Rab-mag 7248 ## Rab-Mag {rab-mawg'}; from 7227 and a foreign word for a Magian; chief Magian; Rab-Mag, a Bab. official: -- {Rab-mag}.

Rab-saris 7249 ## Rab-Cariyc {rab-saw-reece'}; from 7227 and a foreign word for a eunuch; chief chamberlain; Rab-Saris, a Babylonian official: -- {Rab-saris}.

Rabbah 7237 ## Rabbah {rab-baw'}; feminine of 7227; great; Rabbah, the name of two places in Palestine, East and West: -- {Rabbah}, Rabbath.

Rabbath 7237 ## Rabbah {rab-baw'}; feminine of 7227; great; Rabbah, the name of two places in Palestine, East and West: -- Rabbah, {Rabbath}.

Rabbi 4461 # rhabbi {hrab-bee'}; of Hebrew origin [7227 with pronominal suffix]; my master, i.e. Rabbi, as an official title of honor: -- Master, {Rabbi}.

Rabbi th 7245 ## Rabbiyth {rab-beeth'}; from 7231; multitude; Rabbi th, a place in Palestine: -- {Rabbi th}.

Rabboni 4462 # rhabboni {hrab-bon-ee'}; or rhabbouni {hrab-boo-nee'}; of Aramaic origin; corresponding to 4461: -- Lord, {Rabboni}.

Rabshakeh 7262 ## Rabshaqeh {rab-shaw-kay'}; from 7227 and 8248; chief butler; Rabshakeh, a Bab. official: -- {Rabshakeh}.

Raca 4469 # rhaka {rhak-ah'}; of Aramaic origin [compare 7386]; 0 empty one, i.e. thou worthless (as a term of utter vilification): -- {Raca}.

race 0734 ## >orach {o'-rakh}; from 732; a well-trodden road (literally or figuratively); also a caravan: -- manner, path, {race}, rank, traveller, troop, [by-, high-]way.

race 4793 ## merowts {may-rotés'}; from 7323; a run (the trial of speed): -- {race}.

race 0073 # agon {ag-one'}; from 71; properly, a place of assembly (as if led), i.e. (by implication) a contest (held there); figuratively, an effort or anxiety: -- conflict, contention, fight, {race}.

race 4712 # stadion {stad'-ee-on}; or masculine (in plural) stadios {stad'-ee-os}; from the base of 2476 (as fixed); a stade or certain measure of distance; by implication, a stadium or race-course: -- furlong, {race}.

Rachab 4477 # Rhachab {hrakh-ab'}; from the same as 4460; Rachab, a Canaanite: -- {Rachab}.

rag 0899 ## beged {behg' -ed}; from 898; a covering, i.e. clothing; also treachery or pillage: -- apparel, cloth(-es, ing), garment, lap, {rag}, raiment, robe, X very [treacherously], vesture, wardrobe.

rag 4418 ## malach {maw-lawkh'}; from 4414 in its original sense; a rag or old garment: -- rotten {rag}.

rag 7168 ## qera< {keh' -rah}; from 7167; a rag: -- piece, {rag}.

Ragau 4466 # Rhagau {hrag-ow'}; of Hebrew origin [7466]; Ragau (i.e. Reu), a patriarch: -- {Ragau}.

rage 2534 ## chemah {khay-maw'}; or (Dan. 11:44) chema> {khay-maw'}; from 3179; heat; figuratively, anger, poison (from its fever): -- anger, bottles, hot displeasure, furious(-ly, -- ry), heat, indignation, poison, {rage}, wrath(-ful). See 2529.

rage 7264 ## ragaz {raw-gaz'}; a primitive root; to quiver (with any violent emotion, especially anger or fear): -- be afraid, stand in awe, disquiet, fall out, fret, move, provoke, quake, {rage}, shake, tremble, trouble, be wroth.

rage 7266 ## r@gaz (Aramaic) {reg-az'}; from 7265; violent anger: -- {rage}.

rage 7267 ## rogez {ro'-ghez}; from 7264; commotion, restlessness (of a horse), crash (of thunder), disquiet, anger: -- fear, noise, {rage}, trouble(-ing), wrath.

rage 7283 ## ragash {raw-gash'}; a primitive root; to be tumultuous: -- {rage}.

rage 5433 # phruasso {froo-as'-so}; akin to 1032, 1031; to snort (as a spirited horse), i. e. (figuratively) to make a tumult: -- {rage}.

ragged 5553 ## cela< {seh'-lah}; from an unused root meaning to be lofty; a craggy rock, literally or figuratively (a fortress): -- ({ragged}) rock, stone(-ny), strong hold.

raging 1348 ## ge>uwth {gay-ooth'}; from 1342; the same as 1346: -- excellent things, lifting up, majesty, pride, proudly, {raging}.

raging 0066 # agrios {ag'-ree-os}; from 68; wild (as pertaining to the country), literally (natural) or figuratively (fierce): -- wild, {raging}.

raging 2830 # kludon {kloo'-dohn}; from kluzo (to billow or dash over); a surge of the sea (literally or figuratively): -- {raging}, wave.

Raguel 7467 ## R@<uw>el {reh-oo-ale'}; from the same as 7466 and 410; friend of God; Reuel, the name of Moses' father-in-law, also of an Edomite and an Israelite: -- {Raguel}, Reuel.

Rahab 7294 ## Rahab {rah'-hab}; the same as 7293; Rahab (i. e. boaster), an epithet of Egypt: -- {Rahab}.

Rahab 7343 ## Rachab {raw-khawb'}; the same as 7342; proud; Rachab, a Canaanite: -- {Rahab}.

Rahab 4460 # Rhaab {hrah-ab'}; of Hebrew origin [7343]; Raab (i. e. Rachab), a Canaanite: -- {Rahab}. See also 4477.

Raham 7357 ## Racham {rakh'-am}; the same as 7356; pity; Racham, an Israelite: -- {Raham}.

rail 2778 ## charaph. {khaw-raf'}; a primitive root; to pull off, i. e. (by implication) to expose (as by stripping); specifically, to betroth (as if a

surrender); figuratively, to carp at, i.e. defame; denominative (from 2779) to spend the winter: -- betroth, blaspheme, defy, jeopard, {rail}, reproach, upbraid.

rail 5860 ## <iyt {eet}; a primitive root; to swoop down upon (literally or figuratively): -- fly, {rail}.

rail 0987 # blasphemeo {blas-fay-meh'-o}; from 989; to vilify; specially, to speak impiously: -- (speak) blaspheme(-er, -mously, -my), defame, {rail} on, revile, speak evil.

railer 3060 # loidoros {loy'-dor-os}; from loidos (mischievous); abusive, i.e. a blackguard: -- {railer}, reviler.

railing 3059 # loidora {loy-dor-ee'-ah}; from 3060; slander or vituperation: -- {railing}, reproach[-fully].

raiment 0899 ## beged {behg'-ed}; from 898; a covering, i.e. clothing; also treachery or pillage: -- apparel, cloth(-es, ing), garment, lap, rag, {raiment}, robe, X very [treacherously], vesture, wardrobe.

raiment 3682 ## k@cwth {kes-ooth'}; from 3680; a cover (garment); figuratively, a veiling: -- covering, {raiment}, vesture.

raiment 3830 ## l@buwsh {leb-oosh'}; or l@bush {leb-oosh'}; from 3847; a garment (literally or figuratively); by implication (euphem.) a wife: -- apparel, clothed with, clothing, garment, {raiment}, vestment, vesture.

raiment 8008 ## salmah {sal-maw'}; transp. for 8071; a dress: -- clothes, garment, {raiment}.

raiment 8071 ## simlah {sim-law'}; perhaps by permutation for the feminine of 5566 (through the idea of a cover assuming the shape of the object beneath); a dress, especially a mantle: -- apparel, cloth(-es, -ing), garment, {raiment}. Compare 8008.

raiment 1742 # enduma {en'-doo-mah}; from 1746; apparel (especially the outer robe): -- clothing, garment, {raiment}.

raiment 2066 # esthes {es-thace'}; from hennumi (to clothe); dress: -- apparel, clothing, {raiment}, robe.

raiment 2440 # himation {him-at'-ee-on}; neuter of a presumed derivative of ennumi (to put on); a dress (inner or outer): -- apparel, cloke, clothes, garment, {raiment}, robe, vesture.

raiment 2441 # himatismos {him-at-is-mos'}; from 2439; clothing: -- apparel (X -led), array, {raiment}, vesture.

raiment 4629 # skepasma {skep'-as-mah}; from a derivative of skepas (a covering; perhaps akin to the base of 4649 through the idea of noticeable-ness); clothing: -- {raiment}.

rain 1652 ## gasham {gaw-sham'}; a primitive root; to shower violently: -- (cause to) {rain}.

rain 1653 ## geshem {gheh'-shem}; from 1652; a shower: -- {rain}, shower.

rain 3138 ## yowreh {yo-reh'}; active participle of 3384; sprinkling; hence, a sprinkling (or autumnal showers): -- first rain, former [{rain}].

rain 3138 ## yowreh {yo-reh'}; active participle of 3384; sprinkling; hence, a sprinkling (or autumnal showers): -- first {rain}, former [rain].

rain 4175 ## mowreh {mo-reh'}; from 3384; an archer; also teacher or teaching; also the early rain [see 3138]: -- (early) {rain}.

rain 4305 ## matar {maw-tar'}; a primitive root; to rain: -- (cause to) {rain} (upon).

rain 4306 ## matar {maw-tawr'}; from 4305; rain: -- {rain}.

rain 4456 ## malqowsh {mal-koshe'}; from 3953; the spring rain (compare 3954); figuratively, eloquence: -- latter {rain}.

rain 8164 ## sa<i>yr {saw-eer'}; formed the same as 8163; a shower (as

tempestuous): -- small {rain}.

rain 1026 # brecho {brekh'-o}; a primary verb; to moisten (especially by a shower): -- (send) {rain}, wash.

rain 1028 # broche {brokh-ay'}; from 1026; rain: -- {rain}.

rain 5205 # huetos {hoo-et-os'}; from a primary huo (to rain); rain, especially a shower: -- {rain}.

rain 2664 # katapauo {kat-ap-ow'-o}; from 2596 and 3973; to settle down, i.e. (literally) to colonize, or (figuratively) to (cause to) desist: -- cease, (give) rest({-rain}).

rainbow 2463 # iris {ee'-ris}; perhaps from 2046 (as a symbol of the female messenger of the pagan deities); a rainbow ("iris"): -- {rainbow}.

rained 1656 ## goshem {go'-shem}; from 1652; equivalent to 1653: -- {rained} upon.

rainy 5464 ## cagriyd {sag-reed'}; probably from 5462 in the sense of sweeping away; a pouring rain: -- very {rainy}.

raise 1361 ## gabahh {gaw-bah'}; a primitive root; to soar, i.e. be lofty; figuratively, to be haughty: -- exalt, be haughty, be (make) high(-er), lift up, mount up, be proud, {raise} up great height, upward.

raise 2210 ## zaqaph {zaw-kaf'}; a primitive root; to life, i.e. (figuratively) comfort: -- {raise} (up).

raise 5375 ## nasa> {naw-saw'}; or nacah (Psalm 4 : 6 [7]) {naw-saw'}; a primitive root; to lift, in a great variety of applications, literal and figurative, absol. and rel. (as follows): -- accept, advance, arise, (able to, [armor], suffer to) bear(-er, up), bring (forth), burn, carry (away), cast, contain, desire, ease, exact, exalt (self), extol, fetch, forgive, furnish, further, give, go on, help, high, hold up, honorable (+ man), lade, lay, lift (self) up, lofty, marry, magnify, X needs, obtain, pardon, {raise} (up), receive, regard, respect, set (up), spare, stir up, + swear, take (away, up), X utterly, wear, yield.

raise 5782 ## <uwr {oor}; a primitive root [rather identical with 5783 through the idea of opening the eyes]; to wake (literally or figuratively): -- (a-)wake(-n, up), lift up (self), X master, {raise} (up), stir up (self).

raise 5927 ## <alah {aw-law'}; a primitive root; to ascend, intransitively (be high) or actively (mount); used in a great variety of senses, primary and secondary, literal and figurative (as follow): -- arise (up), (cause to) ascend up, at once, break [the day] (up), bring (up), (cause to) burn,

raise 0450 # anistemi {an-is'-tay-mee}; from 303 and 2476; to stand up (literal or figurative, transitive or intransitive): -- arise, lift up, {raise} up (again), rise (again), stand up(-right).

raise 1326 # diegeiro {dee-eg-i'-ro}; from 1223 and 1453; to wake fully; i.e. arouse (literally or figuratively): -- arise, awake, {raise}, stir up.

raise 1453 # egeiro {eg-i'-ro}; probably akin to the base of 58 (through the idea of collecting one's faculties); to waken (transitively or intransitively), i.e. rouse (literally, from sleep, from sitting or lying, from disease, from death; or figuratively, from obscurity, inactivity, ruins, nonexistence): -- awake, lift (up), {raise} (again, up), rear up, (a-)rise (again, up), stand, take up.

raise 1817 # exanistemi {ex-an-is'-tay-mee}; from 1537 and 450; objectively, to produce, i.e. (figuratively) beget; subjectively, to arise, i.e. (figuratively) object: -- {raise} (rise) up.

raise 1825 # exegeiro {ex-eg-i'-ro}; from 1537 and 1453; to rouse fully, i.e. (figuratively) to resuscitate (from death), release (from infliction): -- {raise} up.

raise 1892 # epegeiro {ep-eg-i'-ro}; from 1909 and 1453; to rouse upon, i.e. (figuratively) to excite against: -- {raise}, stir up.

raise 4891 # sunegeiro {soon-eg-i'-ro}; from 4862 and 1453; to rouse (from death) in company with, i.e. (figuratively) to revivify (spiritually) in resemblance to: -- {raise} up together, rise with.

raised 0386 # anastasis {an-as'-tas-is}; from 450; a standing up again, i.e. (literally) a resurrection from death (individual, genitive case or by implication [its author]), or (figuratively) a (moral) recovery (of spiritual truth): -- {raised} to life again, resurrection, rise from the dead, that should rise, rising again.

raiser 5065 ## nagas {naw-gas'}; a primitive root; to drive (an animal, a workman, a debtor, an army); by implication, to tax, harass, tyrannize: -- distress, driver, exact(-or), oppress(-or), X {raiser} of taxes, taskmaster.

raising 4160 # poieo {poy-eh'-o}; apparently a prolonged form of an obsolete primary; to make or do (in a very wide application, more or less direct): -- abide, + agree, appoint, X avenge, + band together, be, bear, + betray, bring (forth), cast out, cause, commit, + content, continue, deal, + without any delay, (would) do(-ing), execute, exercise, fulfill, gain, give, have, hold, X journeying, keep, + lay wait, + lighten the ship, make, X mean, + none of these things move me, observe, ordain, perform, provide, + have purged, purpose, put, + {raising} up, X secure, shew, X shoot out, spend, take, tarry, + transgress the law, work, yield. raisins 6778 ## tsammuwq {tsam-mook'}; from 6784; a cake of dried grapes: -- bunch (cluster) of {raisins}.

Rakkath 7557 ## Raqqath {rak-kath'}; from 7556 in its original sense of diffusing; a beach (as expanded shingle); Rakkath, a place in Palestine: -- {Rakkath}.

Ramiah 7422 ## Ramyah {ram-yaw'}; from 7311 and 3050; Jah has raised; Ramjah, an Israelite: -- {Ramiah}.

Ramoth 3406 ## Y@riymowth {yer-ee-moth'}; or Y@reymowth {yer-ay-moth'}; or Y@remowth {yer-ay-moth'}; feminine plural from 7311; elevations; Jerimoth or Jeremoth, the name of twelve Israelites: -- Jermoth, Jerimoth, and {Ramoth} [from the margin].

Ramoth 7216 ## Ra>owth {raw-moth'}; or Ramoth {raw-moth'}; plural of 7215; heights; Ramoth, the name of two places in Palestine: -- {Ramoth}.

Ramoth 7418 ## Ramowth-Negeb {raw-moth-neh'-gheb}; or Ramath Negeb {raw'-math neh'-gheb}; from the plural or construct form of 7413 and 5045; heights (or height) of the South; Ramoth-Negeb or Ramath-Negeb, a place in Palestine: -- south {Ramoth}, Ramath of the south.

run 4890 # sundrome {soon-drom-ay' }; from (the alternate of) 4936; a running together, i.e. (riotous) concourse: -- {run} together.

run 4936 # suntrecho {soon-trekh' -o}; from 4862 and 5143 (including its alternate); to rush together (hastily assemble) or headlong (figuratively): -- {run} (together, with).

run 5032 # tachion {takh' -ee-on}; neuter singular of the comparative of 5036 (as adverb); more swiftly, i.e. (in manner) more rapidly, or (in time) more speedily: -- out [{run}], quickly, shortly, sooner.

run 5143 # trecho {trekh' -o}; apparently a primary verb (properly, threcho; compare 2359); which uses dremo {drem' -o} (the base of 1408) as alternate in certain tenses; to run or walk hastily (literally or figuratively): -- have course, {run}.

run 5240 # huperekchuno {hoop-er-ek-khoo' -no}; from 5228 and the alternate form of 1632; to pour out over, i.e. (passively) to overflow: -- {run} over.

runneth 7310 ## r@vayah {rev-aw-yaw' }; from 7301; satisfaction: -- {runneth} over, wealthy.

running 2100 ## zuwb {zoob}; a primitive root; to flow freely (as water), i.e. (specifically) to have a (sexual) flux; figuratively, to waste away; also to overflow: -- flow, gush out, have a ({running}) issue, pine away, run.

running 2416 ## chay {khah'-ee}; from 2421; alive; hence, raw (flesh); fresh (plant, water, year), strong; also (as noun, especially in the feminine singular and masculine plural) life (or living thing), whether literally or figuratively: -- + age, alive, appetite, (wild) beast, company, congregation, life(-time), live(-ly), living (creature, thing), maintenance, + merry, multitude, + (be) old, quick, raw, {running}, springing, troop.

running 4794 ## m@ruwtsah {mer-oo-tsaw'}; or m@rutsah {mer-oo-tsaw'}; feminine of 4793; a race (the act), whether the manner or the progress: -- course, {running}. Compare 4835.

running 4944 ## mashshaq {mash-shawk'}; from 8264; a traversing, i.e. rapid motion: -- {running} to and fro.

running 5140 ## nazal {naw-zal'}; a primitive root; to drip, or shed by trickling: -- distil, drop, flood, (cause to) flow(-ing), gush out, melt, pour (down), {running} water, stream.

running 1998 # episuntrecho {ep-ee-soon-trekh' -o}; from 1909 and 4936; to hasten together upon one place (or a particular occasion): -- come {running} together.

rush 0100 ## >agmown {ag-mone'}; from the same as 98; a marshy pool [others from a different root, a kettle]; by implication a rush (as growing there); collectively a rope of rushes: -- bulrush, caldron, hook, {rush}.

rush 2115 ## zuwr {zoor}; a primitive root [compare 6695]; to press together, tighten: -- close, {rush}, thrust together.

rush 6584 ## pashat {paw-shat'}; a primitive root; to spread out (i.e. deploy in hostile array); by analogy, to strip (i.e. unclot, plunder, flay, etc.): -- fall upon, flay, invade, make an invasion, pull off, put off, make a road, run upon, {rush}, set, spoil, spread selves (abroad), strip (off, self).

rush 7582 ## sha>ah {shaw-aw'}; a primitive root; to rush; by implication, to desolate: -- be desolate, (make a) {rush}(-ing), (lay) waste.

rush 7857 ## shataph {shaw-taf'}; a primitive root; to gush; by implication, to inundate, cleanse; by analogy, to gallop, conquer: -- drown, (over-)flow(-whelm, rinse, run, {rush}, (thoroughly) wash (away).

rushing 5342 # phero {fer'-o}; a primary verb (for which other and apparently not cognate ones are used in certain tenses only; namely, oio {oy'-o}; and enegko {en-eng'-ko}); to "bear" or carry (in a very wide application, literally and figuratively, as follows): -- be, bear, bring (forth), carry, come, + let her drive, be driven, endure, go on, lay, lead, move, reach, {rushing}, uphold.

rust 2447 # ios {ee-os'}; perhaps from eimi (to go) or hiemi (to send); rust (as if emitted by metals); also venom (as emitted by serpents): -- poison, {rust}.

Ruth 7327 ## Ruwth {rooth}; probably for 7468; friend; Ruth, a Moabitess: -- {Ruth}.

Ruth 4503 # Rhouth {hrooth}; of Hebrew origin [7327]; Ruth, a Moabitess: -- {Ruth}.

ry 2534 ## chemah {khay-maw'}; or (Dan. 11:44) chema> {khay-maw'}; from 3179; heat; figuratively, anger, poison (from its fever): -- anger, bottles, hot displeasure, furious(-ly, -- {ry}), heat, indignation, poison, rage, wrath(-ful). See 2529.

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
