- 20\_PRO\_18\_01 Through desire a man, having separated himself, seeketh [and] intermeddleth with all wisdom.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_02 A fool hath no delight in understanding, but that his heart may discover itself.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_03 When the wicked cometh, [then] cometh also contempt, and with ignominy reproach.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_04 The words of a man's mouth [are as] deep waters, [and] the wellspring of wisdom [as] a flowing brook.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_05 [It is] not good to accept the person of the wicked, to overthrow the righteous in judgment.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_06 A fool's lips enter into contention, and his mouth calleth for strokes.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_07 A fool's mouth [is] his destruction, and his lips [are] the snare of his soul.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_08 The words of a talebearer [are] as wounds, and they go down into the innermost parts of the belly.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_09 He also that is slothful in his work is brother to him that is a great waster.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_10 The name of the LORD [is] a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_11 The rich man's wealth [is] his strong city, and as an high wall in his own conceit.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_12 Before destruction the heart of man is haughty, and before honour [is] humility.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_13 He that answereth a matter before he heareth [it], it [is] folly and shame unto him.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_14 The spirit of a man will sustain his infirmity; but a wounded spirit who can bear?
- 20\_PRO\_18\_15 The heart of the prudent getteth knowledge; and the ear of the wise seeketh knowledge.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_16 A man's gift maketh room for him, and bringeth him before great men.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_17 [He that is] first in his own cause [seemeth] just; but his neighbour cometh and searcheth him.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_18 The lot causeth contentions to cease, and parteth between the mighty.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_19 A brother offended [is harder to be won] than a strong city: and [their] contentions [are] like the bars of a castle.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_20 A man's belly shall be satisfied with the fruit of his mouth; [and] with the increase of his lips shall he be filled.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_21 Death and life [are] in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_22 [Whoso] findeth a wife findeth a good [thing], and obtaineth favour of the LORD.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_23 The poor useth entreaties; but the rich answereth roughly.
- 20\_PRO\_18\_24 A man [that hath] friends must show himself friendly: and there is a friend [that] sticketh closer than a brother.
