mainsail to the [44 ACT 27 40](#) # And when they had taken up the anchors, they committed [themselves] unto the sea, and loosed the rudder bands, and hoisted up the mainsail to the wind, and made toward shore.

sail and so [44 ACT 27 17](#) # Which when they had taken up, they used helps, undergirding the ship; and, fearing lest they should fall into the quicksands, struck sail, and so were driven.

sail blue and [26 EZE 27 07](#) # Fine linen with brodered work from Egypt was that which thou spreadest forth to be thy sail; blue and purple from the isles of Elishah was that which covered thee.

sail by Ephesus [44 ACT 20 16](#) # For Paul had determined to sail by Ephesus, because he would not spend the time in Asia: for he hasted, if it were possible for him, to be at Jerusalem the day of Pentecost.

sail by the [44 ACT 27 02](#) # And entering into a ship of Adramyttium, we launched, meaning to sail by the coasts of Asia; [one] Aristarchus, a Macedonian of Thessalonica, being with us.

sail into Italy [44 ACT 27 01](#) # And when it was determined that we should sail into Italy, they delivered Paul and certain other prisoners unto [one] named Julius, a centurion of Augustus' band.

sail into Syria [44 ACT 20 03](#) # And [there] abode three months. And when the Jews laid wait for him, as he was about to sail into Syria, he purposed to return through Macedonia.

sail then is [23 ISA 33 23](#) # Thy tacklings are loosed; they could not well strengthen their mast, they could not spread the sail: then is the prey of a great spoil divided; the lame take the prey.

sail with thee [44 ACT 27 24](#) # Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee.

sailed away from [44 ACT 20 06](#) # And we sailed away from Philippi after the days of unleavened bread, and came unto them to Troas in five days; where we abode seven days.

sailed close by [44 ACT 27 13](#) # And when the south wind blew softly, supposing that they had obtained [their] purpose, loosing [thence], they sailed close by Crete.

sailed from Ephesus [44 ACT 18 21](#) # But bade them farewell, saying, I must by all means keep this feast that cometh in Jerusalem: but I will return again unto you, if God will. And he sailed from Ephesus.

sailed he fell [42 LUK 08 23](#) # But as they sailed he fell asleep: and there came down a storm of wind on the lake; and they were filled [with water], and were in jeopardy.

sailed into Syria [44 ACT 21 03](#) # Now when we had discovered Cyprus, we left it on the left hand, and sailed into Syria, and landed at Tyre: for there the ship was to unlade her burden.

sailed over the [44 ACT 27 05](#) # And when we had sailed over the sea of Cilicia and Pamphylia, we came to Myra, [a city] of Lycia.

sailed slowly many [44 ACT 27 07](#) # And when we had sailed slowly many days, and scarce were come over against Cnidus, the wind not suffering us, we sailed under Crete, over against Salmone;

sailed thence and [44 ACT 20 15](#) # And we sailed thence, and came the next [day] over against Chios; and the next [day] we arrived at Samos, and tarried at Trogyllium; and the next [day] we came to Miletus.

sailed thence into [44 ACT 18 18](#) # And Paul [after this] tarried [there] yet a good while, and then took his leave of the brethren, and sailed thence into Syria, and with him Priscilla and Aquila; having shorn [his] head in Cenchrea: for he had a vow.

sailed to Antioch [44 ACT 14 26](#) # And thence sailed to Antioch, from whence they had been recommended to the grace of God for the work which they fulfilled.

sailed to Cyprus [44 ACT 13 04](#) # So they, being sent forth by the Holy Ghost, departed unto Seleucia; and from thence they sailed to Cyprus.

sailed under Crete [44 ACT 27 07](#) # And when we had sailed slowly many days, and scarce were come over against Cnidus, the wind not suffering us, we sailed under Crete, over against Salmone;

sailed under Cyprus [44 ACT 27 04](#) # And when we had launched from thence, we sailed under Cyprus, because the winds were contrary.

sailed unto Assos [44 ACT 20 13](#) # And we went before to ship, and sailed unto Assos, there intending to take in Paul: for so had he appointed, minding himself to go afoot.

sailed unto Cyprus [44 ACT 15 39](#) # And the contention was so sharp between them, that they departed asunder one from the other: and so Barnabas took Mark, and sailed unto Cyprus;

sailing into Italy [44 ACT 27 06](#) # And there the centurion found a ship of Alexandria sailing into Italy; and he put us therein.

sailing over unto [44 ACT 21 02](#) # And finding a ship sailing over unto Phenicia, we went aboard, and set forth.

sailing was now [44 ACT 27 09](#) # Now when much time was spent, and when sailing was now dangerous, because the fast was now already past, Paul admonished [them],

sailors and as [66 REV 18 17](#) # For in one hour so great riches is come to nought. And every shipmaster, and all the company in ships, and sailors, and as many as trade by sea, stood afar off,
