- 18\_JOB\_13\_01 Lo, mine eye hath seen all [this], mine ear hath heard and understood it.
- $18\_JOB\_13\_02$  What ye know, [the same] do I know also: I [am] not inferior unto you.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_03 Surely I would speak to the Almighty, and I desire to reason with God.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_04 But ye [are] forgers of lies, ye [are] all physicians of no value.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_05 O that ye would altogether hold your peace! and it should be your wisdom.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_06 Hear now my reasoning, and hearken to the pleadings of my lips.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_07 Will ye speak wickedly for God? and talk deceitfully for him?
- 18\_JOB\_13\_08 Will ye accept his person? will ye contend for God?
- $18\_JOB\_13\_09 \ Is \ it \ good \ that \ he \ should \ search \ you \ out? \ or \ as \ one \ man \ mocketh \ another, \ do \ ye \ [so] \ mock \ him?$
- 18\_JOB\_13\_10 He will surely reprove you, if ye do secretly accept persons.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_11 Shall not his excellency make you afraid? and his dread fall upon you?
- 18\_JOB\_13\_12 Your remembrances [are] like unto ashes, your bodies to bodies of clay.
- $18\_JOB\_13\_13$  Hold your peace, let me alone, that I may speak, and let come on me what [will].
- 18\_JOB\_13\_14 Wherefore do I take my flesh in my teeth, and put my life in mine hand?
- 18\_JOB\_13\_15 Though he slay me, yet will I trust in him: but I will maintain mine own ways before him.
- 18 JOB 13 16 He also [shall be] my salvation; for an hypocrite shall not come before him.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_17 Hear diligently my speech, and my declaration with your ears.
- $18\_JOB\_13\_18$  Behold now, I have ordered [my] cause; I know that I shall be justified.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_19 Who [is] he [that] will plead with me? for now, if I hold my tongue, I shall give up the ghost.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_20 Only do not two [things] unto me: then will I not hide myself from thee.
- 18 JOB 13 21 Withdraw thine hand far from me; and let not thy dread make me afraid.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_22 Then call thou, and I will answer: or let me speak, and answer thou me.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_23 How many [are] mine iniquities and sins? make me to know my transgression and my sin.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_24 Wherefore hidest thou thy face, and holdest me for thine enemy?
- 18\_JOB\_13\_25 Wilt thou break a leaf driven to and fro? and wilt thou pursue the dry stubble?
- 18\_JOB\_13\_26 For thou writest bitter things against me, and makest me to possess the iniquities of my youth.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_27 Thou puttest my feet also in the stocks, and lookest narrowly unto all my paths; thou settest a print upon the heels of my feet.
- 18\_JOB\_13\_28 And he, as a rotten thing, consumeth, as a garment that is moth eaten.
