conjunction 1438 - heautou {heh-ow-too'} (including all other cases); from a reflexive pronoun otherwise obsolete and the genitive case (dative case or accusative case) of 0846; him- (her-, it-, them-, also [in {conjunction} with the personal pronoun of the other persons] my-, thy-, our-, your-)self (selves), etc.: -- alone, her (own, -self), (he) himself, his (own), itself, one (to) another, our (thine) own(-selves), + that she had, their (own, own selves), (of) them(-selves), they, thyself, you, your (own, own conceits, own selves, - selves).

conjunction 2193 - heos {heh'-oce}; of uncertain affinity; a {conjunction}, preposition and adverb of continuance, until (of time and place): -- even (until, unto), (as) far (as), how long, (un-)til(-l), (hither-, un-, up) to, while(-s).

conjunction 3754 - hoti {hot'-ee}; neuter of 3748 as {conjunction}; demonst. that (sometimes redundant); caus. because: -- as concerning that, as though, because (that), for (that), how (that), (in) that, though, why.

conjunctional 07535 ## raq {rak}; the same as 07534 as a noun; properly, leanness, i.e. (figuratively) limitation; only adverbial, merely, or {conjunctional}, although: -- but, even, except, howbeit howsoever, at the least, nevertheless, nothing but, notwithstanding, only, save, so [that], surely, yet (so), in any wise.

conjunctionally 3767 - oun {oon}; apparently a primary word; (adverbially) certainly, or ({conjunctionally}) accordingly: -- and (so, truly), but, now (then), so (likewise then), then, therefore, verily, wherefore.

conjunctionally 3825 - palin {pal'-in}; probably from the same as 3823 (through the idea of oscillatory repetition); (adverbially) anew, i.e. (of place) back, (of time) once more, or ({conjunctionally}) furthermore or on the other hand: -- again.
