

## KJV Bible linked to Three Phrase Concordance

Coniah a despised 24\_JER\_22\_28 # [Is] this man Coniah a despised broken idol? [is he] a vessel wherein [is] no pleasure? wherefore are they cast out, he and his seed, and are cast into a land which they know not?

Coniah the son 24 JER 22 24 # [As] I live, saith the LORD, though Coniah the son of Jehoiakim king of Judah were the signet upon my right hand, yet would I pluck thee thence;

Coniah the son 24 JER 37 01 # And king Zedekiah the son of Josiah reigned instead of Coniah the son of Jehoiakim, whom Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon made king in the land of Judah.

Jeconiah Assir Salathiel 13\_1CH\_03\_17 # And the sons of Jeconiah; Assir, Salathiel his son,

Jeconiah his son 13\_1CH\_03\_16 # And the sons of Jehoiakim: Jeconiah his son, Zedekiah his son.

Jeconiah king of <u>17\_EST\_02\_06</u># Who had been carried away from Jerusalem with the captivity which had been carried away with Jeconiah king of Judah, whom Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon had carried away.

Jeconiah the king 24\_JER\_29\_02 # [After that Jeconiah the king, and the queen, and the eunuchs, the princes of Judah and Jerusalem, and the carpenters, and the smiths, were departed from Jerusalem;]

Jeconiah the son 24\_JER\_24\_01 # The LORD showed me, and, behold, two baskets of figs [were] set before the temple of the LORD, after that Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon had carried away captive Jeconiah the son of Jehoiakim king of Judah, and the princes of Judah, with the carpenters and smiths, from Jerusalem, and had brought them to Babylon.

Jeconiah the son <u>24\_JER\_27\_20</u> # Which Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon took not, when he carried away captive Jeconiah the son of Jehoiakim king of Judah from Jerusalem to Babylon, and all the nobles of Judah and Jerusalem;

Jeconiah the son 24\_JER\_28\_04 # And I will bring again to this place Jeconiah the son of Jehoiakim king of Judah, with all the captives of Judah, that went into Babylon, saith the LORD: for I will break the yoke of the king of Babylon.
