Roman and because <u>44 ACT 22 29</u> # Then straightway they departed from him which should have examined him: and the chief captain also was afraid, after he knew that he was a Roman, and because he had bound him.

Roman and uncondemned <u>44_ACT_22_25</u> # And as they bound him with thongs, Paul said unto the centurion that stood by, Is it lawful for you to scourge a man that is a Roman, and uncondemned?

Roman He said <u>44_ACT_22_27</u> # Then the chief captain came, and said unto him, Tell me, art thou a Roman? He said, Yea.

Roman <u>44_ACT_22_26</u> # When the centurion heard [that], he went and told the chief captain, saying, Take heed what thou doest: for this man is a Roman.

Roman <u>44_ACT_23_27</u> # This man was taken of the Jews, and should have been killed of them: then came I with an army, and rescued him, having understood that he was a Roman.

Romans and have <u>44_ACT_16_37</u> # But Paul said unto them, They have beaten us openly uncondemned, being Romans, and have cast [us] into prison; and now do they thrust us out privily? nay verily; but let them come themselves and fetch us out.

Romans shall come <u>43_JOH_11_48</u># If we let him thus alone, all [men] will believe on him: and the Romans shall come and take away both our place and nation.

Romans to deliver <u>44_ACT_25_16</u> # To whom I answered, It is not the manner of the Romans to deliver any man to die, before that he which is accused have the accusers face to face, and have licence to answer for himself concerning the crime laid against him.

Romans <u>44_ACT_16_21</u> # And teach customs, which are not lawful for us to receive, neither to observe, being Romans.

Romans <u>44_ACT_16_38</u> # And the serjeants told these words unto the magistrates: and they feared, when they heard that they were Romans.

Romans <u>44_ACT_28_17</u> # And it came to pass, that after three days Paul called the chief of the Jews together: and when they were come together, he said unto them, Men [and] brethren, though I have committed nothing against the people, or customs of our fathers, yet was I delivered prisoner from Jerusalem into the hands of the Romans.
