouth of the wicked devoureth iniquity.

20_PRO_19_29 Judgments are prepared for scorners, and stripes for the back of fools.



20_PRO_20_01 Wine [is] a mocker, strong drink [is] raging: and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise.

20_PRO_20_02 The fear of a king [is] as the roaring of a lion: [whoso] provoketh him to anger sinneth [against] his own soul.

20_PRO_20_03 [It is] an honour for a man to cease from strife: but every fool will be meddling.

20_PRO_20_04 The sluggard will not plow by reason of the cold; [therefore] shall he beg in harvest, and [have] nothing.

20_PRO_20_05 Counsel in the heart of man [is like] deep water; but a man of understanding will draw it out.

20_PRO_20_06 Most men will proclaim every one his own goodness: but a faithful man who can find?

20_PRO_20_07 The just [man] walketh in his integrity: his children [are] blessed after him.

20_PRO_20_08 A king that sitteth in the throne of judgment scattereth away all evil with his eyes.

20_PRO_20_09 Who can say, I have made my heart clean, I am pure from my sin?

20_PRO_20_10 Divers weights, [and] divers measures, both of them [are] alike abomination to the LORD.

20_PRO_20_11 Even a child is known by his doings, whether his work [be] pure, and whether [it be] right.

20_PRO_20_12 The hearing ear, and the seeing eye, the LORD hath made even both of them.

20_PRO_20_13 Love not sleep, lest thou come to poverty; open thine eyes, [and] thou shalt be satisfied with bread.

20_PRO_20_14 [It is] naught, [it is] naught, saith the buyer: but when he is gone his way, then he boasteth.

20_PRO_20_15 There is gold, and a multitude of rubies: but the lips of knowledge [are] a precious jewel.

20_PRO_20_16 Take his garment that is surety [for] a stranger: and take a pledge of him for a strange woman.

20_PRO_20_17 Bread of deceit [is] sweet to a man; but afterwards his mouth shall be filled with gravel.

20_PRO_20_18 [Every] purpose is established by counsel: and with good advice make war.

20 PRO 20 19 He that goeth about [as] a talebearer revealeth secrets: therefore meddle not with him that flattereth

with his lips.

20_PRO_20_20 Whoso curseth his father or his mother, his lamp shall be put out in obscure darkness.

20_PRO_20_21 An inheritance [may be] gotten hastily at the beginning; but the end thereof shall not be blessed.

20_PRO_20_22 Say not thou, I will recompense evil; [but] wait on the LORD, and he shall save thee.

20_PRO_20_23 Divers weights [are] an abomination unto the LORD; and a false balance [is] not good.

20_PRO_20_24 Man's goings [are] of the LORD; how can a man then understand his own way?

20_PRO_20_25 [It is] a snare to the man [who] devoureth [that which is] holy, and after vows to make inquiry.

20_PRO_20_26 A wise king scattereth the wicked, and bringeth the wheel over them.

20_PRO_20_27 The spirit of man [is] the candle of the LORD, searching all the inward parts of the belly.

20_PRO_20_28 Mercy and truth preserve the king: and his throne is upholden by mercy.

20_PRO_20_29 The glory of young men [is] their strength: and the beauty of old men [is] the grey head. 20 PRO 20 30 The blueness of a wound cleanseth away evil: so [do] stripes the inward parts of the belly.



20_PRO_21_01 The king's heart [is] in the hand of the LORD, [as] the rivers of water: he turneth it whithersoever he will.

20_PRO_21_02 Every way of a man [is] right in his own eyes: but the LORD pondereth the hearts.

20_PRO_21_03 To do justice and judgment [is] more acceptable to the LORD than sacrifice.

20_PRO_21_04 An high look, and a proud heart, [and] the plowing of the wicked, [is] sin.

20_PRO_21_05 The thoughts of the diligent [tend] only to plenteousness; but of every one [that is] hasty only to want.

20_PRO_21_06 The getting of treasures by a lying tongue [is] a vanity tossed to and fro of them that seek death.

20_PRO_21_07 The robbery of the wicked shall destroy them; because they refuse to do judgment.

20_PRO_21_08 The way of man [is] froward and strange: but [as for] the pure, his work [is] right.

20_PRO_21_09 [It is] better to dwell in a corner of the housetop, than with a brawling woman in a wide house.

20_PRO_21_10 The soul of the wicked desireth evil: his neighbour findeth no favour in his eyes.

20_PRO_21_11 When the scorner is punished, the simple is made wise: and when the wise is instructed, he receiveth knowledge.

20_PRO_21_12 The righteous [man] wisely considereth the house of the wicked: [but God] overthroweth the wicked for [their] wickedness.

20_PRO_21_13 Whoso stoppeth his ears at the cry of the poor, he also shall cry himself, but shall not be heard.

20_PRO_21_14 A gift in secret pacifieth anger: and a reward in the bosom strong wrath.

20_PRO_21_15 [It is] joy to the just to do judgment: but destruction [shall be] to the workers of iniquity.

20_PRO_21_16 The man that wandereth out of the way of understanding shall remain in the congregation of the dead.

20_PRO_21_17 He that loveth pleasure [shall be] a poor man: he that loveth wine and oil shall not be rich.

20_PRO_21_18 The wicked [shall be] a ransom for the righteous, and the transgressor for the upright.
20_PRO_21_19 [It is] better to dwell in the wilderness, than with a contentious and an angry woman.
20_PRO_21_20 [There is] treasure to be desired and oil in the dwelling of the wise; but a foolish man spendeth it up.
20_PRO_21_21 He that followeth after righteousness and mercy findeth life, righteousness, and honour.
20_PRO_21_22 A wise [man] scaleth the city of the mighty, and casteth down the strength of the confidence thereof.
20_PRO_21_23 Whoso keepeth his mouth and his tongue keepeth his soul from troubles.
20_PRO_21_24 Proud [and] haughty scorner [is] his name, who dealeth in proud wrath.
20_PRO_21_25 The desire of the slothful killeth him; for his hands refuse to labour.
20_PRO_21_26 He coveteth greedily all the day long: but the righteous giveth and spareth not.
20_PRO_21_27 The sacrifice of the wicked [is] abomination: how much more, [when] he bringeth it with a wicked mind?
20_PRO_21_29 A wicked man hardeneth his face: but [as for] the upright, he directeth his way.
20_PRO_21_30 [There is] no wisdom nor understanding nor counsel against the LORD.
20_PRO_21_31 The horse [is] prepared against the day of battle: but safety [is] of the LORD.



20 PRO 22 01 A [good] name [is] rather to be chosen than great riches, [and] loving favour rather than silver and gold.

20 PRO 22 02 The rich and poor meet together: the LORD [is] the maker of them all.

20 PRO 22 03 A prudent [man] foreseeth the evil, and hideth himself: but the simple pass on, and are punished.

20 PRO 22 04 By humility [and] the fear of the LORD [are] riches, and honour, and life.

20 PRO 22 05 Thorns [and] snares [are] in the way of the froward: he that doth keep his soul shall be far from them.

20 PRO 22 06 Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.

20 PRO 22 07 The rich ruleth over the poor, and the borrower [is] servant to the lender.

20 PRO 22 08 He that soweth iniquity shall reap vanity: and the rod of his anger shall fail.

20 PRO 22 09 He that hath a bountiful eye shall be blessed; for he giveth of his bread to the poor.

20 PRO 22 10 Cast out the scorner, and contention shall go out; yea, strife and reproach shall cease.

20 PRO 22 11 He that loveth pureness of heart, [for] the grace of his lips the king [shall be] his friend.

20 PRO 22 12 The eyes of the LORD preserve knowledge, and he overthroweth the words of the transgressor.

20 PRO 22 13 The slothful [man] saith, [There is] a lion without, I shall be slain in the streets.

20 PRO 22 14 The mouth of strange women [is] a deep pit: he that is abhorred of the LORD shall fall therein.

20 PRO 22 15 Foolishness [is] bound in the heart of a child; [but] the rod of correction shall drive it far from him.

20 PRO 22 16 He that oppresseth the poor to increase his [riches, and] he that give th to the rich, [shall] surely [come] to want.

20 PRO 22 17 Bow down thine ear, and hear the words of the wise, and apply thine heart unto my knowledge.

20 PRO 22 18 For [it is] a pleasant thing if thou keep them within thee; they shall withal be fitted in thy lips.

20 PRO 22 19 That thy trust may be in the LORD, I have made known to thee this day, even to thee.

20 PRO 22 20 Have not I written to thee excellent things in counsels and knowledge,

20 PRO 22 21 That I might make thee know the certainty of the words of truth; that thou mightest answer the words of truth to them that send unto thee?

20 PRO 22 22 Rob not the poor, because he [is] poor: neither oppress the afflicted in the gate:

20 PRO 22 23 For the LORD will plead their cause, and spoil the soul of those that spoiled them.

20 PRO 22 24 Make no friendship with an angry man; and with a furious man thou shalt not go:

20 PRO 22 25 Lest thou learn his ways, and get a snare to thy soul.

20 PRO 22 26 Be not thou [one] of them that strike hands, [or] of them that are sureties for debts.

20 PRO 22 27 If thou hast nothing to pay, why should he take away thy bed from under thee?

20 PRO 22 28 Remove not the ancient landmark, which thy fathers have set.

20 PRO 22 29 Seest thou a man diligent in his business? he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean [men].



20 PRO 23 01 When thou sittest to eat with a ruler, consider diligently what [is] before thee:

20 PRO 23 02 And put a knife to thy throat, if thou [be] a man given to appetite.

20 PRO 23 03 Be not desirous of his dainties: for they [are] deceitful meat.

20 PRO 23 04 Labour not to be rich: cease from thine own wisdom.

20_PRO_23_05 Wilt thou set thine eyes upon that which is not? for [riches] certainly make themselves wings; they fly away as an eagle toward heaven.

20 PRO 23 06 Eat thou not the bread of [him that hath] an evil eye, neither desire thou his dainty meats:

20 PRO 23 07 For as he thinketh in his heart, so [is] he: Eat and drink, saith he to thee; but his heart [is] not with thee.

20 PRO 23 08 The morsel [which] thou hast eaten shalt thou vomit up, and lose thy sweet words.

20 PRO 23 09 Speak not in the ears of a fool: for he will despise the wisdom of thy words.

20 PRO 23 10 Remove not the old landmark; and enter not into the fields of the fatherless:

20 PRO 23 11 For their redeemer [is] mighty; he shall plead their cause with thee.

20 PRO 23 12 Apply thine heart unto instruction, and thine ears to the words of knowledge.

20 PRO 23 13 Withhold not correction from the child: for [if] thou beatest him with the rod, he shall not die.

20 PRO 23 14 Thou shalt beat him with the rod, and shalt deliver his soul from hell.

20 PRO 23 15 My son, if thine heart be wise, my heart shall rejoice, even mine.

20_PRO_23_16 Yea, my reins shall rejoice, when thy lips speak right things.

20 PRO 23 17 Let not thine heart envy sinners: but [be thou] in the fear of the LORD all the day long.

20 PRO 23 18 For surely there is an end; and thine expectation shall not be cut off.

20_PRO_23_19 Hear thou, my son, and be wise, and guide thine heart in the way

20 PRO 23 20 Be not among winebibbers; among riotous eaters of flesh:

20 PRO 23 21 For the drunkard and the glutton shall come to poverty: and drowsiness shall clothe [a man] with rags.

20 PRO 23 22 Hearken unto thy father that begat thee, and despise not thy mother when she is old.

20 PRO 23 23 Buy the truth, and sell [it] not; [also] wisdom, and instruction, and understanding.

20 PRO 23 24 The father of the righteous shall greatly rejoice: and he that begetteth a wise [child] shall have joy of him.

20 PRO 23 25 Thy father and thy mother shall be glad, and she that bare thee shall rejoice.

20 PRO 23 26 My son, give me thine heart, and let thine eyes observe my ways.

20 PRO 23 27 For a whore [is] a deep ditch; and a strange woman [is] a narrow pit.

20 PRO 23 28 She also lieth in wait as [for] a prey, and increase th the transgressors among men.

20 PRO 23 29 Who hath woe? who hath sorrow? who hath contentions? who hath babbling? who hath wounds without cause? who hath redness of eyes?

20 PRO 23 30 They that tarry long at the wine; they that go to seek mixed wine.

20 PRO 23 31 Look not thou upon the wine when it is red, when it giveth his colour in the cup, [when] it moveth itself aright.

20 PRO 23 32 At the last it biteth like a serpent, and stingeth like an adder.

20 PRO 23 33 Thine eyes shall behold strange women, and thine heart shall utter perverse things.

20_PRO_23_34 Yea, thou shalt be as he that lieth down in the midst of the sea, or as he that lieth upon the top of a mast.

20 PRO 23 35 They have stricken me, [shalt thou say, and] I was not sick; they have beaten me, [and] I felt [it] not: when shall I awake? I will seek it vet again.



- 20 PRO 24 01 Be not thou envious against evil men, neither desire to be with them.
- 20 PRO 24 02 For their heart studieth destruction, and their lips talk of mischief.
- 20 PRO 24 03 Through wisdom is an house builded; and by understanding it is established:
- 20 PRO 24 04 And by knowledge shall the chambers be filled with all precious and pleasant riches.
- 20 PRO 24 05 A wise man [is] strong; yea, a man of knowledge increaseth strength.
- 20 PRO 24 06 For by wise counsel thou shalt make thy war: and in multitude of counsellors [there is] safety.
- 20 PRO 24 07 Wisdom [is] too high for a fool: he openeth not his mouth in the gate.
- 20 PRO 24 08 He that devise th to do evil shall be called a mischievous person.
- 20 PRO 24 09 The thought of foolishness [is] sin: and the scorner [is] an abomination to men.
- 20 PRO 24 10 [If] thou faint in the day of adversity, thy strength [is] small.
- 20 PRO 24 11 If thou forbear to deliver [them that are] drawn unto death, and [those that are] ready to be slain;
- 20 PRO 24 12 If thou sayest, Behold, we knew it not; doth not he that pondereth the heart consider [it]? and he that keepeth thy soul, doth [not] he know [it]? and shall [not] he render to [every] man according to his works?
- 20 PRO 24 13 My son, eat thou honey, because [it is] good; and the honeycomb, [which is] sweet to thy taste:
- 20 PRO 24 14 So [shall] the knowledge of wisdom [be] unto thy soul: when thou hast found [it], then there shall be a reward, and thy expectation shall not be cut off.
- 20 PRO 24 15 Lay not wait, O wicked [man], against the dwelling of the righteous; spoil not his resting place:
- 20 PRO 24 16 For a just [man] falleth seven times, and riseth up again: but the wicked shall fall into mischief.
- 20 PRO 24 17 Rejoice not when thine enemy falleth, and let not thine heart be glad when he stumbleth:
- 20 PRO 24 18 Lest the LORD see [it], and it displease him, and he turn away his wrath from him.
- 20_PRO_24_19 Fret not thyself because of evil [men], neither be thou envious at the wicked;

20 PRO 24 20 For there shall be no reward to the evil [man]; the candle of the wicked shall be put out.

20_PRO_24_21 My son, fear thou the LORD and the king: [and] meddle not with them that are given to change:

20 PRO 24 22 For their calamity shall rise suddenly; and who knoweth the ruin of them both?

20 PRO 24 23 These [things] also [belong] to the wise. [It is] not good to have respect of persons in judgment.

20_PRO_24_24 He that saith unto the wicked, Thou [art] righteous; him shall the people curse, nations shall abhor him:

20 PRO 24 25 But to them that rebuke [him] shall be delight, and a good blessing shall come upon them.

20 PRO 24 26 [Every man] shall kiss [his] lips that give that right answer.

20 PRO 24 27 Prepare thy work without, and make it fit for thyself in the field; and afterwards build thine house.

20 PRO 24 28 Be not a witness against thy neighbour without cause; and deceive [not] with thy lips.

20 PRO 24 29 Say not, I will do so to him as he hath done to me: I will render to the man according to his work.

20 PRO 24 30 I went by the field of the slothful, and by the vineyard of the man void of understanding;

20 PRO 24 31 And, lo, it was all grown over with thorns, [and] nettles had covered the face thereof, and the stone wall thereof was broken down.

20 PRO 24 32 Then I saw, [and] considered [it] well: I looked upon [it, and] received instruction.

20 PRO 24 33 [Yet] a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep:

20 PRO 24 34 So shall thy poverty come [as] one that travelleth; and thy want as an armed man.

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20_PRO_25_01 These [are] also proverbs of Solomon, which the men of Hezekiah king of Judah copied out.

20_PRO_25_02 [It is] the glory of God to conceal a thing: but the honour of kings [is] to search out a matter.

20_PRO_25_03 The heaven for height, and the earth for depth, and the heart of kings [is] unsearchable.

20_PRO_25_04 Take away the dross from the silver, and there shall come forth a vessel for the finer.

20_PRO_25_05 Take away the wicked [from] before the king, and his throne shall be established in righteousness.

20_PRO_25_06 Put not forth thyself in the presence of the king, and stand not in the place of great [men]:

20_PRO_25_07 For better [it is] that it be said unto thee, Come up hither; than that thou shouldest be put lower in the presence of the prince whom thine eyes have seen.

20_PRO_25_08 Go not forth hastily to strive, lest [thou know not] what to do in the end thereof, when thy neighbour hath put thee to shame.

20_PRO_25_09 Debate thy cause with thy neighbour [himself]; and discover not a secret to another:

20_PRO_25_10 Lest he that heareth [it] put thee to shame, and thine infamy turn not away.

20_PRO_25_11 A word fitly spoken [is like] apples of gold in pictures of silver.

20_PRO_25_12 [As] an earring of gold, and an ornament of fine gold, [so is] a wise reprover upon an obedient ear.

20_PRO_25_13 As the cold of snow in the time of harvest, [so is] a faithful messenger to them that send him: for he refresheth the soul of his masters.

20_PRO_25_14 Whoso boasteth himself of a false gift [is like] clouds and wind without rain.

20_PRO_25_15 By long forbearing is a prince persuaded, and a soft tongue breaketh the bone.

20_PRO_25_16 Hast thou found honey? eat so much as is sufficient for thee, lest thou be filled therewith, and vomit it.

20_PRO_25_17 Withdraw thy foot from thy neighbour's house; lest he be weary of thee, and [so] hate thee.

20 PRO 25 18 A man that beareth false witness against his neighbour [is] a maul, and a sword, and a sharp arrow.

20_11to_20_1011 multitute beare en indess against ins heighbour [15] a maai, and a storid, and a sharp arrow

20_PRO_25_19 Confidence in an unfaithful man in time of trouble [is like] a broken tooth, and a foot out of joint.

20_PRO_25_20 [As] he that taketh away a garment in cold weather, [and as] vinegar upon nitre, so [is] he that singeth songs to an heavy heart.

20_PRO_25_21 If thine enemy be hungry, give him bread to eat; and if he be thirsty, give him water to drink:

20_PRO_25_22 For thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head, and the LORD shall reward thee.

20_PRO_25_23 The north wind driveth away rain: so [doth] an angry countenance a backbiting tongue.

20_PRO_25_24 [It is] better to dwell in the corner of the housetop, than with a brawling woman and in a wide house.

20_PRO_25_25 [As] cold waters to a thirsty soul, so [is] good news from a far country.

20_PRO_25_26 A righteous man falling down before the wicked [is as] a troubled fountain, and a corrupt spring.

20_PRO_25_27 [It is] not good to eat much honey: so [for men] to search their own glory [is not] glory.

20_PRO_25_28 He that [hath] no rule over his own spirit [is like] a city [that is] broken down, [and] without walls.



- 20_PRO_26_01 As snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honour is not seemly for a fool.
- 20_PRO_26_02 As the bird by wandering, as the swallow by flying, so the curse causeless shall not come.
- 20_PRO_26_03 A whip for the horse, a bridle for the ass, and a rod for the fool's back.
- 20_PRO_26_04 Answer not a fool according to his folly, lest thou also be like unto him.
- 20_PRO_26_05 Answer a fool according to his folly, lest he be wise in his own conceit.
- 20_PRO_26_06 He that sendeth a message by the hand of a fool cutteth off the feet, [and] drinketh damage.
- 20_PRO_26_07 The legs of the lame are not equal: so [is] a parable in the mouth of fools.
- 20_PRO_26_08 As he that bindeth a stone in a sling, so [is] he that giveth honour to a fool.
- 20_PRO_26_09 [As] a thorn goeth up into the hand of a drunkard, so [is] a parable in the mouth of fools.
- 20_PRO_26_10 The great [God] that formed all [things] both rewardeth the fool, and rewardeth transgressors.
- 20_PRO_26_11 As a dog returneth to his vomit, [so] a fool returneth to his folly.
- 20_PRO_26_12 Seest thou a man wise in his own conceit? [there is] more hope of a fool than of him.
- 20_PRO_26_13 The slothful [man] saith, [There is] a lion in the way; a lion [is] in the streets.
- 20_PRO_26_14 [As] the door turneth upon his hinges, so [doth] the slothful upon his bed.
- 20_PRO_26_15 The slothful hideth his hand in [his] bosom; it grieveth him to bring it again to his mouth.
- 20_PRO_26_16 The sluggard [is] wiser in his own conceit than seven men that can render a reason.
- 20_PRO_26_17 He that passeth by, [and] meddleth with strife [belonging] not to him, [is like] one that taketh a dog by the ears.
- 20_PRO_26_18 As a mad [man] who casteth firebrands, arrows, and death,
- 20 PRO 26 19 So [is] the man [that] deceiveth his neighbour, and saith, Am not I in sport?

20_PRO_26_20 Where no wood is, [there] the fire goeth out: so where [there is] no talebearer, the strife ceaseth.
20_PRO_26_21 [As] coals [are] to burning coals, and wood to fire; so [is] a contentious man to kindle strife.
20_PRO_26_22 The words of a talebearer [are] as wounds, and they go down into the innermost parts of the belly.
20_PRO_26_23 Burning lips and a wicked heart [are like] a potsherd covered with silver dross.
20_PRO_26_24 He that hateth dissembleth with his lips, and layeth up deceit within him;
20_PRO_26_25 When he speaketh fair, believe him not: for [there are] seven abominations in his heart.
20_PRO_26_26 [Whose] hatred is covered by deceit, his wickedness shall be showed before the [whole] congregation.
20_PRO_26_27 Whoso diggeth a pit shall fall therein: and he that rolleth a stone, it will return upon him.
20 PRO 26 28 A lying tongue hateth [those that are] afflicted by it; and a flattering mouth worketh ruin.



20_PRO_27_01 Boast not thyself of to morrow; for thou knowest not what a day may bring forth.

20_PRO_27_02 Let another man praise thee, and not thine own mouth; a stranger, and not thine own lips.

20_PRO_27_03 A stone [is] heavy, and the sand weighty; but a fool's wrath [is] heavier than them both.

20_PRO_27_04 Wrath [is] cruel, and anger [is] outrageous; but who [is] able to stand before envy?

20_PRO_27_05 Open rebuke [is] better than secret love.

20_PRO_27_06 Faithful [are] the wounds of a friend; but the kisses of an enemy [are] deceitful.

20_PRO_27_07 The full soul loatheth an honeycomb; but to the hungry soul every bitter thing is sweet.

20_PRO_27_08 As a bird that wandereth from her nest, so [is] a man that wandereth from his place.

20_PRO_27_09 Ointment and perfume rejoice the heart: so [doth] the sweetness of a man's friend by hearty counsel.

20_PRO_27_10 Thine own friend, and thy father's friend, forsake not; neither go into thy brother's house in the day of thy calamity: [for] better [is] a neighbour [that is] near than a brother far off.

20_PRO_27_11 My son, be wise, and make my heart glad, that I may answer him that reproacheth me.

20_PRO_27_12 A prudent [man] foreseeth the evil, [and] hideth himself; [but] the simple pass on, [and] are punished.

20_PRO_27_13 Take his garment that is surety for a stranger, and take a pledge of him for a strange woman.

20_PRO_27_14 He that blesseth his friend with a loud voice, rising early in the morning, it shall be counted a curse to him.

20_PRO_27_15 A continual dropping in a very rainy day and a contentious woman are alike.

20_PRO_27_16 Whosoever hideth her hideth the wind, and the ointment of his right hand, [which] bewrayeth [itself].

20_PRO_27_17 Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend.

20_PRO_27_18 Whoso keepeth the fig tree shall eat the fruit thereof: so he that waiteth on his master shall be honoured.

20_PRO_27_19 As in water face [answereth] to face, so the heart of man to man.

20_PRO_27_20 Hell and destruction are never full; so the eyes of man are never satisfied.

20_PRO_27_21 [As] the fining pot for silver, and the furnace for gold; so [is] a man to his praise.

20_PRO_27_22 Though thou shouldest bray a fool in a mortar among wheat with a pestle, [yet] will not his foolishness depart from him.

20_PRO_27_23 Be thou diligent to know the state of thy flocks, [and] look well to thy herds.

20_PRO_27_24 For riches [are] not for ever: and doth the crown [endure] to every generation?

20_PRO_27_25 The hay appeareth, and the tender grass showeth itself, and herbs of the mountains are gathered.

20_PRO_27_26 The lambs [are] for thy clothing, and the goats [are] the price of the field.

20_PRO_27_27 And [thou shalt have] goats' milk enough for thy food, for the food of thy household, and [for] the maintenance for thy maidens.



20_PRO_28_01 The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a lion.

20_PRO_28_02 For the transgression of a land many [are] the princes thereof: but by a man of understanding [and] knowledge the state [thereof] shall be prolonged.

20_PRO_28_03 A poor man that oppresseth the poor [is like] a sweeping rain which leaveth no food.

20_PRO_28_04 They that forsake the law praise the wicked: but such as keep the law contend with them.

20_PRO_28_05 Evil men understand not judgment: but they that seek the LORD understand all [things].

20_PRO_28_06 Better [is] the poor that walketh in his uprightness, than [he that is] perverse [in his] ways, though he [be] rich.

20_PRO_28_07 Whoso keepeth the law [is] a wise son: but he that is a companion of riotous [men] shameth his father.

20_PRO_28_08 He that by usury and unjust gain increaseth his substance, he shall gather it for him that will pity the poor.

20_PRO_28_09 He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer [shall be] abomination.

20_PRO_28_10 Whoso causeth the righteous to go astray in an evil way, he shall fall himself into his own pit: but the upright shall have good [things] in possession.

20_PRO_28_11 The rich man [is] wise in his own conceit; but the poor that hath understanding searcheth him out.

20_PRO_28_12 When righteous [men] do rejoice, [there is] great glory: but when the wicked rise, a man is hidden.

20_PRO_28_13 He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh [them] shall have mercy.

20_PRO_28_14 Happy [is] the man that feareth alway: but he that hardeneth his heart shall fall into mischief.

20_PRO_28_15 [As] a roaring lion, and a ranging bear; [so is] a wicked ruler over the poor people.

20_PRO_28_16 The prince that wanteth understanding [is] also a great oppressor: [but] he that hateth covetousness shall prolong [his] days.

20_PRO_28_17 A man that doeth violence to the blood of [any] person shall flee to the pit; let no man stay him.

20_PRO_28_18 Whoso walketh uprightly shall be saved: but [he that is] perverse [in his] ways shall fall at once.

20_PRO_28_19 He that tilleth his land shall have plenty of bread: but he that followeth after vain [persons] shall have poverty enough.

20_PRO_28_20 A faithful man shall abound with blessings: but he that maketh haste to be rich shall not be innocent.

20_PRO_28_21 To have respect of persons [is] not good: for for a piece of bread [that] man will transgress.

20_PRO_28_22 He that hasteth to be rich [hath] an evil eye, and considereth not that poverty shall come upon him.

20_PRO_28_23 He that rebuketh a man afterwards shall find more favour than he that flattereth with the tongue.

20_PRO_28_24 Whoso robbeth his father or his mother, and saith, [It is] no transgression; the same [is] the companion of a destroyer.

20_PRO_28_25 He that is of a proud heart stirreth up strife: but he that putteth his trust in the LORD shall be made fat.

20_PRO_28_26 He that trusteth in his own heart is a fool: but whoso walketh wisely, he shall be delivered.

20_PRO_28_27 He that give th unto the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse.

20_PRO_28_28 When the wicked rise, men hide themselves: but when they perish, the righteous increase.



20_PRO_29_01 He, that being often reproved hardeneth [his] neck, shall suddenly be destroyed, and that without remedy.

20_PRO_29_02 When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice: but when the wicked beareth rule, the people mourn.

20_PRO_29_03 Whoso loveth wisdom rejoiceth his father: but he that keepeth company with harlots spendeth [his] substance.

20_PRO_29_04 The king by judgment establisheth the land: but he that receiveth gifts overthroweth it.

20_PRO_29_05 A man that flattereth his neighbour spreadeth a net for his feet.

20_PRO_29_06 In the transgression of an evil man [there is] a snare: but the righteous doth sing and rejoice.

20_PRO_29_07 The righteous considereth the cause of the poor: [but] the wicked regardeth not to know [it].

20_PRO_29_08 Scornful men bring a city into a snare: but wise [men] turn away wrath.

20_PRO_29_09 [If] a wise man contendeth with a foolish man, whether he rage or laugh, [there is] no rest.

20_PRO_29_10 The bloodthirsty hate the upright: but the just seek his soul.

20_PRO_29_11 A fool uttereth all his mind: but a wise [man] keepeth it in till afterwards.

20_PRO_29_12 If a ruler hearken to lies, all his servants [are] wicked.

20_PRO_29_13 The poor and the deceitful man meet together: the LORD lighteneth both their eyes.

20_PRO_29_14 The king that faithfully judgeth the poor, his throne shall be established for ever.

20_PRO_29_15 The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left [to himself] bringeth his mother to shame.

20_PRO_29_16 When the wicked are multiplied, transgression increaseth: but the righteous shall see their fall.

20_PRO_29_17 Correct thy son, and he shall give thee rest; yea, he shall give delight unto thy soul.

20_PRO_29_18 Where [there is] no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy [is] he.

20_PRO_29_19 A servant will not be corrected by words: for though he understand he will not answer.
20_PRO_29_20 Seest thou a man [that is] hasty in his words? [there is] more hope of a fool than of him.
20_PRO_29_21 He that delicately bringeth up his servant from a child shall have him become [his] son at the length.
20_PRO_29_22 An angry man stirreth up strife, and a furious man aboundeth in transgression.
20_PRO_29_23 A man's pride shall bring him low: but honour shall uphold the humble in spirit.
20_PRO_29_24 Whoso is partner with a thief hateth his own soul: he heareth cursing, and bewrayeth [it] not.
20_PRO_29_25 The fear of man bringeth a snare: but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD shall be safe.
20_PRO_29_26 Many seek the ruler's favour; but [every] man's judgment [cometh] from the LORD.
20_PRO_29_27 An unjust man [is] an abomination to the just: and [he that is] upright in the way [is] abomination to the wicked.



20_PRO_30_01 The words of Agur the son of Jakeh, [even] the prophecy: the man spake unto Ithiel, even unto Ithiel and Ucal,

20_PRO_30_02 Surely I [am] more brutish than [any] man, and have not the understanding of a man.

20_PRO_30_03 I neither learned wisdom, nor have the knowledge of the holy.

20_PRO_30_04 Who hath ascended up into heaven, or descended? who hath gathered the wind in his fists? who hath bound the waters in a garment? who hath established all the ends of the earth? what [is] his name, and what [is] his son's name, if thou canst tell?

20_PRO_30_05 Every word of God [is] pure: he [is] a shield unto them that put their trust in him.

20_PRO_30_06 Add thou not unto his words, lest he reprove thee, and thou be found a liar.

20_PRO_30_07 Two [things] have I required of thee; deny me [them] not before I die:

20_PRO_30_08 Remove far from me vanity and lies: give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with food convenient for me:

20_PRO_30_09 Lest I be full, and deny [thee], and say, Who [is] the LORD? or lest I be poor, and steal, and take the name of my God [in vain].

20_PRO_30_10 Accuse not a servant unto his master, lest he curse thee, and thou be found guilty.

20_PRO_30_11 [There is] a generation [that] curseth their father, and doth not bless their mother.

20_PRO_30_12 [There is] a generation [that are] pure in their own eyes, and [yet] is not washed from their filthiness.

20_PRO_30_13 [There is] a generation, O how lofty are their eyes! and their eyelids are lifted up.

20_PRO_30_14 [There is] a generation, whose teeth [are as] swords, and their jaw teeth [as] knives, to devour the poor from off the earth, and the needy from [among] men.

20_PRO_30_15 The horseleach hath two daughters, [crying], Give, give. There are three [things that] are never satisfied, [yea], four [things] say not, [It is] enough:

20_PRO_30_16 The grave; and the barren womb; the earth [that] is not filled with water; and the fire [that] saith not,

[It is] enough.

20_PRO_30_17 The eye [that] mocketh at [his] father, and despiseth to obey [his] mother, the ravens of the valley shall pick it out, and the young eagles shall eat it.

20_PRO_30_18 There be three [things which] are too wonderful for me, yea, four which I know not:

20_PRO_30_19 The way of an eagle in the air; the way of a serpent upon a rock; the way of a ship in the midst of the sea; and the way of a man with a maid.

20_PRO_30_20 Such [is] the way of an adulterous woman; she eateth, and wipeth her mouth, and saith, I have done no wickedness.

20_PRO_30_21 For three [things] the earth is disquieted, and for four [which] it cannot bear:

20_PRO_30_22 For a servant when he reigneth; and a fool when he is filled with meat;

20_PRO_30_23 For an odious [woman] when she is married; and an handmaid that is heir to her mistress.

20_PRO_30_24 There be four [things which are] little upon the earth, but they [are] exceeding wise:

20_PRO_30_25 The ants [are] a people not strong, yet they prepare their meat in the summer;

20_PRO_30_26 The conies [are but] a feeble folk, yet make they their houses in the rocks;

20_PRO_30_27 The locusts have no king, yet go they forth all of them by bands;

20_PRO_30_28 The spider taketh hold with her hands, and is in kings' palaces.

20_PRO_30_29 There be three [things] which go well, yea, four are comely in going:

20_PRO_30_30 A lion [which is] strongest among beasts, and turneth not away for any;

20_PRO_30_31 A greyhound; an he goat also; and a king, against whom [there is] no rising up.

20_PRO_30_32 If thou hast done foolishly in lifting up thyself, or if thou hast thought evil, [lay] thine hand upon thy mouth.

20_PRO_30_33 Surely the churning of milk bringeth forth butter, and the wringing of the nose bringeth forth blood: so the forcing of wrath bringeth forth strife.



- 20 PRO 31 01 The words of king Lemuel, the prophecy that his mother taught him.
- 20 PRO 31 02 What, my son? and what, the son of my womb? and what, the son of my vows?
- 20 PRO 31 03 Give not thy strength unto women, nor thy ways to that which destroyeth kings.
- 20 PRO 31 04 [It is] not for kings, O Lemuel, [it is] not for kings to drink wine; nor for princes strong drink:
- 20 PRO 31 05 Lest they drink, and forget the law, and pervert the judgment of any of the afflicted.
- 20 PRO 31 06 Give strong drink unto him that is ready to perish, and wine unto those that be of heavy hearts.
- 20 PRO 31 07 Let him drink, and forget his poverty, and remember his misery no more.
- 20 PRO 31 08 Open thy mouth for the dumb in the cause of all such as are appointed to destruction.
- 20 PRO 31 09 Open thy mouth, judge righteously, and plead the cause of the poor and needy.
- 20 PRO 31 10 Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price [is] far above rubies.
- 20 PRO 31 11 The heart of her husband doth safely trust in her, so that he shall have no need of spoil.
- 20 PRO 31 12 She will do him good and not evil all the days of her life.
- 20 PRO 31 13 She seeketh wool, and flax, and worketh willingly with her hands.
- 20 PRO 31 14 She is like the merchants' ships; she bringeth her food from afar.
- 20 PRO 31 15 She riseth also while it is yet night, and give th meat to her household, and a portion to her maidens.
- 20_PRO_31_16 She considereth a field, and buyeth it: with the fruit of her hands she planteth a vineyard.
- 20 PRO 31 17 She girdeth her loins with strength, and strengtheneth her arms.
- 20 PRO 31 18 She perceiveth that her merchandise [is] good: her candle goeth not out by night.
- 20 PRO 31 19 She layeth her hands to the spindle, and her hands hold the distaff.
- 20 PRO 31 20 She stretcheth out her hand to the poor; yea, she reacheth forth her hands to the needy

20_PRO_31_21 She is not afraid of the snow for her household: for all her household [are] clothed with scarlet. 20 PRO 31 22 She maketh herself coverings of tapestry; her clothing [is] silk and purple. 20 PRO 31 23 Her husband is known in the gates, when he sitteth among the elders of the land. 20 PRO 31 24 She maketh fine linen, and selleth [it]; and delivereth girdles unto the merchant. 20 PRO 31 25 Strength and honour [are] her clothing; and she shall rejoice in time to come. 20 PRO 31 26 She openeth her mouth with wisdom; and in her tongue [is] the law of kindness. 20 PRO 31 27 She looketh well to the ways of her household, and eateth not the bread of idleness. 20 PRO 31 28 Her children arise up, and call her blessed; her husband [also], and he praiseth her. 20 PRO 31 29 Many daughters have done virtuously, but thou excellest them all.

20 PRO 31 30 Favour [is] deceitful, and beauty [is] vain: [but] a woman [that] feareth the LORD, she shall be praised.

20 PRO 31 31 Give her of the fruit of her hands; and let her own works praise her in the gates.
