Aroer and her <u>07_JUD_11_26</u># While Israel dwelt in Heshbon and her towns, and in Aroer and her towns, and in all the cities that [be] along by the coasts of Arnon, three hundred years? why therefore did ye not recover [them] within that time?

Aroer and to <u>09_1SA_30_28</u> # And to [them] which [were] in Aroer, and to [them] which [were] in Siphmoth, and to [them] which [were] in Eshtemoa,

Aroer are forsaken 23 ISA 17 02 # The cities of Aroer [are] forsaken: they shall be for flocks, which shall lie down, and none shall make [them] afraid.

Aroer even till <u>07_JUD_11_33</u># And he smote them from Aroer, even till thou come to Minnith, [even] twenty cities, and unto the plain of the vineyards, with a very great slaughter. Thus the children of Ammon were subdued before the children of Israel.

Aroer even unto <u>13_1CH_05_08</u># And Bela the son of Azaz, the son of Shema, the son of Joel, who dwelt in Aroer, even unto Nebo and Baalmeon:

Aroer on the <u>10_2SA_24_05</u> # And they passed over Jordan, and pitched in Aroer, on the right side of the city that [lieth] in the midst of the river of Gad, and toward Jazer:

Aroer stand by <u>24_JER_48_19</u> # O inhabitant of Aroer, stand by the way, and espy; ask him that fleeth, and her that escapeth, [and] say, What is done?

Aroer that is <u>06_JOS_13_09</u> # From Aroer, that [is] upon the bank of the river Arnon, and the city that [is] in the midst of the river, and all the plain of Medeba unto Dibon;

Aroer that is <u>06_JOS_13_16</u># And their coast was from Aroer, that [is] on the bank of the river Arnon, and the city that [is] in the midst of the river, and all the plain by Medeba;

Aroer that is <u>06_JOS_13_25</u> # And their coast was Jazer, and all the cities of Gilead, and half the land of the children of Ammon, unto Aroer that [is] before Rabbah;

Aroer which is <u>12_2KI_10_33</u># From Jordan eastward, all the land of Gilead, the Gadites, and the Reubenites, and the Manassites, from Aroer, which [is] by the river Arnon, even Gilead and Bashan.

Aroer which is <u>05_DEU_02_36</u># From Aroer, which [is] by the brink of the river of Arnon, and [from] the city that [is] by the river, even unto Gilead, there was not one city too strong for us: the LORD our God delivered all unto us:

Aroer which is <u>05_DEU_03_12</u> # And this land, [which] we possessed at that time, from Aroer, which [is] by the river Arnon, and half mount Gilead, and the cities thereof, gave I unto the Reubenites and to the Gadites.

Aroer which is <u>05_DEU_04_48</u># From Aroer, which [is] by the bank of the river Arnon, even unto mount Sion, which [is] Hermon,

Aroer which is <u>06_JOS_12_02</u># Sihon king of the Amorites, who dwelt in Heshbon, [and] ruled from Aroer, which [is] upon the bank of the river Arnon, and from the middle of the river, and from half Gilead,

even unto the river Jabbok, [which is] the border of the children of Ammon;

Aroer <u>04_NUM_32_34</u># And the children of Gad built Dibon, and Ataroth, and Aroer,

Aroerite <u>13_1CH_11_44</u> # Uzzia the Ashterathite, Shama and Jehiel the sons of Hothan the Aroerite,

Haroeh and half <u>13_1CH_02_52</u> # And Shobal the father of Kirjathjearim had sons; Haroeh, [and] half of the Manahethites.

roe and as <u>23_ISA_13_14</u> # And it shall be as the chased roe, and as a sheep that no man taketh up: they shall every man turn to his own people, and flee every one into his own land.

roe from the <u>20_PRO_06_05</u># Deliver thyself as a roe from the hand [of the hunter], and as a bird from the hand of the fowler.

roe let her <u>20_PRO_05_19</u> # [Let her be as] the loving hind and pleasant roe; let her breasts satisfy thee at all times; and be thou ravished always with her love.

roe or a <u>22_SON_02_09</u># My beloved is like a roe or a young hart: behold, he standeth behind our wall, he looketh forth at the windows, showing himself through the lattice.

roe or a <u>22_SON_02_17</u># Until the day break, and the shadows flee away, turn, my beloved, and be thou like a roe or a young hart upon the mountains of Bether.

roe or to <u>22_SON_08_14</u> # Make haste, my beloved, and be thou like to a roe or to a young hart upon the mountains of spices.

roe <u>10_2SA_02_18</u># And there were three sons of Zeruiah there, Joab, and Abishai, and Asahel: and Asahel [was as] light of foot as a wild roe.

roebuck and as <u>05_DEU_12_15</u> # Notwithstanding thou mayest kill and eat flesh in all thy gates, whatsoever thy soul lusteth after, according to the blessing of the LORD thy God which he hath given thee: the unclean and the clean may eat thereof, as of the roebuck, and as of the hart.

roebuck and as <u>05_DEU_15_22</u> # Thou shalt eat it within thy gates: the unclean and the clean [person shall eat it] alike, as the roebuck, and as the hart.

roebuck and the <u>05_DEU_12_22</u># Even as the roebuck and the hart is eaten, so thou shalt eat them: the unclean and the clean shall eat [of] them alike.

roebuck and the <u>05_DEU_14_05</u># The hart, and the roebuck, and the fallow deer, and the wild goat, and the pygarg, and the wild ox, and the chamois.

roebucks and fallowdeer <u>11_1KI_04_23</u># Ten fat oxen, and twenty oxen out of the pastures, and an hundred sheep, beside harts, and roebucks, and fallowdeer, and fatted fowl.

roes and by <u>22_SON_02_07</u> # I charge you, O ye daughters of Jerusalem, by the roes, and by the hinds of the field, that ye stir not up, nor awake [my] love, till he please.

roes and by <u>22_SON_03_05</u> # I charge you, O ye daughters of Jerusalem, by the roes, and by the hinds of the field, that ye stir not up, nor awake [my] love, till he please.

roes that are <u>22_SON_04_05</u> # Thy two breasts [are] like two young roes that are twins, which feed among the lilies.

roes that are <u>22_SON_07_03</u> # Thy two breasts [are] like two young roes [that are] twins.

roes upon the <u>13_1CH_12_08</u> # And of the Gadites there separated themselves unto David into the hold to the wilderness men of might, [and] men of war [fit] for the battle, that could handle shield and buckler, whose faces [were like] the faces of lions, and [were] as swift as the roes upon the mountains;
