sack and their <u>01\_GEN\_42\_28</u># And he said unto his brethren, My money is restored; and, lo, [it is] even in my sack: and their heart failed [them], and they were afraid, saying one to another, What [is] this [that] God hath done unto us?

sack and to <u>01\_GEN\_42\_25</u># Then Joseph commanded to fill their sacks with corn, and to restore every man's money into his sack, and to give them provision for the way: and thus did he unto them.

sack and when <u>01\_GEN\_42\_35</u># And it came to pass as they emptied their sacks, that, behold, every man's bundle of money [was] in his sack: and when [both] they and their father saw the bundles of money, they were afraid.

sack our money <u>01\_GEN\_43\_21</u># And it came to pass, when we came to the inn, that we opened our sacks, and, behold, [every] man's money [was] in the mouth of his sack, our money in full weight: and we have brought it again in our hand.

sack to give <u>01\_GEN\_42\_27</u># And as one of them opened his sack to give his ass provender in the inn, he espied his money; for, behold, it [was] in his sack's mouth.

sack to the <u>01\_GEN\_44\_11</u># Then they speedily took down every man his sack to the ground, and opened every man his sack.

sack whatsoever vessel <u>03\_LEV\_11\_32</u># And upon whatsoever [any] of them, when they are dead, doth fall, it shall be unclean; whether [it be] any vessel of wood, or raiment, or skin, or sack, whatsoever vessel [it be], wherein [any] work is done, it must be put into water, and it shall be unclean until the even; so it shall be cleansed.

sack <u>01\_GEN\_44\_11</u># Then they speedily took down every man his sack to the ground, and opened every man his sack.

sack <u>01\_GEN\_44\_12</u># And he searched, [and] began at the eldest, and left at the youngest: and the cup was found in Benjamin's sack.

sack's mouth of <u>01\_GEN\_44\_02</u># And put my cup, the silver cup, in the sack's mouth of the youngest, and his corn money. And he did according to the word that Joseph had spoken.

sack's mouth <u>01\_GEN\_42\_27</u># And as one of them opened his sack to give his ass provender in the inn, he espied his money; for, behold, it [was] in his sack's mouth.

sackcloth and ashes <u>27\_DAN\_09\_03</u> # And I set my face unto the Lord God, to seek by prayer and supplications, with fasting, and sackcloth, and ashes:

sackcloth and ashes <u>17\_EST\_04\_03</u># And in every province, whithersoever the king's commandment and his decree came, [there was] great mourning among the Jews, and fasting, and weeping, and wailing; and many lay in sackcloth and ashes.

sackcloth and ashes <u>23\_ISA\_58\_05</u># Is it such a fast that I have chosen? a day for a man to afflict his soul? [is it] to bow down his head as a bulrush, and to spread sackcloth and ashes [under him]? wilt thou call this a fast, and an acceptable day to the LORD?

sackcloth and ashes <u>40\_MAT\_11\_21</u># Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works, which were done in you, had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes.

sackcloth and burning 23\_ISA\_03\_24 # And it shall come to pass, [that] instead of sweet smell there shall be stink; and instead of a girdle a rent; and instead of well set hair baldness; and instead of a stomacher a girding of sackcloth; [and] burning instead of beauty.

sackcloth and cry 32\_JON\_03\_08 # But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily unto God: yea, let them turn every one from his evil way, and from the violence that [is] in their hands.

sackcloth and girded 19\_PSA\_30\_11# Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing: thou hast put off my sackcloth, and girded me with gladness;

sackcloth and horror <u>26\_EZE\_07\_18</u># They shall also gird [themselves] with sackcloth, and horror shall cover them; and shame [shall be] upon all faces, and baldness upon all their heads.

sackcloth and mourn <u>10\_2SA\_03\_31</u> # And David said to Joab, and to all the people that [were] with him, Rend your clothes, and gird you with sackcloth, and mourn before Abner. And king David [himself] followed the bier.

sackcloth and wallow 24\_JER\_06\_26 # O daughter of my people, gird [thee] with sackcloth, and wallow thyself in ashes: make thee mourning, [as for] an only son, most bitter lamentation: for the spoiler shall suddenly come upon us.

sackcloth and went 11 1KI 21 27 # And it came to pass, when Ahab heard those words, that he rent his clothes, and put sackcloth upon his flesh, and fasted, and lay in sackcloth, and went softly.

sackcloth and went 12 2KI 19 01 # And it came to pass, when king Hezekiah heard [it], that he rent his clothes, and covered himself with sackcloth, and went into the house of the LORD.

sackcloth from him <u>17\_EST\_04\_04</u># So Esther's maids and her chamberlains came and told [it] her. Then was the queen exceedingly grieved; and she sent raiment to clothe Mordecai, and to take away his sackcloth from him: but he received [it] not.

sackcloth from off <u>23\_ISA\_20\_02</u># At the same time spake the LORD by Isaiah the son of Amoz, saying, Go and loose the sackcloth from off thy loins, and put off thy shoe from thy foot. And he did so, walking naked and barefoot.

sackcloth from the <u>32\_JON\_03\_05</u># So the people of Nineveh believed God, and proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them even to the least of them.

sackcloth of hair <u>66\_REV\_06\_12</u> # And I beheld when he had opened the sixth seal, and, lo, there was a great earthquake; and the sun became black as sackcloth of hair, and the moon became as blood;

sackcloth on our <u>11\_1KI\_20\_31</u># And his servants said unto him, Behold now, we have heard that the kings of the house of Israel [are] merciful kings: let us, I pray thee, put sackcloth on our loins, and ropes upon our heads, and go out to the king of Israel: peradventure he will save thy life.

sackcloth upon all <u>30\_AMO\_08\_10</u># And I will turn your feasts into mourning, and all your songs into lamentation; and I will bring up sackcloth upon all loins, and baldness upon every head; and I will make it as the mourning of an only [son], and the end thereof as a bitter day.

sackcloth upon his 11\_1KI\_21\_27# And it came to pass, when Ahab heard those words, that he rent his clothes, and put sackcloth upon his flesh, and fasted, and lay in sackcloth, and went softly.

sackcloth with ashes <u>17\_EST\_04\_01</u># When Mordecai perceived all that was done, Mordecai rent his clothes, and put on sackcloth with ashes, and went out into the midst of the city, and cried with a loud and a bitter cry;

sackcloth within upon 12\_2KI\_06\_30\_# And it came to pass, when the king heard the words of the woman, that he rent his clothes; and he passed by upon the wall, and the people looked, and, behold, [he had] sackcloth within upon his flesh.

sackcloth ye ministers <u>29\_JOE\_01\_13</u> # Gird yourselves, and lament, ye priests: howl, ye ministers of the altar: come, lie all night in sackcloth, ye ministers of my God: for the meat offering and the drink offering is withholden from the house of your God.

sacks with corn <u>01\_GEN\_42\_25</u> # Then Joseph commanded to fill their sacks with corn, and to restore every man's money into his sack, and to give them provision for the way: and thus did he unto them.

sacks with food <u>01\_GEN\_44\_01</u># And he commanded the steward of his house, saying, Fill the men's sacks [with] food, as much as they can carry, and put every man's money in his sack's mouth.
