Pau and his <u>01\_GEN\_36\_39</u># And Baalhanan the son of Achbor died, and Hadar reigned in his stead: and the name of his city [was] Pau; and his wife's name [was] Mehetabel, the daughter of Matred, the daughter of Mezahab.

Paul a prisoner <u>57\_PHM\_01\_01</u> # Paul, a prisoner of Jesus Christ, and Timothy [our] brother, unto Philemon our dearly beloved, and fellowlabourer,

Paul a servant <u>45\_ROM\_01\_01</u> # Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called [to be] an apostle, separated unto the gospel of God,

Paul a servant <u>56\_TIT\_01\_01</u> # Paul, a servant of God, and an apostle of Jesus Christ, according to the faith of God's elect, and the acknowledging of the truth which is after godliness;

Paul admonished them <u>44\_ACT\_27\_09</u> # Now when much time was spent, and when sailing was now dangerous, because the fast was now already past, Paul admonished [them],

Paul affirmed to <u>44\_ACT\_25\_19</u> # But had certain questions against him of their own superstition, and of one Jesus, which was dead, whom Paul affirmed to be alive.

Paul after that <u>44\_ACT\_24\_10</u># Then Paul, after that the governor had beckoned unto him to speak, answered, Forasmuch as I know that thou hast been of many years a judge unto this nation, I do the more cheerfully answer for myself:

Paul after this 44\_ACT\_18\_18 # And Paul [after this] tarried [there] yet a good while, and then took his leave of the brethren, and sailed thence into Syria, and with him Priscilla and Aquila; having shorn [his] head in Cenchrea: for he had a vow.

Paul Almost thou <u>44\_ACT\_26\_28</u># Then Agrippa said unto Paul, Almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian.

Paul also according 61\_2PE\_03\_15 # And account [that] the longsuffering of our Lord [is] salvation; even as our beloved brother Paul also according to the wisdom given unto him hath written unto you;

Paul also and <u>44\_ACT\_15\_35</u> # Paul also and Barnabas continued in Antioch, teaching and preaching the word of the Lord, with many others also.

Paul also before <u>44\_ACT\_23\_33</u> # Who, when they came to Caesarea, and delivered the epistle to the governor, presented Paul also before him.

Paul am made <u>51\_COL\_01\_23</u> # If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and [be] not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, [and] which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister;

Paul an apostle <u>54\_1TI\_01\_01</u> # Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the commandment of God our Saviour, and Lord Jesus Christ, [which is] our hope;

Paul an apostle <u>47\_2CO\_01\_01</u> # Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Timothy [our] brother, unto the church of God which is at Corinth, with all the saints which are in all Achaia:

Paul an apostle <u>55\_2TI\_01\_01</u># Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, according to the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus,

Paul an apostle <u>51\_COL\_01\_01</u> # Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Timotheus [our] brother,

Paul an apostle 49\_EPH\_01\_01 # Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, to the saints which are at Ephesus, and to the faithful in Christ Jesus:

Paul an apostle <u>48\_GAL\_01\_01</u> # Paul, an apostle, [not of men, neither by man, but by Jesus Christ, and God the Father, who raised him from the dead;]

Paul and another <u>46\_1CO\_03\_04</u># For while one saith, I am of Paul; and another, I [am] of Apollos; are ye not carnal?

Paul and Barnabas <u>44\_ACT\_13\_43</u># Now when the congregation was broken up, many of the Jews and religious proselytes followed Paul and Barnabas: who, speaking to them, persuaded them to continue in the grace of God.

Paul and Barnabas <u>44\_ACT\_13\_46</u># Then Paul and Barnabas waxed bold, and said, It was necessary that the word of God should first have been spoken to you: but seeing ye put it from you, and judge yourselves unworthy of everlasting life, lo, we turn to the Gentiles.

Paul and Barnabas <u>44\_ACT\_13\_50</u># But the Jews stirred up the devout and honourable women, and the chief men of the city, and raised persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them out of their coasts.

Paul and Barnabas <u>44\_ACT\_15\_02</u># When therefore Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and disputation with them, they determined that Paul and Barnabas, and certain other of them, should go up to Jerusalem unto the apostles and elders about this question.

Paul and Barnabas <u>44\_ACT\_15\_02</u> # When therefore Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and disputation with them, they determined that Paul and Barnabas, and certain other of them, should go up to Jerusalem unto the apostles and elders about this question.

Paul and Barnabas <u>44\_ACT\_15\_22</u> # Then pleased it the apostles and elders, with the whole church, to send chosen men of their own company to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; [namely], Judas surnamed Barsabas, and Silas, chief men among the brethren:

Paul and besought 44\_ACT\_25\_02 # Then the high priest and the chief of the Jews informed him against Paul, and besought him,

Paul and brought 44\_ACT\_18\_12 # And when Gallio was the deputy of Achaia, the Jews made insurrection with one accord against Paul, and brought him to the judgment seat,

Paul and brought <u>44\_ACT\_23\_31</u> # Then the soldiers, as it was commanded them, took Paul, and brought [him] by night to Antipatris.

Paul and certain 44\_ACT\_27\_01 # And when it was determined that we should sail into Italy, they delivered Paul and certain other prisoners unto [one] named Julius, a centurion of Augustus' band.

Paul and drew 44\_ACT\_21\_30 # And all the city was moved, and the people ran together: and they took Paul, and drew him out of the temple: and forthwith the doors were shut.

Paul and gave 44\_ACT\_27\_03 # And the next [day] we touched at Sidon. And Julius courteously entreated Paul, and gave [him] liberty to go unto his friends to refresh himself.

Paul and heard 44 ACT 24 24 # And after certain days, when Felix came with his wife Drusilla, which was a Jewess, he sent for Paul, and heard him concerning the faith in Christ.

Paul and his <u>44\_ACT\_13\_13</u># Now when Paul and his company loosed from Paphos, they came to Perga in Pamphylia: and John departing from them returned to Jerusalem.

Paul and I <u>46\_1CO\_01\_12</u> # Now this I say, that every one of you saith, I am of Paul; and I of Apollos; and I of Cephas; and I of Christ.

Paul and said <u>44\_ACT\_25\_09</u> # But Festus, willing to do the Jews a pleasure, answered Paul, and said, Wilt thou go up to Jerusalem, and there be judged of these things before me?

Paul and Silas <u>44\_ACT\_16\_19</u> # And when her masters saw that the hope of their gains was gone, they caught Paul and Silas, and drew [them] into the marketplace unto the rulers,

Paul and Silas <u>44\_ACT\_16\_25</u># And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them.

Paul and Silas <u>44\_ACT\_16\_29</u> # Then he called for a light, and sprang in, and came trembling, and fell down before Paul and Silas,

Paul and Silas <u>44\_ACT\_17\_04</u># And some of them believed, and consorted with Paul and Silas; and of the devout Greeks a great multitude, and of the chief women not a few.

Paul and Silas <u>44\_ACT\_17\_10</u> # And the brethren immediately sent away Paul and Silas by night unto Berea: who coming [thither] went into the synagogue of the Jews.

Paul and Silvanus <u>52\_1TH\_01\_01</u># Paul, and Silvanus, and Timotheus, unto the church of the Thessalonians [which is] in God the Father and [in] the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace [be] unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Paul and Silvanus <u>53\_2TH\_01\_01</u> # Paul, and Silvanus, and Timotheus, unto the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

Paul and Timotheus <u>50\_PHP\_01\_01</u> # Paul and Timotheus, the servants of Jesus Christ, to all the saints in Christ Jesus which are at Philippi, with the bishops and deacons:

Paul and to 44\_ACT\_24\_23 # And he commanded a centurion to keep Paul, and to let [him] have liberty, and that he should forbid none of his acquaintance to minister or come unto him.

Paul and us <u>44\_ACT\_16\_17</u> # The same followed Paul and us, and cried, saying, These men are the servants of the most high God, which show unto us the way of salvation.

Paul and who 46\_1CO\_03\_05 # Who then is Paul, and who [is] Apollos, but ministers by whom ye believed, even as the Lord gave to every man?

Paul answered What 44\_ACT\_21\_13 # Then Paul answered, What mean ye to weep and to break mine heart? for I am ready not to be bound only, but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus.

Paul as his <u>44\_ACT\_17\_02</u> # And Paul, as his manner was, went in unto them, and three sabbath days reasoned with them out of the scriptures,

Paul at Berea <u>44\_ACT\_17\_13</u># But when the Jews of Thessalonica had knowledge that the word of God was preached of Paul at Berea, they came thither also, and stirred up the people.

Paul being grieved <u>44\_ACT\_16\_18</u># And this did she many days. But Paul, being grieved, turned and said to the spirit, I command thee in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her. And he came out the same hour.

Paul besought them <u>44\_ACT\_27\_33</u> # And while the day was coming on, Paul besought [them] all to take meat, saying, This day is the fourteenth day that ye have tarried and continued fasting, having taken nothing.

Paul bound <u>44\_ACT\_24\_27</u> # But after two years Porcius Festus came into Felix' room: and Felix, willing to show the Jews a pleasure, left Paul bound.

Paul brought him <u>44\_ACT\_17\_15</u> # And they that conducted Paul brought him unto Athens: and receiving a commandment unto Silas and Timotheus for to come to him with all speed, they departed.

Paul called one <u>44\_ACT\_23\_17</u># Then Paul called one of the centurions unto [him], and said, Bring this young man unto the chief captain: for he hath a certain thing to tell him.

Paul called the <u>44\_ACT\_28\_17</u> # And it came to pass, that after three days Paul called the chief of the Jews together: and when they were come together, he said unto them, Men [and] brethren, though I have committed nothing against the people, or customs of our fathers, yet was I delivered prisoner from Jerusalem into the hands of the Romans.

Paul called to 46\_1CO\_01\_01 # Paul, called [to be] an apostle of Jesus Christ through the will of God, and Sosthenes [our] brother,

Paul called unto 44\_ACT\_20\_01 # And after the uproar was ceased, Paul called unto [him] the disciples, and embraced [them], and departed for to go into Macedonia.

Paul chose Silas <u>44\_ACT\_15\_40</u> # And Paul chose Silas, and departed, being recommended by the brethren unto the grace of God.

Paul contradicting and <u>44\_ACT\_13\_45</u> # But when the Jews saw the multitudes, they were filled with envy, and spake against those things which were spoken by Paul, contradicting and blaspheming.

Paul cried with <u>44\_ACT\_16\_28</u># But Paul cried with a loud voice, saying, Do thyself no harm: for we are all here.

Paul crucified for <u>46\_1CO\_01\_13</u># Is Christ divided? was Paul crucified for you? or were ye baptized in the name of Paul?

Paul declaring what <u>44\_ACT\_15\_12</u># Then all the multitude kept silence, and gave audience to Barnabas and Paul, declaring what miracles and wonders God had wrought among the Gentiles by them.

Paul departed from 44\_ACT\_17\_33 # So Paul departed from among them.

Paul departed from 44\_ACT\_18\_01 # After these things Paul departed from Athens, and came to Corinth;

Paul down and <u>44\_ACT\_22\_30</u># On the morrow, because he would have known the certainty wherefore he was accused of the Jews, he loosed him from [his] bands, and commanded the chief priests and all their council to appear, and brought Paul down, and set him before them.

Paul drew him 44\_ACT\_14\_19 # And there came thither [certain] Jews from Antioch and Iconium, who

persuaded the people, and, having stoned Paul, drew [him] out of the city, supposing he had been dead.

Paul dwelt two 44\_ACT\_28\_30 # And Paul dwelt two whole years in his own hired house, and received all that came in unto him,

Paul earnestly beholding 44\_ACT\_23\_01 # And Paul, earnestly beholding the council, said, Men [and] brethren, I have lived in all good conscience before God until this day.

Paul entered in 44\_ACT\_28\_08 # And it came to pass, that the father of Publius lay sick of a fever and of a bloody flux: to whom Paul entered in, and prayed, and laid his hands on him, and healed him.

Paul filled with 44\_ACT\_13\_09 # Then Saul, [who also [is called] Paul,] filled with the Holy Ghost, set his eyes on him,

Paul for as <u>44\_ACT\_23\_11</u># And the night following the Lord stood by him, and said, Be of good cheer, Paul: for as thou hast testified of me in Jerusalem, so must thou bear witness also at Rome.

Paul for so 44\_ACT\_20\_13 # And we went before to ship, and sailed unto Assos, there intending to take in Paul: for so had he appointed, minding himself to go afoot.

Paul had appealed 44\_ACT\_25\_21 # But when Paul had appealed to be reserved unto the hearing of Augustus, I commanded him to be kept till I might send him to Caesar.

Paul had brought <u>44\_ACT\_21\_29</u> # [For they had seen before with him in the city Trophimus an Ephesian, whom they supposed that Paul had brought into the temple.]

Paul had determined 44\_ACT\_20\_16 # For Paul had determined to sail by Ephesus, because he would not spend the time in Asia: for he hasted, if it were possible for him, to be at Jerusalem the day of Pentecost.

Paul had done <u>44\_ACT\_14\_11</u># And when the people saw what Paul had done, they lifted up their voices, saying in the speech of Lycaonia, The gods are come down to us in the likeness of men.

Paul had gathered <u>44\_ACT\_28\_03</u> # And when Paul had gathered a bundle of sticks, and laid [them] on the fire, there came a viper out of the heat, and fastened on his hand.

Paul had laid 44\_ACT\_19\_06 # And when Paul had laid [his] hands upon them, the Holy Ghost came on them; and they spake with tongues, and prophesied.

Paul had spoken <u>44\_ACT\_28\_25</u># And when they agreed not among themselves, they departed, after that Paul had spoken one word, Well spake the Holy Ghost by Esaias the prophet unto our fathers,

Paul hath persuaded <u>44\_ACT\_19\_26</u># Moreover ye see and hear, that not alone at Ephesus, but almost throughout all Asia, this Paul hath persuaded and turned away much people, saying that they be no gods, which are made with hands:

Paul have to <u>44\_ACT\_16\_03</u># Him would Paul have to go forth with him; and took and circumcised him because of the Jews which were in those quarters: for they knew all that his father was a Greek.

Paul have written <u>57\_PHM\_01\_19</u> # I Paul have written [it] with mine own hand, I will repay [it]: albeit I do not say to thee how thou owest unto me even thine own self besides.

Paul having passed <u>44\_ACT\_19\_01</u> # And it came to pass, that, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper coasts came to Ephesus: and finding certain disciples,

Paul heard of 44\_ACT\_14\_14 # [Which] when the apostles, Barnabas and Paul, heard [of], they rent their

clothes, and ran in among the people, crying out,

Paul I know <u>44\_ACT\_19\_15</u> # And the evil spirit answered and said, Jesus I know, and Paul I know; but who are ye?

Paul I stand <u>44\_ACT\_25\_10</u># Then said Paul, I stand at Caesar's judgment seat, where I ought to be judged: to the Jews have I done no wrong, as thou very well knowest.

Paul I wist <u>44\_ACT\_23\_05</u># Then said Paul, I wist not, brethren, that he was the high priest: for it is written, Thou shalt not speak evil of the ruler of thy people.

Paul in the <u>44\_ACT\_16\_09</u># And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us.

Paul in the <u>44\_ACT\_18\_09</u># Then spake the Lord to Paul in the night by a vision, Be not afraid, but speak, and hold not thy peace:

Paul John verily 44\_ACT\_19\_04 # Then said Paul, John verily baptized with the baptism of repentance, saying unto the people, that they should believe on him which should come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus.

Paul kept them 44\_ACT\_27\_43 # But the centurion, willing to save Paul, kept them from [their] purpose; and commanded that they which could swim should cast [themselves] first [into the sea], and get to land:

Paul Mercurius because 44\_ACT\_14\_12 # And they called Barnabas, Jupiter; and Paul, Mercurius, because he was the chief speaker.

Paul myself beseech <u>47\_2CO\_10\_01</u> # Now I Paul myself beseech you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ, who in presence [am] base among you, but being absent am bold toward you:

Paul on and 44\_ACT\_23\_24 # And provide [them] beasts, that they may set Paul on, and bring [him] safe unto Felix the governor.

Paul once and <u>52\_1TH\_02\_18</u># Wherefore we would have come unto you, even I Paul, once and again; but Satan hindered us.

Paul or Apollos 46\_1CO\_03\_22 # Whether Paul, or Apollos, or Cephas, or the world, or life, or death, or things present, or things to come; all are yours;

Paul perceived that <u>44\_ACT\_23\_06</u># But when Paul perceived that the one part were Sadducees, and the other Pharisees, he cried out in the council, Men [and] brethren, I am a Pharisee, the son of a Pharisee: of the hope and resurrection of the dead I am called in question.

Paul preached unto 44\_ACT\_20\_07 # And upon the first [day] of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight.

Paul preacheth <u>44\_ACT\_19\_13</u> # Then certain of the vagabond Jews, exorcists, took upon them to call over them which had evil spirits the name of the Lord Jesus, saying, We adjure you by Jesus whom Paul preacheth.

Paul purposed in <u>44\_ACT\_19\_21</u># After these things were ended, Paul purposed in the spirit, when he had passed through Macedonia and Achaia, to go to Jerusalem, saying, After I have been there, I must also see Rome.

Paul Remember my <u>51\_COL\_04\_18</u># The salutation by the hand of me Paul. Remember my bonds. Grace [be] with you. Amen.

Paul said But 44\_ACT\_22\_28 # And the chief captain answered, With a great sum obtained I this freedom. And Paul said, But I was [free] born.

Paul said I <u>44\_ACT\_21\_39</u> # But Paul said, I am a man [which am] a Jew of Tarsus, [a city] in Cilicia, a citizen of no mean city: and, I beseech thee, suffer me to speak unto the people.

Paul said I <u>44\_ACT\_26\_29</u> # And Paul said, I would to God, that not only thou, but also all that hear me this day, were both almost, and altogether such as I am, except these bonds.

Paul said to <u>44\_ACT\_27\_31</u># Paul said to the centurion and to the soldiers, Except these abide in the ship, ye cannot be saved.

Paul said unto 44\_ACT\_15\_36 # And some days after Paul said unto Barnabas, Let us go again and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, [and see] how they do.

Paul said unto 44\_ACT\_16\_37 # But Paul said unto them, They have beaten us openly uncondemned, being Romans, and have cast [us] into prison; and now do they thrust us out privily? nay verily; but let them come themselves and fetch us out.

Paul said unto 44\_ACT\_22\_25 # And as they bound him with thongs, Paul said unto the centurion that stood by, Is it lawful for you to scourge a man that is a Roman, and uncondemned?

Paul saw he <u>44\_ACT\_28\_15</u> # And from thence, when the brethren heard of us, they came to meet us as far as Appii forum, and The three taverns: whom when Paul saw, he thanked God, and took courage.

Paul say unto <u>48\_GAL\_05\_02</u># Behold, I Paul say unto you, that if ye be circumcised, Christ shall profit you nothing.

Paul should be <u>44\_ACT\_25\_04</u> # But Festus answered, that Paul should be kept at Caesarea, and that he himself would depart shortly [thither].

Paul should have <u>44\_ACT\_23\_10</u># And when there arose a great dissension, the chief captain, fearing lest Paul should have been pulled in pieces of them, commanded the soldiers to go down, and to take him by force from among them, and to bring [him] into the castle.

Paul speak who 44\_ACT\_14\_09 # The same heard Paul speak: who stedfastly beholding him, and perceiving that he had faith to be healed,

Paul stood forth <u>44\_ACT\_27\_21</u># But after long abstinence Paul stood forth in the midst of them, and said, Sirs, ye should have hearkened unto me, and not have loosed from Crete, and to have gained this harm and loss.

Paul stood in <u>44\_ACT\_17\_22</u> # Then Paul stood in the midst of Mars' hill, and said, [Ye] men of Athens, I perceive that in all things ye are too superstitious.

Paul stood on <u>44\_ACT\_21\_40</u> # And when he had given him licence, Paul stood on the stairs, and beckoned with the hand unto the people. And when there was made a great silence, he spake unto [them] in the Hebrew tongue, saying,

Paul stood up <u>44\_ACT\_13\_16</u> # Then Paul stood up, and beckoning with [his] hand said, Men of Israel, and ye that fear God, give audience.

Paul stretched forth <u>44\_ACT\_26\_01</u># Then Agrippa said unto Paul, Thou art permitted to speak for thyself. Then Paul stretched forth the hand, and answered for himself:

Paul that he <u>44\_ACT\_24\_26</u># He hoped also that money should have been given him of Paul, that he might loose him: wherefore he sent for him the oftener, and communed with him.

Paul the aged <u>57\_PHM\_01\_09</u># Yet for love's sake I rather beseech [thee], being such an one as Paul the aged, and now also a prisoner of Jesus Christ.

Paul The magistrates <u>44\_ACT\_16\_36</u># And the keeper of the prison told this saying to Paul, The magistrates have sent to let you go: now therefore depart, and go in peace.

Paul the prisoner <u>44\_ACT\_23\_18</u> # So he took him, and brought [him] to the chief captain, and said, Paul the prisoner called me unto [him], and prayed me to bring this young man unto thee, who hath something to say unto thee.

Paul the prisoner 49\_EPH\_03\_01 # For this cause I Paul, the prisoner of Jesus Christ for you Gentiles,

Paul Thou art <u>44\_ACT\_26\_01</u># Then Agrippa said unto Paul, Thou art permitted to speak for thyself. Then Paul stretched forth the hand, and answered for himself:

Paul thou art 44\_ACT\_26\_24 # And as he thus spake for himself, Festus said with a loud voice, Paul, thou art beside thyself; much learning doth make thee mad.

Paul thou must <u>44\_ACT\_27\_24</u># Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee.

Paul thought not <u>44\_ACT\_15\_38</u> # But Paul thought not good to take him with them, who departed from them from Pamphylia, and went not with them to the work.

Paul through the <u>44\_ACT\_21\_04</u> # And finding disciples, we tarried there seven days: who said to Paul through the Spirit, that he should not go up to Jerusalem.

Paul to be <u>44\_ACT\_25\_06</u># And when he had tarried among them more than ten days, he went down unto Caesarea; and the next day sitting on the judgment seat commanded Paul to be brought.

Paul to go <u>44\_ACT\_17\_14</u> # And then immediately the brethren sent away Paul to go as it were to the sea: but Silas and Timotheus abode there still.

Paul to morrow 44\_ACT\_23\_20 # And he said, The Jews have agreed to desire thee that thou wouldest bring down Paul to morrow into the council, as though they would inquire somewhat of him more perfectly.

Paul took the <u>44\_ACT\_21\_26</u># Then Paul took the men, and the next day purifying himself with them entered into the temple, to signify the accomplishment of the days of purification, until that an offering should be offered for every one of them.

Paul unto him 44\_ACT\_23\_03 # Then said Paul unto him, God shall smite thee, [thou] whited wall: for sittest thou to judge me after the law, and commandest me to be smitten contrary to the law?

Paul waited for 44\_ACT\_17\_16 # Now while Paul waited for them at Athens, his spirit was stirred in him, when he saw the city wholly given to idolatry.

Paul was brought <u>44\_ACT\_25\_23</u># And on the morrow, when Agrippa was come, and Bernice, with great pomp, and was entered into the place of hearing, with the chief captains, and principal men of the city, at Festus' commandment Paul was brought forth.

Paul was long <u>44\_ACT\_20\_09</u> # And there sat in a window a certain young man named Eutychus, being fallen into a deep sleep: and as Paul was long preaching, he sunk down with sleep, and fell down from the third loft, and was taken up dead.

Paul was now 44 ACT 18 14 # And when Paul was now about to open [his] mouth, Gallio said unto the Jews, If it were a matter of wrong or wicked lewdness, O [ye] Jews, reason would that I should bear with you:

Paul was pressed <u>44\_ACT\_18\_05</u> # And when Silas and Timotheus were come from Macedonia, Paul was pressed in the spirit, and testified to the Jews [that] Jesus [was] Christ.

Paul was suffered 44\_ACT\_28\_16 # And when we came to Rome, the centurion delivered the prisoners to the captain of the guard: but Paul was suffered to dwell by himself with a soldier that kept him.

Paul was to 44\_ACT\_21\_37 # And as Paul was to be led into the castle, he said unto the chief captain, May I speak unto thee? Who said, Canst thou speak Greek?

Paul went down <u>44\_ACT\_20\_10</u> # And Paul went down, and fell on him, and embracing [him] said, Trouble not yourselves; for his life is in him.

Paul went in 44\_ACT\_21\_18 # And the [day] following Paul went in with us unto James; and all the elders were present.

Paul which they <u>44\_ACT\_25\_07</u># And when he was come, the Jews which came down from Jerusalem stood round about, and laid many and grievous complaints against Paul, which they could not prove.

Paul with mine 46\_1CO\_16\_21 # The salutation of [me] Paul with mine own hand.

Paul with mine <u>53\_2TH\_03\_17</u># The salutation of Paul with mine own hand, which is the token in every epistle: so I write.

Paul would have <u>44\_ACT\_19\_30</u># And when Paul would have entered in unto the people, the disciples suffered him not.

Paul <u>46\_1CO\_01\_13</u> # Is Christ divided? was Paul crucified for you? or were ye baptized in the name of Paul?

Paul <u>44\_ACT\_15\_25</u># It seemed good unto us, being assembled with one accord, to send chosen men unto you with our beloved Barnabas and Paul,

Paul <u>44\_ACT\_16\_14</u> # And a certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard [us]: whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul.

Paul 44\_ACT\_19\_11 # And God wrought special miracles by the hands of Paul:

Paul <u>44\_ACT\_21\_32</u> # Who immediately took soldiers and centurions, and ran down unto them: and when they saw the chief captain and the soldiers, they left beating of Paul.

Paul <u>44\_ACT\_23\_12</u> # And when it was day, certain of the Jews banded together, and bound themselves under a curse, saying that they would neither eat nor drink till they had killed Paul.

Paul <u>44\_ACT\_23\_14</u> # And they came to the chief priests and elders, and said, We have bound ourselves under a great curse, that we will eat nothing until we have slain Paul.

Paul <u>44\_ACT\_23\_16</u> # And when Paul's sister's son heard of their lying in wait, he went and entered into the castle, and told Paul.

Paul <u>44\_ACT\_24\_01</u> # And after five days Ananias the high priest descended with the elders, and [with] a certain orator [named] Tertullus, who informed the governor against Paul.

Paul <u>44\_ACT\_27\_11</u># Nevertheless the centurion believed the master and the owner of the ship, more than those things which were spoken by Paul.

Paul's cause unto 44\_ACT\_25\_14 # And when they had been there many days, Festus declared Paul's cause unto the king, saying, There is a certain man left in bonds by Felix:

Paul's companions in <u>44\_ACT\_19\_29</u># And the whole city was filled with confusion: and having caught Gaius and Aristarchus, men of Macedonia, Paul's companions in travel, they rushed with one accord into the theatre.

Paul's company departed <u>44\_ACT\_21\_08</u># And the next [day] we that were of Paul's company departed, and came unto Caesarea: and we entered into the house of Philip the evangelist, which was [one] of the seven; and abode with him.

Paul's girdle and 44 ACT 21 11 # And when he was come unto us, he took Paul's girdle, and bound his own hands and feet, and said, Thus saith the Holy Ghost, So shall the Jews at Jerusalem bind the man that owneth this girdle, and shall deliver [him] into the hands of the Gentiles.

Paul's neck and 44\_ACT\_20\_37 # And they all wept sore, and fell on Paul's neck, and kissed him,

Paul's sister's son 44\_ACT\_23\_16 # And when Paul's sister's son heard of their lying in wait, he went and entered into the castle, and told Paul.

Paulus a prudent <u>44\_ACT\_13\_07</u># Which was with the deputy of the country, Sergius Paulus, a prudent man; who called for Barnabas and Saul, and desired to hear the word of God.
