

## **Complete KJV Holy Bible**

18 JOB 10 01 My soul is weary of my life; I will leave my complaint upon myself; I will speak in the bitterness of my soul.

18 JOB 10 02 I will say unto God, Do not condemn me; show me wherefore thou contendest with me.

18 JOB 10 03 [Is it] good unto thee that thou shouldest oppress, that thou shouldest despise the work of thine hands, and shine upon the counsel of the wicked?

18 JOB 10 04 Hast thou eyes of flesh? or seest thou as man seeth?

18 JOB 10 05 [Are] thy days as the days of man? [are] thy years as man's days,

18 JOB 10 06 That thou inquirest after mine iniquity, and searchest after my sin?

18 JOB 10 07 Thou knowest that I am not wicked; and [there is] none that can deliver out of thine hand.

18 JOB 10 08 Thine hands have made me and fashioned me together round about; yet thou dost destroy me.

18 JOB 10 09 Remember, I beseech thee, that thou hast made me as the clay; and wilt thou bring me into dust again?

18 JOB 10 10 Hast thou not poured me out as milk, and curdled me like cheese?

18 JOB 10 11 Thou hast clothed me with skin and flesh, and hast fenced me with bones and sinews.

18 JOB 10 12 Thou hast granted me life and favour, and thy visitation hath preserved my spirit.

18\_JOB\_10\_13 And these [things] hast thou hid in thine heart: I know that this [is] with thee.

18 JOB 10 14 If I sin, then thou markest me, and thou wilt not acquit me from mine iniquity.

18 JOB 10 15 If I be wicked, woe unto me; and [if] I be righteous, [yet] will I not lift up my head. [I am] full of confusion; therefore see thou mine affliction;

18 JOB 10 16 For it increaseth. Thou huntest me as a fierce lion: and again thou showest thyself marvellous upon me.

18 JOB 10 17 Thou renewest thy witnesses against me, and increasest thine indignation upon me; changes and war [are] against me.

## 18 JOB 10 18 Wherefore then hast thou brought me forth out of the womb? Oh that I had given up the ghost, and no eye had seen me!

18 JOB 10 19 I should have been as though I had not been; I should have been carried from the womb to the grave.

18 JOB 10 20 [Are] not my days few? cease [then, and] let me alone, that I may take comfort a little,

18 JOB 10 21 Before I go [whence] I shall not return, [even] to the land of darkness and the shadow of death;

18\_JOB\_10\_22 A land of darkness, as darkness [itself; and] of the shadow of death, without any order, and [where] the light [is] as darkness.
