- 42 LUK 02 44 But they, supposing him to have been in the company, went a day's journey; and they sought him

- 42\_LUK\_03\_01 Now in the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate being governor of Judaea, and Herod being tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of Ituraea and of the region of Trachonitis, and Lysanias the tetrarch of Abilene,
- 42\_LUK\_03\_02 Annas and Caiaphas being the high priests, the word of God came unto John the son of Zacharias in the wilderness.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_03 And he came into all the country about Jordan, preaching the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins;
- 42\_LUK\_03\_04 As it is written in the book of the words of Esaias the prophet, saying, The voice of one crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_05 Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be brought low; and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways [shall be] made smooth;
- 42\_LUK\_03\_06 And all flesh shall see the salvation of God.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_07 Then said he to the multitude that came forth to be baptized of him, O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come?
- 42\_LUK\_03\_08 Bring forth therefore fruits worthy of repentance, and begin not to say within yourselves, We have Abraham to [our] father: for I say unto you, That God is able of these stones to raise up children unto Abraham.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_09 And now also the ax is laid unto the root of the trees: every tree therefore which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_10 And the people asked him, saying, What shall we do then?
- 42\_LUK\_03\_11 He answereth and saith unto them, He that hath two coats, let him impart to him that hath none; and he that hath meat, let him do likewise.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_12 Then came also publicans to be baptized, and said unto him, Master, what shall we do?
- 42\_LUK\_03\_13 And he said unto them, Exact no more than that which is appointed you.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_14 And the soldiers likewise demanded of him, saying, And what shall we do? And he said unto them, Do violence to no man, neither accuse [any] falsely; and be content with your wages.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_15 And as the people were in expectation, and all men mused in their hearts of John, whether he were the Christ, or not;
- 42\_LUK\_03\_16 John answered, saying unto [them] all, I indeed baptize you with water; but one mightier than I cometh, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to unloose: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and with fire:
- 42\_LUK\_03\_17 Whose fan [is] in his hand, and he will thoroughly purge his floor, and will gather the wheat into his garner; but the chaff he will burn with fire unquenchable.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_18 And many other things in his exhortation preached he unto the people.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_19 But Herod the tetrarch, being reproved by him for Herodias his brother Philip's wife, and for all the evils which Herod had done,
- 42\_LUK\_03\_20 Added yet this above all, that he shut up John in prison.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_21 Now when all the people were baptized, it came to pass, that Jesus also being baptized, and praying, the heaven was opened,
- 42\_LUK\_03\_22 And the Holy Ghost descended in a bodily shape like a dove upon him, and a voice came from heaven, which said, Thou art my beloved Son; in thee I am well pleased.
- 42\_LUK\_03\_23 And Jesus himself began to be about thirty years of age, being [as was supposed] the son of Joseph, which was [the son] of Heli,
- 42\_LUK\_03\_24 Which was [the son] of Matthat, which was [the son] of Levi, which was [the son] of Melchi, which was [the son] of Janna, which was [the son] of Joseph,
- 42\_LUK\_03\_25 Which was [the son] of Mattathias, which was [the son] of Amos, which was [the son] of Naum, which was [the son] of Esli, which was [the son] of Nagge,
- 42\_LUK\_03\_26 Which was [the son] of Maath, which was [the son] of Mattathias, which was [the son] of Semei, which was [the son] of Joseph, which was [the son] of Juda,
- 42\_LUK\_03\_27 Which was [the son] of Joanna, which was [the son] of Rhesa, which was [the son] of Zorobabel, which was [the son] of Salathiel, which was [the son] of Neri,
- 42\_LUK\_03\_28 Which was [the son] of Melchi, which was [the son] of Addi, which was [the son] of Cosam, which was [the son] of Elmodam, which was [the son] of Er,

  42 LUK 03 36 Which was [the son] of Cainan, which was [the son] of Arphaxad, which was [the son] of Sem, which
- was [the son] of Noe, which was [the son] of Lamech,

  42 LUK 03 37 Which was [the son] of Mathusala, which was [the son] of Enoch, which was [the son] of Jared, which
- was [the son] of Maleleel, which was [the son] of Cainan,

  42 LUK 03 38 Which was [the son] of Enos, which was [the son] of Seth, which was [the son] of Adam, which was

[the son] of God.



- 42\_LUK\_04\_01 And Jesus being full of the Holy Ghost returned from Jordan, and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness,
- 42\_LUK\_04\_02 Being forty days tempted of the devil. And in those days he did eat nothing: and when they were ended, he afterward hungered.
- 42 LUK 04 03 And the devil said unto him, If thou be the Son of God, command this stone that it be made bread.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_04 And Jesus answered him, saying, It is written, That man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_05 And the devil, taking him up into an high mountain, showed unto him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_06 And the devil said unto him, All this power will I give thee, and the glory of them: for that is delivered unto me; and to whomsoever I will I give it.
- $42\_LUK\_04\_07$  If thou therefore wilt worship me, all shall be thine.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_08 And Jesus answered and said unto him, Get thee behind me, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_09 And he brought him to Jerusalem, and set him on a pinnacle of the temple, and said unto him, If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down from hence:
- 42\_LUK\_04\_10 For it is written, He shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee:
- 42\_LUK\_04\_11 And in [their] hands they shall bear thee up, lest at any time thou dash thy foot against a stone.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_12 And Jesus answering said unto him, It is said, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_13 And when the devil had ended all the temptation, he departed from him for a season.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_14 And Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit into Galilee: and there went out a fame of him through all the region round about.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_15 And he taught in their synagogues, being glorified of all.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_16 And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up: and, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_17 And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when he had opened the book, he found the place where it was written,
- 42\_LUK\_04\_18 The Spirit of the Lord [is] upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised,
- 42\_LUK\_04\_19 To preach the acceptable year of the Lord.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_20 And he closed the book, and he gave [it] again to the minister, and sat down. And the eyes of all them that were in the synagogue were fastened on him.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_21 And he began to say unto them, This day is this scripture fulfilled in your ears.
- 42\_LUK\_04\_22 And all bare him witness, and wondered at the gracious words which proceeded out of his mouth. And they said, Is not this Joseph's son?

- 42\_LUK\_05\_12 And it came to pass, when he was in a certain city, behold a man full of leprosy: who seeing Jesus fell on [his] face, and besought him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean.

- 42 LUK 06 16 And Judas [the brother] of James, and Judas Iscariot, which also was the traitor.
- 42 LUK 06 17 And he came down with them, and stood in the plain, and the company of his disciples, and a great multitude of people out of all Judaea and Jerusalem, and from the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon, which came to hear him, and to be healed of their diseases;
- 42 LUK 06 18 And they that were vexed with unclean spirits: and they were healed.
- 42 LUK 06 19 And the whole multitude sought to touch him: for there went virtue out of him, and healed [them] all.
- 42\_LUK\_06\_20 And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said, Blessed [be ye] poor: for yours is the kingdom of God.

- 42\_LUK\_11\_52 Woe unto you, lawyers! for ye have taken away the key of knowledge: ye entered not in yourselves,
- 42 LUK 11 53 And as he said these things unto them, the scribes and the Pharisees began to urge [him] vehemently,

42 LUK 11 54 Laying wait for him, and seeking to catch something out of his mouth, that they might accuse him.

- 42 LUK 12 02 For there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; neither hid, that shall not be known.
- 42 LUK 12 03 Therefore whatsoever ye have spoken in darkness shall be heard in the light; and that which ye have spoken in the ear in closets shall be proclaimed upon the housetops.
- 42 LUK 12 04 And I say unto you my friends, Be not afraid of them that kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do.
- 42 LUK 12 05 But I will forewarn you whom ye shall fear: Fear him, which after he hath killed hath power to cast into hell; yea, I say unto you, Fear him.
- 42 LUK 12 06 Are not five sparrows sold for two farthings, and not one of them is forgotten before God?
- 42 LUK 12 07 But even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not therefore: ye are of more value than many sparrows.
- 42 LUK 12 08 Also I say unto you, Whosoever shall confess me before men, him shall the Son of man also confess before the angels of God:
- 42 LUK 12 09 But he that denieth me before men shall be denied before the angels of God.

42 LUK 12 21 So [is] he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God.

- 42 LUK 12 23 The life is more than meat, and the body [is more] than raiment.

42 LUK 12 44 Of a truth I say unto you, that he will make him ruler over all that he hath.

42 LUK 12 45 But and if that servant say in his heart, My lord delayeth his coming; and shall begin to beat the

- 42\_LUK\_12\_46 The lord of that servant will come in a day when he looketh not for [him], and at an hour when he is not aware, and will cut him in sunder, and will appoint him his portion with the unbelievers.
- 42\_LUK\_12\_48 But he that knew not, and did commit things worthy of stripes, shall be beaten with few [stripes]. For

42 LUK 12 47 And that servant, which knew his lord's will, and prepared not [himself], neither did according to his

42\_LUK\_12\_49 I am come to send fire on the earth; and what will I, if it be already kindled?

- 42 LUK 12 58 When thou goest with thine adversary to the magistrate, [as thou art] in the way, give diligence that thou mayest be delivered from him; lest he hale thee to the judge, and the judge deliver thee to the officer, and the
- officer cast thee into prison. 42 LUK 12 59 I tell thee, thou shalt not depart thence, till thou hast paid the very last mite.



- 42\_LUK\_13\_01 There were present at that season some that told him of the Galilaeans, whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_02 And Jesus answering said unto them, Suppose ye that these Galilaeans were sinners above all the Galilaeans, because they suffered such things?
- 42\_LUK\_13\_03 I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_04 Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower in Siloam fell, and slew them, think ye that they were sinners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem?
- 42 LUK 13 05 I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_06 He spake also this parable; A certain [man] had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_07 Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground?
- 42 LUK 13 08 And he answering said unto him, Lord, let it alone this year also, till I shall dig about it, and dung [it]:
- 42\_LUK\_13\_09 And if it bear fruit, [well]: and if not, [then] after that thou shalt cut it down.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_10 And he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_11 And, behold, there was a woman which had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift up [herself].
- 42\_LUK\_13\_12 And when Jesus saw her, he called [her to him], and said unto her, Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_13 And he laid [his] hands on her: and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_14 And the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because that Jesus had healed on the sabbath day, and said unto the people, There are six days in which men ought to work: in them therefore come and be healed, and not on the sabbath day.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_15 The Lord then answered him, and said, [Thou] hypocrite, doth not each one of you on the sabbath loose his ox or [his] ass from the stall, and lead [him] away to watering?
- 42\_LUK\_13\_16 And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the sabbath day?
- 42\_LUK\_13\_17 And when he had said these things, all his adversaries were ashamed: and all the people rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by him.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_18 Then said he, Unto what is the kingdom of God like? and whereunto shall I resemble it?
- 42\_LUK\_13\_19 It is like a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and cast into his garden; and it grew, and waxed a great tree; and the fowls of the air lodged in the branches of it.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_20 And again he said, Whereunto shall I liken the kingdom of God?
- 42\_LUK\_13\_21 It is like leaven, which a woman took and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_22 And he went through the cities and villages, teaching, and journeying toward Jerusalem.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_23 Then said one unto him, Lord, are there few that be saved? And he said unto them,
- 42\_LUK\_13\_24 Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_25 When once the master of the house is risen up, and hath shut to the door, and ye begin to stand without, and to knock at the door, saying, Lord, Lord, open unto us; and he shall answer and say unto you, I know you not whence ye are:
- 42\_LUK\_13\_26 Then shall ye begin to say, We have eaten and drunk in thy presence, and thou hast taught in our streets.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_27 But he shall say, I tell you, I know you not whence ye are; depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_28 There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, and all the prophets, in the kingdom of God, and you [yourselves] thrust out.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_29 And they shall come from the east, and [from] the west, and from the north, and [from] the south, and shall sit down in the kingdom of God.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_30 And, behold, there are last which shall be first, and there are first which shall be last.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_31 The same day there came certain of the Pharisees, saying unto him, Get thee out, and depart hence: for Herod will kill thee.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_32 And he said unto them, Go ye, and tell that fox, Behold, I cast out devils, and I do cures to day and to morrow, and the third [day] I shall be perfected.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_33 Nevertheless I must walk to day, and to morrow, and the [day] following: for it cannot be that a prophet perish out of Jerusalem.
- 42\_LUK\_13\_34 O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, which killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee; how often would I have gathered thy children together, as a hen [doth gather] her brood under [her] wings, and ye would not!
- 42\_LUK\_13\_35 Behold, your house is left unto you desolate: and verily I say unto you, Ye shall not see me, until [the

time come when ye shall say, Blessed [is] he that cometh in the name of the Lord.



- 42\_LUK\_14\_01 And it came to pass, as he went into the house of one of the chief Pharisees to eat bread on the sabbath day, that they watched him.
- 42 LUK 14 02 And, behold, there was a certain man before him which had the dropsy.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_03 And Jesus answering spake unto the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath day?
- 42\_LUK\_14\_04 And they held their peace. And he took [him], and healed him, and let him go;
- 42\_LUK\_14\_05 And answered them, saying, Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fallen into a pit, and will not straightway pull him out on the sabbath day?
- 42\_LUK\_14\_06 And they could not answer him again to these things.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_07 And he put forth a parable to those which were bidden, when he marked how they chose out the chief rooms; saying unto them,
- 42\_LUK\_14\_08 When thou art bidden of any [man] to a wedding, sit not down in the highest room; lest a more honourable man than thou be bidden of him;
- 42\_LUK\_14\_09 And he that bade thee and him come and say to thee, Give this man place; and thou begin with shame to take the lowest room.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_10 But when thou art bidden, go and sit down in the lowest room; that when he that bade thee cometh, he may say unto thee, Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have worship in the presence of them that sit at meat with thee.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_11 For whosoever exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_12 Then said he also to him that bade him, When thou makest a dinner or a supper, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor [thy] rich neighbours; lest they also bid thee again, and a recompense be made thee.
- 42 LUK 14 13 But when thou makest a feast, call the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind:
- 42\_LUK\_14\_14 And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_15 And when one of them that sat at meat with him heard these things, he said unto him, Blessed [is] he that shall eat bread in the kingdom of God.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_16 Then said he unto him, A certain man made a great supper, and bade many:
- 42\_LUK\_14\_17 And sent his servant at supper time to say to them that were bidden, Come; for all things are now ready.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_18 And they all with one [consent] began to make excuse. The first said unto him, I have bought a piece of ground, and I must needs go and see it: I pray thee have me excused.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_19 And another said, I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to prove them: I pray thee have me excused.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_20 And another said, I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_21 So that servant came, and showed his lord these things. Then the master of the house being angry said to his servant, Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in hither the poor, and the maimed, and the halt, and the blind.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_22 And the servant said, Lord, it is done as thou hast commanded, and yet there is room.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_23 And the lord said unto the servant, Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel [them] to come in, that my house may be filled.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_24 For I say unto you, That none of those men which were bidden shall taste of my supper.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_25 And there went great multitudes with him: and he turned, and said unto them,
- 42\_LUK\_14\_26 If any [man] come to me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be my disciple.
- 42 LUK 14 27 And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple.
- 42\_LUK\_14\_28 For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he have [sufficient] to finish [it]?
- 42\_LUK\_14\_29 Lest haply, after he hath laid the foundation, and is not able to finish [it], all that behold [it] begin to mock him,
- 42\_LUK\_14\_30 Saying, This man began to build, and was not able to finish.

let him hear.

- 42\_LUK\_14\_31 Or what king, going to make war against another king, sitteth not down first, and consulteth whether he be able with ten thousand to meet him that cometh against him with twenty thousand?
- 42\_LUK\_14\_32 Or else, while the other is yet a great way off, he sendeth an ambassage, and desireth conditions of
- peace.

42 LUK 14 33 So likewise, whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple.

- 42 LUK 14 34 Salt [is] good: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be seasoned?
- 42\_LUK\_14\_35 It is neither fit for the land, nor yet for the dunghill; [but] men cast it out. He that hath ears to hear,



- 42 LUK 15 01 Then drew near unto him all the publicans and sinners for to hear him.
- 42 LUK 15 02 And the Pharisees and scribes murmured, saying, This man receiveth sinners, and eateth with them.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_03 And he spake this parable unto them, saying,
- 42\_LUK\_15\_04 What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them, doth not leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and go after that which is lost, until he find it?
- 42\_LUK\_15\_05 And when he hath found [it], he layeth [it] on his shoulders, rejoicing.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_06 And when he cometh home, he calleth together [his] friends and neighbours, saying unto them, Rejoice with me; for I have found my sheep which was lost.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_07 I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_08 Either what woman having ten pieces of silver, if she lose one piece, doth not light a candle, and sweep the house, and seek diligently till she find [it]?
- 42\_LUK\_15\_09 And when she hath found [it], she calleth [her] friends and [her] neighbours together, saying, Rejoice with me; for I have found the piece which I had lost.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_10 Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth.
- 42 LUK 15 11 And he said, A certain man had two sons:
- 42\_LUK\_15\_12 And the younger of them said to [his] father, Father, give me the portion of goods that falleth [to me]. And he divided unto them [his] living.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_13 And not many days after the younger son gathered all together, and took his journey into a far country, and there wasted his substance with riotous living.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_14 And when he had spent all, there arose a mighty famine in that land; and he began to be in want.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_15 And he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_16 And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_17 And when he came to himself, he said, How many hired servants of my father's have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger!
- 42\_LUK\_15\_18 I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee,
- 42\_LUK\_15\_19 And am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_20 And he arose, and came to his father. But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_21 And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_22 But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put [it] on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on [his] feet:
- 42\_LUK\_15\_23 And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill [it]; and let us eat, and be merry:
- 42\_LUK\_15\_24 For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_25 Now his elder son was in the field: and as he came and drew nigh to the house, he heard music and dancing.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_26 And he called one of the servants, and asked what these things meant.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_27 And he said unto him, Thy brother is come; and thy father hath killed the fatted calf, because he hath received him safe and sound.
- 42 LUK 15 28 And he was angry, and would not go in: therefore came his father out, and entreated him.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_29 And he answering said to [his] father, Lo, these many years do I serve thee, neither transgressed I at any time thy commandment: and yet thou never gavest me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends:
- 42\_LUK\_15\_30 But as soon as this thy son was come, which hath devoured thy living with harlots, thou hast killed for him the fatted calf.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_31 And he said unto him, Son, thou art ever with me, and all that I have is thine.
- 42\_LUK\_15\_32 It was meet that we should make merry, and be glad: for this thy brother was dead, and is alive again; and was lost, and is found.



- 42\_LUK\_16\_01 And he said also unto his disciples, There was a certain rich man, which had a steward; and the same was accused unto him that he had wasted his goods.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_02 And he called him, and said unto him, How is it that I hear this of thee? give an account of thy stewardship; for thou mayest be no longer steward.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_03 Then the steward said within himself, What shall I do? for my lord taketh away from me the stewardship: I cannot dig; to beg I am ashamed.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_04 I am resolved what to do, that, when I am put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_05 So he called every one of his lord's debtors [unto him], and said unto the first, How much owest thou unto my lord?
- 42\_LUK\_16\_06 And he said, An hundred measures of oil. And he said unto him, Take thy bill, and sit down quickly, and write fifty.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_07 Then said he to another, And how much owest thou? And he said, An hundred measures of wheat. And he said unto him, Take thy bill, and write fourscore.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_08 And the lord commended the unjust steward, because he had done wisely: for the children of this world are in their generation wiser than the children of light.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_09 And I say unto you, Make to yourselves friends of the mammon of unrighteousness; that, when ye fail, they may receive you into everlasting habitations.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_10 He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_11 If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true [riches]?
- 42\_LUK\_16\_12 And if ye have not been faithful in that which is another man's, who shall give you that which is your own?
- 42\_LUK\_16\_13 No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_14 And the Pharisees also, who were covetous, heard all these things: and they derided him.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_15 And he said unto them, Ye are they which justify yourselves before men; but God knoweth your hearts: for that which is highly esteemed among men is abomination in the sight of God.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_16 The law and the prophets [were] until John: since that time the kingdom of God is preached, and every man presseth into it.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_17 And it is easier for heaven and earth to pass, than one tittle of the law to fail.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_18 Whosoever putteth away his wife, and marrieth another, committeth adultery: and whosoever marrieth her that is put away from [her] husband committeth adultery.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_19 There was a certain rich man, which was clothed in purple and fine linen, and fared sumptuously every day:
- 42 LUK 16 20 And there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, which was laid at his gate, full of sores,
- 42\_LUK\_16\_21 And desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table: moreover the dogs came and licked his sores.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_22 And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried;
- 42\_LUK\_16\_23 And in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_24 And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_25 But Abraham said, Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_26 And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that [would come] from thence.
- 42 LUK 16 27 Then he said, I pray thee therefore, father, that thou wouldest send him to my father's house:
- 42 LUK 16 28 For I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_29 Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.
- 42 LUK 16 30 And he said, Nay, father Abraham: but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent.
- 42\_LUK\_16\_31 And he said unto him, If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead.



- 42\_LUK\_17\_01 Then said he unto the disciples, It is impossible but that offences will come: but woe [unto him], through whom they come!
- 42\_LUK\_17\_02 It were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and he cast into the sea, than that he should offend one of these little ones.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_03 Take heed to yourselves: If thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, forgive him.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_04 And if he trespass against thee seven times in a day, and seven times in a day turn again to thee, saying, I repent; thou shalt forgive him.
- 42 LUK 17 05 And the apostles said unto the Lord, Increase our faith.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_06 And the Lord said, If ye had faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye might say unto this sycamine tree, Be thou plucked up by the root, and be thou planted in the sea; and it should obey you.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_07 But which of you, having a servant plowing or feeding cattle, will say unto him by and by, when he is come from the field, Go and sit down to meat?
- 42\_LUK\_17\_08 And will not rather say unto him, Make ready wherewith I may sup, and gird thyself, and serve me, till I have eaten and drunken; and afterward thou shalt eat and drink?
- 42 LUK 17 09 Doth he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I trow not.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_10 So likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_11 And it came to pass, as he went to Jerusalem, that he passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee.
- Gamee.

42 LUK 17 12 And as he entered into a certain village, there met him ten men that were lepers, which stood afar off:

- 42\_LUK\_17\_13 And they lifted up [their] voices, and said, Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_14 And when he saw [them], he said unto them, Go show yourselves unto the priests. And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were cleansed.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_15 And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God,
- 42\_LUK\_17\_16 And fell down on [his] face at his feet, giving him thanks: and he was a Samaritan.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_17 And Jesus answering said, Were there not ten cleansed? but where [are] the nine?
- 42\_LUK\_17\_18 There are not found that returned to give glory to God, save this stranger.
- 42 LUK 17 19 And he said unto him, Arise, go thy way: thy faith hath made thee whole.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_20 And when he was demanded of the Pharisees, when the kingdom of God should come, he answered them and said, The kingdom of God cometh not with observation:
- 42\_LUK\_17\_21 Neither shall they say, Lo here! or, lo there! for, behold, the kingdom of God is within you.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_22 And he said unto the disciples, The days will come, when ye shall desire to see one of the days of the Son of man, and ye shall not see [it].
- 42\_LUK\_17\_23 And they shall say to you, See here; or, see there: go not after [them], nor follow [them].
- 42\_LUK\_17\_24 For as the lightning, that lighteneth out of the one [part] under heaven, shineth unto the other [part] under heaven; so shall also the Son of man be in his day.
- 42 LUK 17 25 But first must be suffer many things, and be rejected of this generation.
- 42 LUK 17 26 And as it was in the days of Noe, so shall it be also in the days of the Son of man.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_27 They did eat, they drank, they married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, and the flood came, and destroyed them all.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_28 Likewise also as it was in the days of Lot; they did eat, they drank, they bought, they sold, they planted, they builded;
- 42\_LUK\_17\_29 But the same day that Lot went out of Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven, and destroyed [them] all.
- 42 LUK 17 30 Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_31 In that day, he which shall be upon the housetop, and his stuff in the house, let him not come down to take it away: and he that is in the field, let him likewise not return back.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_32 Remember Lot's wife.
- 42 LUK 17 33 Whosoever shall seek to save his life shall lose it; and whosoever shall lose his life shall preserve it.
- 42\_LUK\_17\_34 I tell you, in that night there shall be two [men] in one bed; the one shall be taken, and the other shall be left.
- 42 LUK 17 35 Two [women] shall be grinding together; the one shall be taken, and the other left.

42 LUK 17 36 Two [men] shall be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left.

42\_LUK\_17\_37 And they answered and said unto him, Where, Lord? And he said unto them, Wheresoever the body [is], thither will the eagles be gathered together.



- 42 LUK 18 01 And he spake a parable unto them [to this end], that men ought always to pray, and not to faint;
- 42 LUK 18 02 Saying, There was in a city a judge, which feared not God, neither regarded man:
- 42\_LUK\_18\_03 And there was a widow in that city; and she came unto him, saying, Avenge me of mine adversary.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_04 And he would not for a while: but afterward he said within himself, Though I fear not God, nor regard man;
- 42\_LUK\_18\_05 Yet because this widow troubleth me, I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me.
- 42 LUK 18 06 And the Lord said, Hear what the unjust judge saith.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_07 And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them?
- 42\_LUK\_18\_08 I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?
- 42\_LUK\_18\_09 And he spake this parable unto certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others:
- 42 LUK 18 10 Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men [are], extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_12 I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_13 And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as [his] eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified [rather] than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_15 And they brought unto him also infants, that he would touch them: but when [his] disciples saw [it], they rebuked them.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_16 But Jesus called them [unto him], and said, Suffer little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_17 Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child shall in no wise enter therein.
- 42 LUK 18 18 And a certain ruler asked him, saying, Good Master, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?
- 42\_LUK\_18\_19 And Jesus said unto him, Why callest thou me good? none [is] good, save one, [that is], God.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_20 Thou knowest the commandments, Do not commit adultery, Do not kill, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Honour thy father and thy mother.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_21 And he said, All these have I kept from my youth up.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_22 Now when Jesus heard these things, he said unto him, Yet lackest thou one thing: sell all that thou hast, and distribute unto the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, follow me.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_23 And when he heard this, he was very sorrowful: for he was very rich.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_24 And when Jesus saw that he was very sorrowful, he said, How hardly shall they that have riches enter into the kingdom of God!
- 42\_LUK\_18\_25 For it is easier for a camel to go through a needle's eye, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of God.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_26 And they that heard [it] said, Who then can be saved?
- 42\_LUK\_18\_27 And he said, The things which are impossible with men are possible with God.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_28 Then Peter said, Lo, we have left all, and followed thee.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_29 And he said unto them, Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or parents, or brethren, or wife, or children, for the kingdom of God's sake,
- 42\_LUK\_18\_30 Who shall not receive manifold more in this present time, and in the world to come life everlasting.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_31 Then he took [unto him] the twelve, and said unto them, Behold, we go up to Jerusalem, and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of man shall be accomplished.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_32 For he shall be delivered unto the Gentiles, and shall be mocked, and spitefully entreated, and spitted on:
- 42\_LUK\_18\_33 And they shall scourge [him], and put him to death: and the third day he shall rise again.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_34 And they understood none of these things: and this saying was hid from them, neither knew they the things which were spoken.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_35 And it came to pass, that as he was come nigh unto Jericho, a certain blind man sat by the way side begging:
- 42\_LUK\_18\_36 And hearing the multitude pass by, he asked what it meant.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_37 And they told him, that Jesus of Nazareth passeth by.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_38 And he cried, saying, Jesus, [thou] son of David, have mercy on me.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_39 And they which went before rebuked him, that he should hold his peace: but he cried so much the more, [Thou] son of David, have mercy on me.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_40 And Jesus stood, and commanded him to be brought unto him: and when he was come near, he asked him,
- nim,
- 42 LUK 18 42 And Jesus said unto him, Receive thy sight: thy faith hath saved thee.
- 42\_LUK\_18\_43 And immediately he received his sight, and followed him, glorifying God: and all the people, when they saw [it], gave praise unto God.

42 LUK 18 41 Saying, What wilt thou that I shall do unto thee? And he said, Lord, that I may receive my sight.



- 42 LUK 19 01 And [Jesus] entered and passed through Jericho.
- 42 LUK 19 02 And, behold, [there was] a man named Zacchaeus, which was the chief among the publicans, and he was rich.
- 42 LUK 19 03 And he sought to see Jesus who he was; and could not for the press, because he was little of stature.
- 42 LUK 19 04 And he ran before, and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him: for he was to pass that [way].
- 42 LUK 19 05 And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up, and saw him, and said unto him, Zacchaeus, make haste, and come down; for to day I must abide at thy house.
- 42 LUK 19 06 And he made haste, and came down, and received him joyfully.
- 42 LUK 19 07 And when they saw [it], they all murmured, saying, That he was gone to be guest with a man that is a sinner.
- 42 LUK 19 08 And Zacchaeus stood, and said unto the Lord; Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have taken any thing from any man by false accusation, I restore [him] fourfold.
- 42 LUK 19 09 And Jesus said unto him, This day is salvation come to this house, forsomuch as he also is a son of Abraham.
- 42 LUK 19 10 For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost.
- 42 LUK 19 11 And as they heard these things, he added and spake a parable, because he was night o Jerusalem, and because they thought that the kingdom of God should immediately appear.
- 42 LUK 19 12 He said therefore, A certain nobleman went into a far country to receive for himself a kingdom, and to return.
- 42 LUK 19 13 And he called his ten servants, and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, Occupy till I come.
- 42 LUK 19 14 But his citizens hated him, and sent a message after him, saying, We will not have this [man] to reign over us.
- 42 LUK 19 15 And it came to pass, that when he was returned, having received the kingdom, then he commanded these servants to be called unto him, to whom he had given the money, that he might know how much every man had gained by trading.
- 42 LUK 19 16 Then came the first, saying, Lord, thy pound hath gained ten pounds.
- 42 LUK 19 17 And he said unto him, Well, thou good servant: because thou hast been faithful in a very little, have thou authority over ten cities.
- 42 LUK 19 18 And the second came, saying, Lord, thy pound hath gained five pounds.
- 42 LUK 19 19 And he said likewise to him, Be thou also over five cities.
- 42 LUK 19 20 And another came, saying, Lord, behold, [here is] thy pound, which I have kept laid up in a napkin:
- 42 LUK 19 21 For I feared thee, because thou art an austere man: thou takest up that thou layedst not down, and reapest that thou didst not sow.
- 42 LUK 19 22 And he saith unto him, Out of thine own mouth will I judge thee, [thou] wicked servant. Thou knewest that I was an austere man, taking up that I laid not down, and reaping that I did not sow:
- mine own with usury? 42 LUK 19 24 And he said unto them that stood by, Take from him the pound, and give [it] to him that hath ten

42 LUK 19 23 Wherefore then gavest not thou my money into the bank, that at my coming I might have required

- 42 LUK 19 26 For I say unto you, That unto every one which hath shall be given; and from him that hath not, even

- 42 LUK 19 33 And as they were loosing the colt, the owners thereof said unto them, Why loose ye the colt?
- 42 LUK 19 34 And they said, The Lord hath need of him.
- 42 LUK 19 35 And they brought him to Jesus: and they cast their garments upon the colt, and they set Jesus thereon.

- 42 LUK 20 08 And Jesus said unto them, Neither tell I you by what authority I do these things.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_09 Then began he to speak to the people this parable; A certain man planted a vineyard, and let it forth to husbandmen, and went into a far country for a long time.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_10 And at the season he sent a servant to the husbandmen, that they should give him of the fruit of the vineyard: but the husbandmen beat him, and sent [him] away empty.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_11 And again he sent another servant: and they beat him also, and entreated [him] shamefully, and sent [him] away empty.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_12 And again he sent a third: and they wounded him also, and cast [him] out.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_13 Then said the lord of the vineyard, What shall I do? I will send my beloved son: it may be they will reverence [him] when they see him.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_14 But when the husbandmen saw him, they reasoned among themselves, saying, This is the heir: come, let us kill him, that the inheritance may be ours.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_15 So they cast him out of the vineyard, and killed [him]. What therefore shall the lord of the vineyard do unto them?
- 42\_LUK\_20\_16 He shall come and destroy these husbandmen, and shall give the vineyard to others. And when they heard [it], they said, God forbid.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_17 And he beheld them, and said, What is this then that is written, The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the head of the corner?
- 42\_LUK\_20\_18 Whosoever shall fall upon that stone shall be broken; but on whomsoever it shall fall, it will grind him to powder.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_19 And the chief priests and the scribes the same hour sought to lay hands on him; and they feared the people: for they perceived that he had spoken this parable against them.
- 42\_LUK\_20\_20 And they watched [him], and sent forth spies, which should feign themselves just men, that they might
- 42\_LUK\_20\_21 And they asked him, saying, Master, we know that thou sayest and teachest rightly, neither acceptest thou the person [of any], but teachest the way of God truly:

- 42\_LUK\_20\_22 Is it lawful for us to give tribute unto Caesar, or no?
- 42\_LUK\_20\_23 But he perceived their craftiness, and said unto them, Why tempt ye me?
- 42\_LUK\_20\_24 Show me a penny. Whose image and superscription hath it? They answered and said, Caesar's.

42 LUK 20 26 And they could not take hold of his words before the people: and they marvelled at his answer, and

- 42\_LUK\_20\_39 Then certain of the scribes answering said, Master, thou hast well said.

- 42\_LUK\_20\_42 And David himself saith in the book of Psalms, The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right

- 42\_LUK\_20\_44 David therefore calleth him Lord, how is he then his son?
- 42\_LUK\_20\_45 Then in the audience of all the people he said unto his disciples,
- 42\_LUK\_20\_46 Beware of the scribes, which desire to walk in long robes, and love greetings in the markets, and the highest seats in the synagogues, and the chief rooms at feasts;
- 42\_LUK\_20\_47 Which devour widows' houses, and for a show make long prayers: the same shall receive greater



- 42 LUK 21 01 And he looked up, and saw the rich men casting their gifts into the treasury.
- 42\_LUK\_21\_02 And he saw also a certain poor widow casting in thither two mites.
- 42\_LUK\_21\_03 And he said, Of a truth I say unto you, that this poor widow hath cast in more than they all:
- 42\_LUK\_21\_04 For all these have of their abundance cast in unto the offerings of God: but she of her penury hath cast in all the living that she had.
- 42 LUK 21 05 And as some spake of the temple, how it was adorned with goodly stones and gifts, he said,
- 42\_LUK\_21\_06 [As for] these things which ye behold, the days will come, in the which there shall not be left one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down.

- 42\_LUK\_21\_11 And great earthquakes shall be in divers places, and famines, and pestilences; and fearful sights and great signs shall there be from heaven.
- 42\_LUK\_21\_12 But before all these, they shall lay their hands on you, and persecute [you], delivering [you] up to the synagogues, and into prisons, being brought before kings and rulers for my name's sake.
- 42\_LUK\_21\_13 And it shall turn to you for a testimony.
- 42 LUK 21 14 Settle [it] therefore in your hearts, not to meditate before what ye shall answer:
- 42\_LUK\_21\_15 For I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which all your adversaries shall not be able to gainsay nor resist.
