

## Book of 1st Corinthians Chapter 15

46\_1CO\_15\_01 Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand;

46\_1CO\_15\_02 By which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain.

46\_1CO\_15\_03 For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures;

46\_1CO\_15\_04 And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:

46\_1CO\_15\_05 And that he was seen of Cephas, then of the twelve:

46\_1CO\_15\_06 After that, he was seen of above five hundred brethren at once; of whom the greater part remain unto this present, but some are fallen asleep.

46\_1CO\_15\_07 After that, he was seen of James; then of all the apostles.

46\_1CO\_15\_08 And last of all he was seen of me also, as of one born out of due time.

46\_1CO\_15\_09 For I am the least of the apostles, that am not meet to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.

46\_1CO\_15\_10 But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which [was bestowed] upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me.

46\_1CO\_15\_11 Therefore whether [it were] I or they, so we preach, and so ye believed.

46\_1CO\_15\_12 Now if Christ be preached that he rose from the dead, how say some among you that there is no resurrection of the dead?

46\_1CO\_15\_13 But if there be no resurrection of the dead, then is Christ not risen:

46\_1CO\_15\_14 And if Christ be not risen, then [is] our preaching vain, and your faith [is] also vain.

46\_1CO\_15\_15 Yea, and we are found false witnesses of God; because we have testified of God that he raised up Christ: whom he raised not up, if so be that the dead rise not.

46\_1CO\_15\_16 For if the dead rise not, then is not Christ raised:

46\_1CO\_15\_17 And if Christ be not raised, your faith [is] vain; ye are yet in your sins.

46\_1CO\_15\_18 Then they also which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished.

46\_1CO\_15\_19 If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable.

46\_1CO\_15\_20 But now is Christ risen from the dead, [and] become the firstfruits of them that slept.

46\_1CO\_15\_21 For since by man [came] death, by man [came] also the resurrection of the dead.

46\_1CO\_15\_22 For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive.

46\_1CO\_15\_23 But every man in his own order: Christ the firstfruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his

coming.

46\_1CO\_15\_24 Then [cometh] the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power.

46\_1CO\_15\_25 For he must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet.

46\_1CO\_15\_26 The last enemy [that] shall be destroyed [is] death.

46\_1CO\_15\_27 For he hath put all things under his feet. But when he saith all things are put under [him, it is] manifest that he is excepted, which did put all things under him.

46\_1CO\_15\_28 And when all things shall be subdued unto him, then shall the Son also himself be subject unto him that put all things under him, that God may be all in all.

46\_1CO\_15\_29 Else what shall they do which are baptized for the dead, if the dead rise not at all? why are they then baptized for the dead?

46\_1CO\_15\_30 And why stand we in jeopardy every hour?

46\_1CO\_15\_31 I protest by your rejoicing which I have in Christ Jesus our Lord, I die daily.

46\_1CO\_15\_32 If after the manner of men I have fought with beasts at Ephesus, what advantageth it me, if the dead rise not? let us eat and drink; for to morrow we die.

46\_1CO\_15\_33 Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners.

46\_1CO\_15\_34 Awake to righteousness, and sin not; for some have not the knowledge of God: I speak [this] to your shame.

46\_1CO\_15\_35 But some [man] will say, How are the dead raised up? and with what body do they come?

46\_1CO\_15\_36 [Thou] fool, that which thou sowest is not quickened, except it die:

46\_1CO\_15\_37 And that which thou sowest, thou sowest not that body that shall be, but bare grain, it may chance of wheat, or of some other [grain]:

46\_1CO\_15\_38 But God giveth it a body as it hath pleased him, and to every seed his own body.

46\_1CO\_15\_39 All flesh [is] not the same flesh: but [there is] one [kind of] flesh of men, another flesh of beasts, another of fishes, [and] another of birds.

46\_1CO\_15\_40 [There are] also celestial bodies, and bodies terrestrial: but the glory of the celestial [is] one, and the [glory] of the terrestrial [is] another.

46\_1CO\_15\_41 [There is] one glory of the sun, and another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars: for [one] star differeth from [another] star in glory.

46\_1CO\_15\_42 So also [is] the resurrection of the dead. It is sown in corruption; it is raised in incorruption:

46\_1CO\_15\_43 It is sown in dishonour; it is raised in glory: it is sown in weakness; it is raised in power:

46\_1CO\_15\_44 It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body.

46\_1CO\_15\_45 And so it is written, The first man Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam [was made] a quickening spirit.

46\_1CO\_15\_46 Howbeit that [was] not first which is spiritual, but that which is natural; and afterward that which is spiritual.

46\_1CO\_15\_47 The first man [is] of the earth, earthy: the second man [is] the Lord from heaven.

46\_1CO\_15\_48 As [is] the earthy, such [are] they also that are earthy: and as [is] the heavenly, such [are] they also that are heavenly.

46\_1CO\_15\_49 And as we have borne the image of the earthy, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly.

46\_1CO\_15\_50 Now this I say, brethren, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God; neither doth corruption inherit incorruption.

46\_1CO\_15\_51 Behold, I show you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed,

46\_1CO\_15\_52 In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

46\_1CO\_15\_53 For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal [must] put on immortality.

46\_1CO\_15\_54 So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory.

46\_1CO\_15\_55 O death, where [is] thy sting? O grave, where [is] thy victory?

46\_1CO\_15\_56 The sting of death [is] sin; and the strength of sin [is] the law.

46\_1CO\_15\_57 But thanks [be] to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

46\_1CO\_15\_58 Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.
