- 18 JOB 13 01 Lo, mine eye hath seen all [this], mine ear hath heard and understood it.
- 18 JOB 13 02 What ye know, [the same] do I know also: I [am] not inferior unto you.
- 18 JOB 13 03 Surely I would speak to the Almighty, and I desire to reason with God.
- 18 JOB 13 04 But ye [are] forgers of lies, ye [are] all physicians of no value.
- 18 JOB 13 05 O that ye would altogether hold your peace! and it should be your wisdom.
- 18 JOB 13 06 Hear now my reasoning, and hearken to the pleadings of my lips.
- **18 JOB 13 07 Will ye speak wickedly for God? and talk deceitfully for him?**
- **18 JOB 13 08 Will ye accept his person? will ye contend for God?**
- 18_JOB_13_09 Is it good that he should search you out? or as one man mocketh another, do ye [so] mock him?
- **18 JOB 13 10 He will surely reprove you, if ye do secretly accept persons.**
- 18 JOB 13 11 Shall not his excellency make you afraid? and his dread fall upon you?
- 18_JOB_13_12 Your remembrances [are] like unto ashes, your bodies to bodies of clay.
- 18_JOB_13_13 Hold your peace, let me alone, that I may speak, and let come on me what [will].
- 18 JOB 13 14 Wherefore do I take my flesh in my teeth, and put my life in mine hand?
- 18 JOB 13 15 Though he slay me, yet will I trust in him: but I will maintain mine own ways before him.
- 18 JOB 13 16 He also [shall be] my salvation: for an hypocrite shall not come before him.
- 18 JOB 13 17 Hear diligently my speech, and my declaration with your ears.
- 18_JOB_13_18 Behold now, I have ordered [my] cause; I know that I shall be justified.
- 18 JOB 13 19 Who [is] he [that] will plead with me? for now, if I hold my tongue, I shall give up the ghost.
- 18_JOB_13_20 Only do not two [things] unto me: then will I not hide myself from thee.

18 JOB 13 21 Withdraw thine hand far from me: and let not thy dread make me afraid.

18 JOB 13 22 Then call thou, and I will answer: or let me speak, and answer thou me.

18 JOB 13 23 How many [are] mine iniquities and sins? make me to know my transgression and my sin.

18 JOB 13 24 Wherefore hidest thou thy face, and holdest me for thine enemy?

18 JOB 13 25 Wilt thou break a leaf driven to and fro? and wilt thou pursue the dry stubble?

18 JOB 13 26 For thou writest bitter things against me, and makest me to possess the iniquities of my youth.

18 JOB 13 27 Thou puttest my feet also in the stocks, and lookest narrowly unto all my paths; thou settest a print upon the heels of my feet.

18 JOB 13 28 And he, as a rotten thing, consumeth, as a garment that is moth eaten.
