## Daily Devotional 1 Year Bible

**GEN\_41:47** And in the seven plenteous years the earth brought forth by handfuls.

**GEN\_41:48** And he gathered up all the food of the seven years, which were in the land of Egypt, and laid up the food in the cities: the food of the field, which [was] round about every city, laid he up in the same.

**GEN\_41:49** And Joseph gathered corn as the sand of the sea, very much, until he left numbering; for [it was] without number.

**GEN\_41:50** And unto Joseph were born two sons before the years of famine came, which Asenath the daughter of Potipherah priest of On bare unto him.

**GEN\_41:51** And Joseph called the name of the firstborn Manasseh: For God, [said he], hath made me forget all my toil, and all my father's house.

**GEN\_41:52** And the name of the second called he Ephraim: For God hath caused me to be fruitful in the land of my affliction.

**GEN\_41:53** And the seven years of plenteousness, that was in the land of Egypt, were ended.

**GEN\_41:54** And the seven years of dearth began to come, according as Joseph had said: and the dearth was in all lands; but in all the land of Egypt there was bread.

**GEN\_41:55** And when all the land of Egypt was famished, the people cried to Pharaoh for bread: and Pharaoh said unto all the Egyptians, Go unto Joseph; what he saith to you, do.

**GEN\_41:56** And the famine was over all the face of the earth: And Joseph opened all the storehouses, and sold unto the Egyptians; and the famine waxed sore in the land of Egypt.

**GEN\_41:57** And all countries came into Egypt to Joseph for to buy [corn]; because that the famine was [so] sore in all lands.

**GEN\_42:1** Now when Jacob saw that there was corn in Egypt, Jacob said unto his sons, Why do ye look one upon another?

**GEN\_42:2** And he said, Behold, I have heard that there is corn in Egypt: get you down thither, and buy for us from thence; that we may live, and not die.

**GEN\_42:3** And Joseph's ten brethren went down to buy corn in Egypt.

**GEN\_42:4** But Benjamin, Joseph's brother, Jacob sent not with his brethren; for he said, Lest peradventure mischief befall him.

**GEN\_42:5** And the sons of Israel came to buy [corn] among those that came: for the famine was in the land of Canaan.

**GEN\_42:6** And Joseph [was] the governor over the land, [and] he [it was] that sold to all the people of the land: and Joseph's brethren came, and bowed down themselves before him [with] their faces to the earth.

**GEN\_42:7** And Joseph saw his brethren, and he knew them, but made himself strange unto them, and spake roughly unto them; and he said unto them, Whence come ye? And they said, From the land of Canaan to buy food.

**GEN\_42:8** And Joseph knew his brethren, but they knew not him.

**GEN\_42:9** And Joseph remembered the dreams which he dreamed of them, and said unto them, Ye [are] spies; to see the nakedness of the land ye are come.

**GEN\_42:10** And they said unto him, Nay, my lord, but to buy food are thy servants come.

**GEN\_42:11** We [are] all one man's sons; we [are] true [men], thy servants are no spies.

**GEN\_42:12** And he said unto them, Nay, but to see the nakedness of the land ye are come.

**GEN\_42:13** And they said, Thy servants [are] twelve brethren, the sons of one man in the land of Canaan; and, behold, the youngest [is] this day with our father, and one [is] not.

**GEN\_42:14** And Joseph said unto them, That [is it] that I spake unto you, saying, Ye [are] spies:

**GEN\_42:15** Hereby ye shall be proved: By the life of Pharaoh ye shall not go forth hence, except your youngest brother come hither.

**GEN\_42:16** Send one of you, and let him fetch your brother, and ye shall be kept in prison, that your words may be proved, whether [there be any] truth in you: or else by the life of Pharaoh surely ye [are] spies.

**GEN\_42:17** And he put them all together into ward three days.

**GEN\_42:18** And Joseph said unto them the third day, This do, and live; [for] I fear God:

**GEN\_42:19** If ye [be] true [men], let one of your brethren be bound in the house of your prison: go ye, carry corn for the famine of your houses:

**GEN\_42:20** But bring your youngest brother unto me; so shall your words be verified, and ye shall not die. And they did so.

**GEN\_42:21** And they said one to another, We [are] verily guilty concerning our brother, in that we saw the anguish of his soul, when he besought us, and we would not hear; therefore is this distress come upon us.

**GEN\_42:22** And Reuben answered them, saying, Spake I not unto you, saying, Do not sin against the child; and ye would not hear? therefore, behold, also his blood is required.

**GEN\_42:23** And they knew not that Joseph understood [them]; for he spake unto them by an interpreter.

**GEN\_42:24** And he turned himself about from them, and wept; and returned to them again, and communed with them, and took from them Simeon, and bound him before their eyes.

**GEN\_42:25** Then Joseph commanded to fill their sacks with corn, and to restore every man's money into

his sack, and to give them provision for the way: and thus did he unto them.

**GEN\_42:26** And they laded their asses with the corn, and departed thence.

**GEN\_42:27** And as one of them opened his sack to give his ass provender in the inn, he espied his money; for, behold, it [was] in his sack's mouth.

**GEN\_42:28** And he said unto his brethren, My money is restored; and, lo, [it is] even in my sack: and their heart failed [them], and they were afraid, saying one to another, What [is] this [that] God hath done unto us?

**GEN\_42:29** And they came unto Jacob their father unto the land of Canaan, and told him all that befell unto them; saying,

**GEN\_42:30** The man, [who is] the lord of the land, spake roughly to us, and took us for spies of the country.

**GEN\_42:31** And we said unto him, We [are] true [men]; we are no spies:

**GEN\_42:32** We [be] twelve brethren, sons of our father; one [is] not, and the youngest [is] this day with our father in the land of Canaan.

**GEN\_42:33** And the man, the lord of the country, said unto us, Hereby shall I know that ye [are] true [men]; leave one of your brethren [here] with me, and take [food for] the famine of your households, and be gone:

**GEN\_42:34** And bring your youngest brother unto me: then shall I know that ye [are] no spies, but [that] ye [are] true [men: so] will I deliver you your brother, and ye shall traffic in the land.

**GEN\_42:35** And it came to pass as they emptied their sacks, that, behold, every man's bundle of money [was] in his sack: and when [both] they and their father saw the bundles of money, they were afraid.

**GEN\_42:36** And Jacob their father said unto them, Me have ye bereaved [of my children]: Joseph [is] not, and Simeon [is] not, and ye will take Benjamin [away]: all these things are against me.

**GEN\_42:37** And Reuben spake unto his father, saying, Slay my two sons, if I bring him not to thee: deliver him into my hand, and I will bring him to thee again.

**GEN\_42:38** And he said, My son shall not go down with you; for his brother is dead, and he is left alone: if mischief befall him by the way in the which ye go, then shall ye bring down my gray hairs with sorrow to the grave.

**GEN\_43:1** And the famine [was] sore in the land.

**GEN\_43:2** And it came to pass, when they had eaten up the corn which they had brought out of Egypt, their father said unto them, Go again, buy us a little food.

**GEN\_43:3** And Judah spake unto him, saying, The man did solemnly protest unto us, saying, Ye shall not see my face, except your brother [be] with you.

**GEN\_43:4** If thou wilt send our brother with us, we will go down and buy thee food:

**GEN\_43:5** But if thou wilt not send [him], we will not go down: for the man said unto us, Ye shall not see my face, except your brother [be] with you.

**GEN\_43:6** And Israel said, Wherefore dealt ye [so] ill with me, [as] to tell the man whether ye had yet a brother?

**GEN\_43:7** And they said, The man asked us straitly of our state, and of our kindred, saying, [Is] your father yet alive? have ye [another] brother? and we told him according to the tenor of these words: could we certainly know that he would say, Bring your brother down?

**GEN\_43:8** And Judah said unto Israel his father, Send the lad with me, and we will arise and go; that we may live, and not die, both we, and thou, [and] also our little ones.

**GEN\_43:9** I will be surety for him; of my hand shalt thou require him: if I bring him not unto thee, and set him before thee, then let me bear the blame for ever:

**GEN\_43:10** For except we had lingered, surely now we had returned this second time.

**GEN\_43:11** And their father Israel said unto them, If [it must be] so now, do this; take of the best fruits in the land in your vessels, and carry down the man a present, a little balm, and a little honey, spices, and myrrh, nuts, and almonds:

**MAT\_13:36** Then Jesus sent the multitude away, and went into the house: and his disciples came unto him, saying, Declare unto us the parable of the tares of the field.

**MAT\_13:37** He answered and said unto them, He that soweth the good seed is the Son of man;

**MAT\_13:38** The field is the world; the good seed are the children of the kingdom; but the tares are the children of the wicked [one];

**MAT\_13:39** The enemy that sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; and the reapers are the angels.

**MAT\_13:40** As therefore the tares are gathered and burned in the fire; so shall it be in the end of this world.

**MAT\_13:41** The Son of man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offend, and them which do iniquity;

**MAT\_13:42** And shall cast them into a furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth.

**MAT\_13:43** Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.

**MAT\_13:44** Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field; the which when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field.

**MAT\_13:45** Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls:

**MAT\_13:46** Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it.

**MAT\_13:47** Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a net, that was cast into the sea, and gathered of every kind:

**MAT\_13:48** Which, when it was full, they drew to shore, and sat down, and gathered the good into vessels, but cast the bad away.

**MAT\_13:49** So shall it be at the end of the world: the angels shall come forth, and sever the wicked from

among the just,

**MAT\_13:50** And shall cast them into the furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth.

**MAT\_13:51** Jesus saith unto them, Have ye understood all these things? They say unto him, Yea, Lord.

**MAT\_13:52** Then said he unto them, Therefore every scribe [which is] instructed unto the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man [that is] an householder, which bringeth forth out of his treasure [things] new and old.

**MAT\_13:53** And it came to pass, [that] when Jesus had finished these parables, he departed thence.

**MAT\_13:54** And when he was come into his own country, he taught them in their synagogue, insomuch that they were astonished, and said, Whence hath this [man] this wisdom, and [these] mighty works?

**MAT\_13:55** Is not this the carpenter's son? is not his mother called Mary? and his brethren, James, and Joses, and Simon, and Judas?

**MAT\_13:56** And his sisters, are they not all with us? Whence then hath this [man] all these things?

**PSA\_12:1** To the chief Musician upon Sheminith, A Psalm of David. Help, LORD; for the godly man ceaseth; for the faithful fail from among the children of men.

**PSA\_12:2** They speak vanity every one with his neighbour: [with] flattering lips [and] with a double heart do they speak.

**PSA\_12:3** The LORD shall cut off all flattering lips, [and] the tongue that speaketh proud things:

**PSA\_12:4** Who have said, With our tongue will we prevail; our lips [are] our own: who [is] lord over us?

**PSA\_12:5** For the oppression of the poor, for the sighing of the needy, now will I arise, saith the LORD; I will set [him] in safety [from him that] puffeth at him.

**PSA\_12:6** The words of the LORD [are] pure words: [as] silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times.

**PRO\_2:21** For the upright shall dwell in the land, and the perfect shall remain in it.

**PRO\_2:22** But the wicked shall be cut off from the earth, and the transgressors shall be rooted out of it.

**PRO\_3:1** My son, forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments:

**MATJ\_7:22** Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?

**MATJ\_7:23** And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.

**MATJ\_7:24** Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock:

**MATJ\_7:25** And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock.

**MATJ\_7:26** And every one that heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand:
