music 4485 ## mangiynah {man-ghee-naw'}; from 5059; a satire: -{music}.

music 4858 # sumphonia {soom-fo-nee'-ah}; from 4859; unison of sound
("symphony"), i.e. a concert of instruments (harmonious note): -{music}.

musical 7705 ## shiddah {shid-dah'}; from 7703; a wife (as mistress of the house): -- X all sorts, {musical} instrument.

musical 7892 ## shiyr {sheer}; or feminine shiyrah {shee-raw'}; from 7891; a song; abstractly, singing: -- {musical}(-ick), X sing(-er, -ing), song.

musician 5329 ## natsach {naw-tsakh'}; a primitive root; properly, to glitter from afar, i.e. to be eminent (as a superintendent, especially of the Temple services and its music); also (as denominative from 5331), to be permanent: -- excel, chief {musician} (singer), oversee(-r), set forward.

musician 3451 # mousikos {moo-sik-os'}; from Mousa (a Muse); "musical",
i.e. (as noun) a minstrel: -- {musician}.

musick 2170 ## z@mar (Aramaic) {zem-awr'}; from a root corresponding to 2167; instrumental music: -- {musick}.

musick 5058 ## n@giynah {neg-ee-naw'}; or n@giynath (Psa. 61:title) {neg-ee-nath'}; from 5059; properly, instrumental music; by implication, a stringed instrument; by extension, a poem set to music; specifically, an epigram: -- stringed instrument, {musick}, Neginoth [plural], song.

musick 7991 ## shaliysh {shaw-leesh'}; or shalowsh ( 1 Chron. 11:11; 12:18) {shaw-loshe'}; or shalosh (2 Sam. 23:13) {shaw-loshe'}; from 7969; a triple, i.e. (as a musical instrument) a triangle (or perhaps rather three-stringed lute); also (as an indefinite, great quantity) a three-fold measure (perhaps a treble ephah); also (as an officer) a general of the third rank (upward, i.e. the highest): -- captain, instrument of {musick}, (great) lord, (great) measure, prince, three [from the margin].

musing 1901 ## hagiyg {haw-gheeg'}; from an unused root akin to 1897; properly, a murmur, i.e. complaint: -- meditation, {musing}.

must 4135 ## muwl {mool}; a primitive root; to cut short, i.e. curtail (specifically the prepuce, i.e. to circumcise); by implication, to blunt; figuratively, to destroy: -- circumcise(-ing), selves), cut down (in pieces), destroy, X {must} needs.

mutter 1897 ## hagah {daw-gaw'}; a primitive root [compare 1901]; to murmur (in pleasure or anger); by implication, to ponder: -- imagine, meditate, mourn, {mutter}, roar, X sore, speak, study, talk, utter.

mutual 0240 # allelon {al-lay'-lone}; Gen. plural from 243 reduplicated; one another: -- each other, {mutual}, one another, (the other), (them-, your-)selves, (selves) together [sometimes with 3326 or 4314].

muzzle 2629 ## chacam {khaw-sam'}; a primitive root; to muzzle; by analogy, to stop the nose: -- {muzzle}, stop.

muzzle 5392 # phimoo {fee-mo'-o}; from phimos (a muzzle); to muzzle: -{muzzle}.

my 0136 ## >Adonay {ad-o-noy'}; am emphatic form of 113; the Lord (used as a proper name of God only): -- ({my}) Lord.

my 1691 # eme  $\{em-eh'\}$ ; a prolonged form of 3165; me: -- I, me,  $\{my\}(-self)$ .

my 1698 # emoi  $\{em-oy'\}$ ; a prolonged form of 3427; to me: -- I, me, mine,  $\{my\}$ .

my  $1699 \# emos \{em-os'\}$ ; from the oblique cases of 1473 (1698, 1700, 1691); my: -- of me, mine (own),  $\{my\}$ .

my 1700 # emou {em-oo'}; a prolonged form of 3449; of me: -- me, mine,  $\{my\}$ .

my 3165 # me  $\{meh\}$ ; a shorter (and probably originally) from of 1691; me: -- I, me,  $\{my\}$ .

my 3427 # moi  $\{moy\}$ ; the simpler form of 1698; to me: -- I, me, mine,  $\{my\}$ .

my 3450 # mou  $\{moo\}$ ; the simpler form of 1700; of me: -- I, me, mine (own),  $\{my\}$ .

my- 5315 ## nephesh {neh'-fesh}; from 5314; properly, a breathing creature, i.e. animal of (abstractly) vitality; used very widely in a literal, accommodated or figurative sense (bodily or mental): -- any, appetite, beast, body, breath, creature, X dead(-ly), desire, X [dis-]contented, X fish, ghost, + greedy, he, heart(-y), (hath, X jeopardy of) life (X in jeopardy), lust, man, me, mind, mortally, one, own, person, pleasure, (her-, him-, {my-}, thy-)self, them (your)-selves, + slay, soul, + tablet, they, thing, (X she) will, X would have it.

myrrh 4666 # smurna {smoor'-nah}; apparently strengthened for 3464; myrrh:
-- {myrrh}.

myrrh 4669 # smurnizo {smoor-nid'-zo}; from 4667; to tincture with myrrh, i.e. embitter (as a narcotic): -- mingle with {myrrh}.

myrtle 1918 ## hadac {had-as'}; of uncertain derivation; the myrtle: --{myrtle} (tree).

myself 0589 ## >aniy {an-ee'}; contracted from 595; I: -- I, (as for) me, mine, {myself}, we, X which, X who.

myself 1683 # emautou {em-ow-too'}; genitive case compound of 1700 and 846; of myself (so likewise the dative case emautoi {em-ow-to'}; and accusative case emauton {em-ow-ton'}: -- me, mine own (self), {myself}.

Mysia 3465 # Musia {moo-see'-ah}; of uncertain origin; Mysia, a region of Asia Minor: -- {Mysia}.

mystery 3466 # musterion {moos-tay'-ree-on}; from a derivative of muo (to shut the mouth); a secret or "mystery" (through the idea of silence imposed by initiation into religious rites): -- {mystery}.

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
