accuse any falsely <u>42\_LUK\_03\_14</u># And the soldiers likewise demanded of him, saying, And what shall we do? And he said unto them, Do violence to no man, neither accuse [any] falsely; and be content with your wages.

accuse him But <u>43\_JOH\_08\_06</u> # This they said, tempting him, that they might have to accuse him. But Jesus stooped down, and with [his] finger wrote on the ground, [as though he heard them not].

accuse him saying <u>44\_ACT\_24\_02</u> # And when he was called forth, Tertullus began to accuse [him], saying, Seeing that by thee we enjoy great quietness, and that very worthy deeds are done unto this nation by thy providence,

accuse him saying <u>42\_LUK\_23\_02</u> # And they began to accuse him, saying, We found this [fellow] perverting the nation, and forbidding to give tribute to Caesar, saying that he himself is Christ a King.

accuse him <u>44\_ACT\_24\_08</u># Commanding his accusers to come unto thee: by examining of whom thyself mayest take knowledge of all these things, whereof we accuse him.

accuse him <u>42\_LUK\_11\_54</u># Laying wait for him, and seeking to catch something out of his mouth, that they might accuse him.

accuse him <u>42\_LUK\_23\_14</u># Said unto them, Ye have brought this man unto me, as one that perverteth the people: and, behold, I, having examined [him] before you, have found no fault in this man touching those things whereof ye accuse him:

accuse him <u>41\_MAR\_03\_02</u> # And they watched him, whether he would heal him on the sabbath day; that they might accuse him.

accuse him <u>40\_MAT\_12\_10</u># And, behold, there was a man which had [his] hand withered. And they asked him, saying, Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath days? that they might accuse him.

accuse me no <u>44\_ACT\_25\_11</u># For if I be an offender, or have committed any thing worthy of death, I refuse not to die: but if there be none of these things whereof these accuse me, no man may deliver me unto them. I appeal unto Caesar.

accuse me 44\_ACT\_24\_13 # Neither can they prove the things whereof they now accuse me.

accuse my nation 44\_ACT\_28\_19 # But when the Jews spake against [it], I was constrained to appeal unto Caesar; not that I had ought to accuse my nation of.

Accuse not a <u>20\_PRO\_30\_10</u> # Accuse not a servant unto his master, lest he curse thee, and thou be found guilty.

accuse this man <u>44\_ACT\_25\_05</u># Let them therefore, said he, which among you are able, go down with [me], and accuse this man, if there be any wickedness in him.

accuse you to <u>43\_JOH\_05\_45</u># Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father: there is [one] that accuseth you, [even] Moses, in whom ye trust.

accuse your good <u>60\_1PE\_03\_16</u># Having a good conscience; that, whereas they speak evil of you, as of evildoers, they may be ashamed that falsely accuse your good conversation in Christ.

accused Daniel and <u>27\_DAN\_06\_24</u># And the king commanded, and they brought those men which had accused Daniel, and they cast [them] into the den of lions, them, their children, and their wives; and the lions had the mastery of them, and brake all their bones in pieces or ever they came at the bottom of the den.

accused have the <u>44\_ACT\_25\_16</u># To whom I answered, It is not the manner of the Romans to deliver any man to die, before that he which is accused have the accusers face to face, and have licence to answer for himself concerning the crime laid against him.

accused him I <u>44\_ACT\_23\_28</u> # And when I would have known the cause wherefore they accused him, I brought him forth into their council:

accused him of <u>41\_MAR\_15\_03</u># And the chief priests accused him of many things: but he answered nothing.

accused him 42\_LUK\_23\_10 # And the chief priests and scribes stood and vehemently accused him.

accused of questions <u>44\_ACT\_23\_29</u> # Whom I perceived to be accused of questions of their law, but to have nothing laid to his charge worthy of death or of bonds.

accused of riot <u>56\_TIT\_01\_06</u># If any be blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of riot or unruly.

accused of the <u>44\_ACT\_22\_30</u> # On the morrow, because he would have known the certainty wherefore he was accused of the Jews, he loosed him from [his] bands, and commanded the chief priests and all their council to appear, and brought Paul down, and set him before them.

accused of the <u>44\_ACT\_26\_02</u># I think myself happy, king Agrippa, because I shall answer for myself this day before thee touching all the things whereof I am accused of the Jews:

accused of the <u>44\_ACT\_26\_07</u># Unto which [promise] our twelve tribes, instantly serving [God] day and night, hope to come. For which hope's sake, king Agrippa, I am accused of the Jews.

accused of the <u>40\_MAT\_27\_12</u># And when he was accused of the chief priests and elders, he answered nothing.

accused the Jews <u>27\_DAN\_03\_08</u># Wherefore at that time certain Chaldeans came near, and accused the Jews.

accused them before <u>66\_REV\_12\_10</u># And I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, Now is come salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of his Christ: for the accuser of our brethren is cast down, which accused them before our God day and night.

accused unto him <u>42\_LUK\_16\_01</u># And he said also unto his disciples, There was a certain rich man, which had a steward; and the same was accused unto him that he had wasted his goods.

accuser of our <u>66\_REV\_12\_10</u># And I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, Now is come salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of his Christ: for the accuser of our brethren is cast down, which accused them before our God day and night.

accusers also to 44\_ACT\_23\_30 # And when it was told me how that the Jews laid wait for the man, I sent straightway to thee, and gave commandment to his accusers also to say before thee what [they had] against

accusers hath no <u>43\_JOH\_08\_10</u> # When Jesus had lifted up himself, and saw none but the woman, he said unto her, Woman, where are those thine accusers? hath no man condemned thee?

accusers incontinent fierce <u>55\_2TI\_03\_03</u> # Without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good,

accusers not given <u>56\_TIT\_02\_03</u> # The aged women likewise, that [they be] in behaviour as becometh holiness, not false accusers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things;

accusers stood up <u>44\_ACT\_25\_18</u> # Against whom when the accusers stood up, they brought none accusation of such things as I supposed:

accusers to come <u>44\_ACT\_24\_08</u> # Commanding his accusers to come unto thee: by examining of whom thyself mayest take knowledge of all these things, whereof we accuse him.

accuseth you even <u>43\_JOH\_05\_45</u> # Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father: there is [one] that accuseth you, [even] Moses, in whom ye trust.
