

## KJV Bible linked to Three Phrase Concordance

Mamre and he <u>01\_GEN\_18\_01</u> # And the LORD appeared unto him in the plains of Mamre: and he sat in the tent door in the heat of the day;

Mamre in the <u>01\_GEN\_49\_30</u># In the cave that [is] in the field of Machpelah, which [is] before Mamre, in the land of Canaan, which Abraham bought with the field of Ephron the Hittite for a possession of a buryingplace.

Mamre let them <u>01\_GEN\_14\_24</u> # Save only that which the young men have eaten, and the portion of the men which went with me, Aner, Eshcol, and Mamre; let them take their portion.

Mamre the Amorite <u>01\_GEN\_14\_13</u># And there came one that had escaped, and told Abram the Hebrew; for he dwelt in the plain of Mamre the Amorite, brother of Eshcol, and brother of Aner: and these [were] confederate with Abram.

Mamre the field <u>01 GEN 23\_17</u> # And the field of Ephron, which [was] in Machpelah, which [was] before Mamre, the field, and the cave which [was] therein, and all the trees that [were] in the field, that [were] in all the borders round about, were made sure

Mamre the same <u>01\_GEN\_23\_19</u> # And after this, Abraham buried Sarah his wife in the cave of the field of Machpelah before Mamre: the same [is] Hebron in the land of Canaan.

Mamre unto the <u>01\_GEN\_35\_27</u># And Jacob came unto Isaac his father unto Mamre, unto the city of Arbah, which [is] Hebron, where Abraham and Isaac sojourned.

Mamre which is <u>01\_GEN\_13\_18</u># Then Abram removed [his] tent, and came and dwelt in the plain of Mamre, which [is] in Hebron, and built there an altar unto the LORD.

Mamre <u>01\_GEN\_25\_09</u> # And his sons Isaac and Ishmael buried him in the cave of Machpelah, in the field of Ephron the son of Zohar the Hittite, which [is] before Mamre;

Mamre <u>01\_GEN\_50\_13</u># For his sons carried him into the land of Canaan, and buried him in the cave of the field of Machpelah, which Abraham bought with the field for a possession of a buryingplace of Ephron the Hittite, before Mamre.
