## **Book of Genesis Chapter 44**

- 01\_GEN\_44\_01 And he commanded the steward of his house, saying, Fill the men's sacks [with] food, as much as they can carry, and put every man's money in his sack's mouth.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_02 And put my cup, the silver cup, in the sack's mouth of the youngest, and his corn money. And he did according to the word that Joseph had spoken.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_03 As soon as the morning was light, the men were sent away, they and their asses.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_04 [And] when they were gone out of the city, [and] not [yet] far off, Joseph said unto his steward, Up, follow after the men; and when thou dost overtake them, say unto them, Wherefore have ye rewarded evil for good?
- 01 GEN 44 05 [Is] not this [it] in which my lord drinketh, and whereby indeed he divineth? ye have done evil in so doing.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_06 And he overtook them, and he spake unto them these same words.
- 01 GEN 44 07 And they said unto him. Wherefore saith my lord these words? God forbid that thy servants should do according to this thing:
- 01\_GEN\_44\_08 Behold, the money, which we found in our sacks' mouths, we brought again unto thee out of the land of Canaan: how then should we steal out of thy lord's house silver or gold?
- 01\_GEN\_44\_09 With whomsoever of thy servants it be found, both let him die, and we also will be my lord's bondmen.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_10 And he said, Now also [let] it [be] according unto your words: he with whom it is found shall be my servant; and ye shall be blameless.
- 01 GEN 44 11 Then they speedily took down every man his sack to the ground, and opened every man his sack.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_12 And he searched, [and] began at the eldest, and left at the youngest: and the cup was found in Benjamin's sack.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_13 Then they rent their clothes, and laded every man his ass, and returned to the city.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_14 And Judah and his brethren came to Joseph's house; for he [was] yet there: and they fell before him on the ground.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_15 And Joseph said unto them, What deed [is] this that ye have done? wot ye not that such a man as I can certainly divine?
- 01\_GEN\_44\_16 And Judah said, What shall we say unto my lord? what shall we speak? or how shall we clear ourselves? God hath found out the iniquity of thy servants: behold, we [are] my lord's servants, both we, and [he] also with whom the cup is found.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_17 And he said, God forbid that I should do so: [but] the man in whose hand the cup is found, he shall be my servant; and as for you, get you up in peace unto your father.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_18 Then Judah came near unto him, and said, Oh my lord, let thy servant, I pray thee, speak a word in my lord's ears, and let not thine anger burn against thy servant: for thou [art] even as Pharaoh.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_19 My lord asked his servants, saying, Have ye a father, or a brother?
- 01\_GEN\_44\_20 And we said unto my lord, We have a father, an old man, and a child of his old age, a little one; and his brother is dead, and he alone is left of his mother, and his father loveth him.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_21 And thou saidst unto thy servants, Bring him down unto me, that I may set mine eyes upon him.
- 01 GEN 44 22 And we said unto my lord. The lad cannot leave his father; for [if] he should leave his father, [his father] would die.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_23 And thou saidst unto thy servants, Except your youngest brother come down with you, ye shall see my face no more.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_24 And it came to pass when we came up unto thy servant my father, we told him the words of my lord
- 01\_GEN\_44\_25 And our father said, Go again, [and] buy us a little food.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_26 And we said, We cannot go down: if our youngest brother be with us, then will we go down: for we may not see the man's face, except our youngest brother [be] with us.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_27 And thy servant my father said unto us, Ye know that my wife bare me two [sons]:
- 01\_GEN\_44\_28 And the one went out from me, and I said, Surely he is torn in pieces; and I saw him not since:
- $01\_GEN\_44\_29 \ And \ if \ ye \ take \ this \ also \ from \ me, \ and \ mischief \ befall \ him, \ ye \ shall \ bring \ down \ my \ gray \ hairs \ with \ sorrow \ to \ the \ grave.$
- $01\_GEN\_44\_30 \ Now \ therefore \ when \ I \ come \ to \ thy \ servant \ my \ father, \ and \ the \ lad \ [be] \ not \ with \ us; \ seeing \ that \ his \ life \ is \ bound \ up \ in \ the \ lad's \ life;$
- 01\_GEN\_44\_31 It shall come to pass, when he seeth that the lad [is] not [with us], that he will die: and thy servants shall bring down the gray hairs of thy servant our father with sorrow to the grave.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_32 For thy servant became surety for the lad unto my father, saying, If I bring him not unto thee, then I shall bear the blame to my father for ever.
- 01\_GEN\_44\_33 Now therefore, I pray thee, let thy servant abide instead of the lad a bondman to my lord; and let the lad go up with his brethren
- 01\_GEN\_44\_34 For how shall I go up to my father, and the lad [be] not with me? lest peradventure I see the evil that shall come on my father.
