- 58\_HEB\_01\_01 God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets,
- 58\_HEB\_01\_02 Hath in these last days spoken unto us by [his] Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds;
- 58\_HEB\_01\_03 Who being the brightness of [his] glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high;
- 58\_HEB\_01\_04 Being made so much better than the angels, as he hath by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they.
- 58\_HEB\_01\_05 For unto which of the angels said he at any time, Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee? And again, I will be to him a Father, and he shall be to me a Son?
- 58\_HEB\_01\_06 And again, when he bringeth in the firstbegotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him.
- 58 HEB 01 07 And of the angels he saith, Who maketh his angels spirits, and his ministers a flame of fire.
- 58\_HEB\_01\_08 But unto the Son [he saith], Thy throne, O God, [is] for ever and ever: a sceptre of righteousness [is] the sceptre of thy kingdom.
- 58\_HEB\_01\_09 Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; therefore God, [even] thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows.
- 58\_HEB\_01\_10 And, Thou, Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundation of the earth; and the heavens are the works of thine hands:
- 58\_HEB\_01\_11 They shall perish; but thou remainest; and they all shall wax old as doth a garment;
- 58\_HEB\_01\_12 And as a vesture shalt thou fold them up, and they shall be changed: but thou art the same, and thy years shall not fail.
- 58\_HEB\_01\_13 But to which of the angels said he at any time, Sit on my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool?
- 58\_HEB\_01\_14 Are they not all ministering spirits, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation?



- 58\_HEB\_02\_01 Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let [them] slip.
- 58\_HEB\_02\_02 For if the word spoken by angels was stedfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just recompense of reward;
- 58\_HEB\_02\_03 How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation; which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed unto us by them that heard [him];
- 58\_HEB\_02\_04 God also bearing [them] witness, both with signs and wonders, and with divers miracles, and gifts of the Holy Ghost, according to his own will?
- 58\_HEB\_02\_05 For unto the angels hath he not put in subjection the world to come, whereof we speak.
- 58\_HEB\_02\_06 But one in a certain place testified, saying, What is man, that thou art mindful of him? or the son of man, that thou visitest him?
- 58\_HEB\_02\_07 Thou madest him a little lower than the angels; thou crownedst him with glory and honour, and didst set him over the works of thy hands:
- 58\_HEB\_02\_08 Thou hast put all things in subjection under his feet. For in that he put all in subjection under him, he left nothing [that is] not put under him. But now we see not yet all things put under him.
- 58\_HEB\_02\_09 But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man.
- 58\_HEB\_02\_10 For it became him, for whom [are] all things, and by whom [are] all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings.
- 58\_HEB\_02\_11 For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified [are] all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren,
- 58\_HEB\_02\_12 Saying, I will declare thy name unto my brethren, in the midst of the church will I sing praise unto thee.
- 58 HEB 02 13 And again, I will put my trust in him. And again, Behold I and the children which God hath given me.
- 58\_HEB\_02\_14 Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil;
- 58 HEB 02 15 And deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.
- 58 HEB 02 16 For verily he took not on [him the nature of] angels; but he took on [him] the seed of Abraham.
- 58\_HEB\_02\_17 Wherefore in all things it behoved him to be made like unto [his] brethren, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in things [pertaining] to God, to make reconciliation for the sins of the people.
- 58\_HEB\_02\_18 For in that he himself hath suffered being tempted, he is able to succour them that are tempted.



- 58\_HEB\_03\_01 Wherefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our profession, Christ Jesus;
- 58 HEB 03 02 Who was faithful to him that appointed him, as also Moses [was faithful] in all his house.
- 58\_HEB\_03\_03 For this [man] was counted worthy of more glory than Moses, inasmuch as he who hath builded the house hath more honour than the house.
- 58\_HEB\_03\_04 For every house is builded by some [man]; but he that built all things [is] God.
- 58\_HEB\_03\_05 And Moses verily [was] faithful in all his house, as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were to be spoken after;
- 58\_HEB\_03\_06 But Christ as a son over his own house; whose house are we, if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm unto the end.
- 58 HEB 03 07 Wherefore [as the Holy Ghost saith, To day if ye will hear his voice,
- 58 HEB 03 08 Harden not your hearts, as in the provocation, in the day of temptation in the wilderness:
- 58 HEB 03 09 When your fathers tempted me, proved me, and saw my works forty years.
- 58\_HEB\_03\_10 Wherefore I was grieved with that generation, and said, They do alway err in [their] heart; and they have not known my ways.
- 58 HEB 03 11 So I sware in my wrath, They shall not enter into my rest.]
- 58\_HEB\_03\_12 Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God.
- 58\_HEB\_03\_13 But exhort one another daily, while it is called To day; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin.
- 58\_HEB\_03\_14 For we are made partakers of Christ, if we hold the beginning of our confidence stedfast unto the end;
- 58\_HEB\_03\_15 While it is said, To day if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts, as in the provocation.
- 58 HEB 03 16 For some, when they had heard, did provoke: howbeit not all that came out of Egypt by Moses.
- 58\_HEB\_03\_17 But with whom was he grieved forty years? [was it] not with them that had sinned, whose carcases fell in the wilderness?
- 58\_HEB\_03\_18 And to whom sware he that they should not enter into his rest, but to them that believed not?
- 58 HEB 03 19 So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief.

- 58\_HEB\_04\_01 Let us therefore fear, lest, a promise being left [us] of entering into his rest, any of you should seem to come short of it.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_02 For unto us was the gospel preached, as well as unto them: but the word preached did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in them that heard [it].
- 58\_HEB\_04\_03 For we which have believed do enter into rest, as he said, As I have sworn in my wrath, if they shall enter into my rest: although the works were finished from the foundation of the world.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_04 For he spake in a certain place of the seventh [day] on this wise, And God did rest the seventh day from all his works.
- 58 HEB 04 05 And in this [place] again, If they shall enter into my rest.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_06 Seeing therefore it remaineth that some must enter therein, and they to whom it was first preached entered not in because of unbelief:
- 58\_HEB\_04\_07 Again, he limiteth a certain day, saying in David, To day, after so long a time; as it is said, To day if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts.
- 58 HEB 04 08 For if Jesus had given them rest, then would be not afterward have spoken of another day.
- 58 HEB 04 09 There remaineth therefore a rest to the people of God.
- 58 HEB 04 10 For he that is entered into his rest, he also hath ceased from his own works, as God [did] from his.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_11 Let us labour therefore to enter into that rest, lest any man fall after the same example of unbelief.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_12 For the word of God [is] quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and [is] a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_13 Neither is there any creature that is not manifest in his sight: but all things [are] naked and opened unto the eyes of him with whom we have to do.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_14 Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast [our] profession.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_15 For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as [we are, yet] without sin.
- 58\_HEB\_04\_16 Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.

- 58\_HEB\_05\_01 For every high priest taken from among men is ordained for men in things [pertaining] to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins:
- 58\_HEB\_05\_02 Who can have compassion on the ignorant, and on them that are out of the way; for that he himself also is compassed with infirmity.
- 58 HEB 05 03 And by reason hereof he ought, as for the people, so also for himself, to offer for sins.
- 58\_HEB\_05\_04 And no man taketh this honour unto himself, but he that is called of God, as [was] Aaron.
- 58\_HEB\_05\_05 So also Christ glorified not himself to be made an high priest; but he that said unto him, Thou art my Son, to day have I begotten thee.
- 58 HEB 05 06 As he saith also in another [place], Thou [art] a priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec.
- 58\_HEB\_05\_07 Who in the days of his flesh, when he had offered up prayers and supplications with strong crying and tears unto him that was able to save him from death, and was heard in that he feared;
- 58\_HEB\_05\_08 Though he were a Son, yet learned he obedience by the things which he suffered;
- 58\_HEB\_05\_09 And being made perfect, he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him;
- 58 HEB 05 10 Called of God an high priest after the order of Melchisedec.
- 58\_HEB\_05\_11 Of whom we have many things to say, and hard to be uttered, seeing ye are dull of hearing.
- 58\_HEB\_05\_12 For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which [be] the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat.
- 58 HEB 05 13 For every one that useth milk [is] unskilful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe.
- 58\_HEB\_05\_14 But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, [even] those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.



- 58\_HEB\_06\_01 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God,
- 58\_HEB\_06\_02 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.
- 58\_HEB\_06\_03 And this will we do, if God permit.
- 58\_HEB\_06\_04 For [it is] impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost,
- 58\_HEB\_06\_05 And have tasted the good word of God, and the powers of the world to come,
- 58\_HEB\_06\_06 If they shall fall away, to renew them again unto repentance; seeing they crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put [him] to an open shame.
- 58\_HEB\_06\_07 For the earth which drinketh in the rain that cometh oft upon it, and bringeth forth herbs meet for them by whom it is dressed, receiveth blessing from God:
- 58\_HEB\_06\_08 But that which beareth thorns and briers [is] rejected, and [is] nigh unto cursing; whose end [is] to be burned.
- 58\_HEB\_06\_09 But, beloved, we are persuaded better things of you, and things that accompany salvation, though we thus speak.
- 58\_HEB\_06\_10 For God [is] not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have showed toward his name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister.
- 58\_HEB\_06\_11 And we desire that every one of you do show the same diligence to the full assurance of hope unto the end:
- 58 HEB 06 12 That ye be not slothful, but followers of them who through faith and patience inherit the promises.
- 58\_HEB\_06\_13 For when God made promise to Abraham, because he could swear by no greater, he sware by himself,
- 58 HEB 06 14 Saying, Surely blessing I will bless thee, and multiplying I will multiply thee.
- 58 HEB 06 15 And so, after he had patiently endured, he obtained the promise.
- 58 HEB 06 16 For men verily swear by the greater: and an oath for confirmation [is] to them an end of all strife.
- 58\_HEB\_06\_17 Wherein God, willing more abundantly to show unto the heirs of promise the immutability of his counsel, confirmed [it] by an oath:
- 58\_HEB\_06\_18 That by two immutable things, in which [it was] impossible for God to lie, we might have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the hope set before us:
- 58\_HEB\_06\_19 Which [hope] we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and stedfast, and which entereth into that within the veil;
- 58\_HEB\_06\_20 Whither the forerunner is for us entered, [even] Jesus, made an high priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec.



- 58\_HEB\_07\_01 For this Melchisedec, king of Salem, priest of the most high God, who met Abraham returning from the slaughter of the kings, and blessed him;
- 58\_HEB\_07\_02 To whom also Abraham gave a tenth part of all; first being by interpretation King of righteousness, and after that also King of Salem, which is, King of peace;
- 58\_HEB\_07\_03 Without father, without mother, without descent, having neither beginning of days, nor end of life; but made like unto the Son of God; abideth a priest continually.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_04 Now consider how great this man [was], unto whom even the patriarch Abraham gave the tenth of the spoils.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_05 And verily they that are of the sons of Levi, who receive the office of the priesthood, have a commandment to take tithes of the people according to the law, that is, of their brethren, though they come out of the loins of Abraham:
- 58\_HEB\_07\_06 But he whose descent is not counted from them received tithes of Abraham, and blessed him that had the promises.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_07 And without all contradiction the less is blessed of the better.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_08 And here men that die receive tithes; but there he [receiveth them], of whom it is witnessed that he liveth.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_09 And as I may so say, Levi also, who receiveth tithes, payed tithes in Abraham.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_10 For he was yet in the loins of his father, when Melchisedec met him.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_11 If therefore perfection were by the Levitical priesthood, [for under it the people received the law,] what further need [was there] that another priest should rise after the order of Melchisedec, and not be called after the order of Aaron?
- 58 HEB 07 12 For the priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change also of the law.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_13 For he of whom these things are spoken pertaineth to another tribe, of which no man gave attendance at the altar.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_14 For [it is] evident that our Lord sprang out of Juda; of which tribe Moses spake nothing concerning priesthood.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_15 And it is yet far more evident: for that after the similitude of Melchisedec there ariseth another priest,
- 58\_HEB\_07\_16 Who is made, not after the law of a carnal commandment, but after the power of an endless life.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_17 For he testifieth, Thou [art] a priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_18 For there is verily a disannulling of the commandment going before for the weakness and unprofitableness thereof.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_19 For the law made nothing perfect, but the bringing in of a better hope [did]; by the which we draw nigh unto God.
- 58 HEB 07 20 And inasmuch as not without an oath [he was made priest]:
- 58\_HEB\_07\_21 [For those priests were made without an oath; but this with an oath by him that said unto him, The Lord sware and will not repent, Thou [art] a priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec:]
- 58\_HEB\_07\_22 By so much was Jesus made a surety of a better testament.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_23 And they truly were many priests, because they were not suffered to continue by reason of death:
- 58\_HEB\_07\_24 But this [man], because he continueth ever, hath an unchangeable priesthood.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_25 Wherefore he is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_26 For such an high priest became us, [who is] holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and made higher than the heavens;
- 58\_HEB\_07\_27 Who needeth not daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifice, first for his own sins, and then for the people's: for this he did once, when he offered up himself.
- 58\_HEB\_07\_28 For the law maketh men high priests which have infirmity; but the word of the oath, which was since the law, [maketh] the Son, who is consecrated for evermore.

- 58\_HEB\_08\_01 Now of the things which we have spoken [this is] the sum: We have such an high priest, who is set on the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens;
- 58\_HEB\_08\_02 A minister of the sanctuary, and of the true tabernacle, which the Lord pitched, and not man.
- 58\_HEB\_08\_03 For every high priest is ordained to offer gifts and sacrifices: wherefore [it is] of necessity that this man have somewhat also to offer.
- 58\_HEB\_08\_04 For if he were on earth, he should not be a priest, seeing that there are priests that offer gifts according to the law:
- 58\_HEB\_08\_05 Who serve unto the example and shadow of heavenly things, as Moses was admonished of God when he was about to make the tabernacle: for, See, saith he, [that] thou make all things according to the pattern showed to thee in the mount.
- 58\_HEB\_08\_06 But now hath he obtained a more excellent ministry, by how much also he is the mediator of a better covenant, which was established upon better promises.
- 58\_HEB\_08\_07 For if that first [covenant] had been faultless, then should no place have been sought for the second.
- 58\_HEB\_08\_08 For finding fault with them, he saith, Behold, the days come, saith the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah:
- 58\_HEB\_08\_09 Not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day when I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt; because they continued not in my covenant, and I regarded them not, saith the Lord.
- 58\_HEB\_08\_10 For this [is] the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws into their mind, and write them in their hearts: and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people:
- 58\_HEB\_08\_11 And they shall not teach every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying, Know the Lord: for all shall know me, from the least to the greatest.
- 58\_HEB\_08\_12 For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, and their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more.
- 58\_HEB\_08\_13 In that he saith, A new [covenant], he hath made the first old. Now that which decayeth and waxeth old [is] ready to vanish away.



- 58 HEB 09 01 Then verily the first [covenant] had also ordinances of divine service, and a worldly sanctuary.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_02 For there was a tabernacle made; the first, wherein [was] the candlestick, and the table, and the showbread; which is called the sanctuary.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_03 And after the second veil, the tabernacle which is called the Holiest of all;
- 58\_HEB\_09\_04 Which had the golden censer, and the ark of the covenant overlaid round about with gold, wherein [was] the golden pot that had manna, and Aaron's rod that budded, and the tables of the covenant;
- 58\_HEB\_09\_05 And over it the cherubims of glory shadowing the mercyseat; of which we cannot now speak particularly.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_06 Now when these things were thus ordained, the priests went always into the first tabernacle, accomplishing the service [of God].
- 58\_HEB\_09\_07 But into the second [went] the high priest alone once every year, not without blood, which he offered for himself, and [for] the errors of the people:
- 58\_HEB\_09\_08 The Holy Ghost this signifying, that the way into the holiest of all was not yet made manifest, while as the first tabernacle was yet standing:
- 58\_HEB\_09\_09 Which [was] a figure for the time then present, in which were offered both gifts and sacrifices, that could not make him that did the service perfect, as pertaining to the conscience;
- 58\_HEB\_09\_10 [Which stood] only in meats and drinks, and divers washings, and carnal ordinances, imposed [on them] until the time of reformation.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_11 But Christ being come an high priest of good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is to say, not of this building;
- 58\_HEB\_09\_12 Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption [for us].
- 58\_HEB\_09\_13 For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling the unclean, sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh:
- 58\_HEB\_09\_14 How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?
- 58\_HEB\_09\_15 And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions [that were] under the first testament, they which are called might receive the promise of eternal inheritance.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_16 For where a testament [is], there must also of necessity be the death of the testator.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_17 For a testament [is] of force after men are dead: otherwise it is of no strength at all while the testator liveth.
- 58 HEB 09 18 Whereupon neither the first [testament] was dedicated without blood.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_19 For when Moses had spoken every precept to all the people according to the law, he took the blood of calves and of goats, with water, and scarlet wool, and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book, and all the people,
- 58\_HEB\_09\_20 Saying, This [is] the blood of the testament which God hath enjoined unto you.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_21 Moreover he sprinkled with blood both the tabernacle, and all the vessels of the ministry.
- 58 HEB 09 22 And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without shedding of blood is no remission.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_23 [It was] therefore necessary that the patterns of things in the heavens should be purified with these; but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these.
- 58\_HEB\_09\_24 For Christ is not entered into the holy places made with hands, [which are] the figures of the true; but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us:
- 58\_HEB\_09\_25 Nor yet that he should offer himself often, as the high priest entereth into the holy place every year with blood of others;
- 58\_HEB\_09\_26 For then must be often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but now once in the end of the world hath be appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.
- 58 HEB 09 27 And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:
- 58\_HEB\_09\_28 So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.



- 58\_HEB\_10\_01 For the law having a shadow of good things to come, [and] not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_02 For then would they not have ceased to be offered? because that the worshippers once purged should have had no more conscience of sins.
- 58 HEB 10 03 But in those [sacrifices there is] a remembrance again [made] of sins every year.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_04 For [it is] not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_05 Wherefore when he cometh into the world, he saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldest not, but a body hast thou prepared me:
- 58 HEB 10 06 In burnt offerings and [sacrifices] for sin thou hast had no pleasure.
- 58 HEB 10 07 Then said I, Lo, I come [in the volume of the book it is written of me,] to do thy will, O God.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_08 Above when he said, Sacrifice and offering and burnt offerings and [offering] for sin thou wouldest not, neither hadst pleasure [therein]; which are offered by the law;
- 58\_HEB\_10\_09 Then said he, Lo, I come to do thy will, O God. He taketh away the first, that he may establish the second.
- 58 HEB 10 10 By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once [for all].
- 58\_HEB\_10\_11 And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins:
- 58 HEB 10 12 But this man, after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God;
- 58\_HEB\_10\_13 From henceforth expecting till his enemies be made his footstool.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_14 For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_15 [Whereof] the Holy Ghost also is a witness to us: for after that he had said before,
- 58\_HEB\_10\_16 This [is] the covenant that I will make with them after those days, saith the Lord, I will put my laws into their hearts, and in their minds will I write them;
- 58\_HEB\_10\_17 And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_18 Now where remission of these [is, there is] no more offering for sin.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_19 Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus,
- 58\_HEB\_10\_20 By a new and living way, which he hath consecrated for us, through the veil, that is to say, his flesh;
- 58\_HEB\_10\_21 And [having] an high priest over the house of God;
- 58\_HEB\_10\_22 Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_23 Let us hold fast the profession of [our] faith without wavering; [for he [is] faithful that promised;]
- 58\_HEB\_10\_24 And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works:
- 58\_HEB\_10\_25 Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some [is]; but exhorting [one another]: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_26 For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins,
- 58\_HEB\_10\_27 But a certain fearful looking for of judgment and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_28 He that despised Moses' law died without mercy under two or three witnesses:
- 58\_HEB\_10\_29 Of how much sorer punishment, suppose ye, shall he be thought worthy, who hath trodden under foot the Son of God, and hath counted the blood of the covenant, wherewith he was sanctified, an unholy thing, and hath done despite unto the Spirit of grace?
- 58\_HEB\_10\_30 For we know him that hath said, Vengeance [belongeth] unto me, I will recompense, saith the Lord. And again, The Lord shall judge his people.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_31 [It is] a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_32 But call to remembrance the former days, in which, after ye were illuminated, ye endured a great fight of afflictions;
- 58\_HEB\_10\_33 Partly, whilst ye were made a gazingstock both by reproaches and afflictions; and partly, whilst ye became companions of them that were so used.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_34 For ye had compassion of me in my bonds, and took joyfully the spoiling of your goods, knowing in yourselves that ye have in heaven a better and an enduring substance.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_35 Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hath great recompense of reward.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_36 For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise.
- 58 HEB 10 37 For yet a little while, and he that shall come will come, and will not tarry.

- 58 HEB 10 38 Now the just shall live by faith: but if [any man] draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him.
- 58\_HEB\_10\_39 But we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that believe to the saving of the



- 58\_HEB\_11\_01 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_02 For by it the elders obtained a good report.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_03 Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_04 By faith Abel offered unto God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, by which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts: and by it he being dead yet speaketh.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_05 By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_06 But without faith [it is] impossible to please [him]: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and [that] he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_07 By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_08 By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_09 By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as [in] a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise:
- 58\_HEB\_11\_10 For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker [is] God.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_11 Through faith also Sara herself received strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, because she judged him faithful who had promised.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_12 Therefore sprang there even of one, and him as good as dead, [so many] as the stars of the sky in multitude, and as the sand which is by the sea shore innumerable.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_13 These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of [them], and embraced [them], and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_14 For they that say such things declare plainly that they seek a country.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_15 And truly, if they had been mindful of that [country] from whence they came out, they might have had opportunity to have returned.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_16 But now they desire a better [country], that is, an heavenly: wherefore God is not ashamed to be called their God: for he hath prepared for them a city.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_17 By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten [son].
- 58\_HEB\_11\_18 Of whom it was said, That in Isaac shall thy seed be called:
- 58\_HEB\_11\_19 Accounting that God [was] able to raise [him] up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_20 By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things to come.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_21 By faith Jacob, when he was a dying, blessed both the sons of Joseph; and worshipped, [leaning] upon the top of his staff.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_22 By faith Joseph, when he died, made mention of the departing of the children of Israel; and gave commandment concerning his bones.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_23 By faith Moses, when he was born, was hid three months of his parents, because they saw [he was] a proper child; and they were not afraid of the king's commandment.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_24 By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter;
- 58\_HEB\_11\_25 Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season;
- 58\_HEB\_11\_26 Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompense of the reward.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_27 By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_28 Through faith he kept the passover, and the sprinkling of blood, lest he that destroyed the firstborn should touch them.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_29 By faith they passed through the Red sea as by dry [land]: which the Egyptians assaying to do were
- 58\_HEB\_11\_30 By faith the walls of Jericho fell down, after they were compassed about seven days.

drowned.

- 58\_HEB\_11\_31 By faith the harlot Rahab perished not with them that believed not, when she had received the spies with peace.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_32 And what shall I more say? for the time would fail me to tell of Gedeon, and [of] Barak, and [of] Samson, and [of] Jephthae; [of] David also, and Samuel, and [of] the prophets:
- 58\_HEB\_11\_33 Who through faith subdued kingdoms, wrought righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions,
- 58\_HEB\_11\_34 Quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, waxed valiant in fight, turned to flight the armies of the aliens.
- 58\_HEB\_11\_35 Women received their dead raised to life again: and others were tortured, not accepting deliverance; that they might obtain a better resurrection:
- 58 HEB 11 36 And others had trial of [cruel] mockings and scourgings, yea, moreover of bonds and imprisonment:
- 58\_HEB\_11\_37 They were stoned, they were sawn asunder, were tempted, were slain with the sword: they wandered
- about in sheepskins and goatskins; being destitute, afflicted, tormented;

  58 HEB 11 38 [Of whom the world was not worthy:] they wandered in deserts, and [in] mountains, and [in] dens and
- caves of the earth.

58 HEB 11 39 And these all, having obtained a good report through faith, received not the promise:

58 HEB 11 40 God having provided some better thing for us, that they without us should not be made perfect.



- 58\_HEB\_12\_01 Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset [us], and let us run with patience the race that is set before us,
- 58\_HEB\_12\_02 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of [our] faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_03 For consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself, lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds.
- 58 HEB 12 04 Ye have not yet resisted unto blood, striving against sin.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_05 And ye have forgotten the exhortation which speaketh unto you as unto children, My son, despise not thou the chastening of the Lord, nor faint when thou art rebuked of him:
- 58 HEB 12 06 For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_07 If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons; for what son is he whom the father chasteneth not?
- 58 HEB 12 08 But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards, and not sons.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_09 Furthermore we have had fathers of our flesh which corrected [us], and we gave [them] reverence: shall we not much rather be in subjection unto the Father of spirits, and live?
- 58\_HEB\_12\_10 For they verily for a few days chastened [us] after their own pleasure; but he for [our] profit, that [we] might be partakers of his holiness.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_11 Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_12 Wherefore lift up the hands which hang down, and the feeble knees;
- 58\_HEB\_12\_13 And make straight paths for your feet, lest that which is lame be turned out of the way; but let it rather be healed.
- 58 HEB 12 14 Follow peace with all [men], and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord:
- 58\_HEB\_12\_15 Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble [you], and thereby many be defiled;
- 58\_HEB\_12\_16 Lest there [be] any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold his birthright.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_17 For ye know how that afterward, when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place of repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_18 For ye are not come unto the mount that might be touched, and that burned with fire, nor unto blackness, and darkness, and tempest,
- 58\_HEB\_12\_19 And the sound of a trumpet, and the voice of words; which [voice] they that heard entreated that the word should not be spoken to them any more:
- 58\_HEB\_12\_20 [For they could not endure that which was commanded, And if so much as a beast touch the mountain, it shall be stoned, or thrust through with a dart:
- 58\_HEB\_12\_21 And so terrible was the sight, [that] Moses said, I exceedingly fear and quake:]
- 58\_HEB\_12\_22 But ye are come unto mount Sion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to an innumerable company of angels,
- 58\_HEB\_12\_23 To the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect,
- 58\_HEB\_12\_24 And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than [that of] Abel.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_25 See that ye refuse not him that speaketh. For if they escaped not who refused him that spake on earth, much more [shall not] we [escape], if we turn away from him that [speaketh] from heaven:
- 58\_HEB\_12\_26 Whose voice then shook the earth: but now he hath promised, saying, Yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also heaven.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_27 And this [word], Yet once more, signifieth the removing of those things that are shaken, as of things that are made, that those things which cannot be shaken may remain.
- 58\_HEB\_12\_28 Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear:
- 58\_HEB\_12\_29 For our God [is] a consuming fire.



- 58\_HEB\_13\_01 Let brotherly love continue.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_02 Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby some have entertained angels unawares.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_03 Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; [and] them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_04 Marriage [is] honourable in all, and the bed undefiled: but whoremongers and adulterers God will judge.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_05 [Let your] conversation [be] without covetousness; [and be] content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.
- 58 HEB 13 06 So that we may boldly say, The Lord [is] my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_07 Remember them which have the rule over you, who have spoken unto you the word of God: whose faith follow, considering the end of [their] conversation.
- 58 HEB 13 08 Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_09 Be not carried about with divers and strange doctrines. For [it is] a good thing that the heart be established with grace; not with meats, which have not profited them that have been occupied therein.
- 58 HEB 13 10 We have an altar, whereof they have no right to eat which serve the tabernacle.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_11 For the bodies of those beasts, whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest for sin, are burned without the camp.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_12 Wherefore Jesus also, that he might sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered without the gate.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_13 Let us go forth therefore unto him without the camp, bearing his reproach.
- 58 HEB 13 14 For here have we no continuing city, but we seek one to come.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_15 By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of [our] lips giving thanks to his name.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_16 But to do good and to communicate forget not: for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_17 Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that [is] unprofitable for you.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_18 Pray for us: for we trust we have a good conscience, in all things willing to live honestly.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_19 But I beseech [you] the rather to do this, that I may be restored to you the sooner.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_20 Now the God of peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant,
- 58\_HEB\_13\_21 Make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which is wellpleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom [be] glory for ever and ever. Amen.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_22 And I beseech you, brethren, suffer the word of exhortation: for I have written a letter unto you in few words.
- 58 HEB 13 23 Know ye that [our] brother Timothy is set at liberty; with whom, if he come shortly, I will see you.
- 58 HEB 13 24 Salute all them that have the rule over you, and all the saints. They of Italy salute you.
- 58\_HEB\_13\_25 Grace [be] with you all. Amen.
