## Daily Devotional 1 Year Bible

**2KI\_19:29** And this [shall be] a sign unto thee, Ye shall eat this year such things as grow of themselves, and in the second year that which springeth of the same; and in the third year sow ye, and reap, and plant vineyards, and eat the fruits thereof.

**2KI\_19:30** And the remnant that is escaped of the house of Judah shall yet again take root downward, and bear fruit upward.

**2KI\_19:31** For out of Jerusalem shall go forth a remnant, and they that escape out of mount Zion: the zeal of the LORD [of hosts] shall do this.

**2KI\_19:32** Therefore thus saith the LORD concerning the king of Assyria, He shall not come into this city, nor shoot an arrow there, nor come before it with shield, nor cast a bank against it.

**2KI\_19:33** By the way that he came, by the same shall he return, and shall not come into this city, saith the LORD.

**2KI\_19:34** For I will defend this city, to save it, for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.

**2KI\_19:35** And it came to pass that night, that the angel of the LORD went out, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they [were] all dead corpses.

**2KI\_19:36** So Sennacherib king of Assyria departed, and went and returned, and dwelt at Nineveh.

**2KI\_19:37** And it came to pass, as he was worshipping in the house of Nisroch his god, that Adrammelech and Sharezer his sons smote him with the sword: and they escaped into the land of Armenia. And Esarhaddon his son reigned in his stead.

**2KI\_20:1** In those days was Hezekiah sick unto death. And the prophet Isaiah the son of Amoz came to him, and said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Set thine house in order; for thou shalt die, and not live.

**2KI\_20:2** Then he turned his face to the wall, and prayed unto the LORD, saying,

**2KI\_20:3** I beseech thee, O LORD, remember now how I have walked before thee in truth and with a perfect heart, and have done [that which is] good in thy sight. And Hezekiah wept sore.

**2KI\_20:4** And it came to pass, afore Isaiah was gone out into the middle court, that the word of the LORD came to him, saying,

**2KI\_20:5** Turn again, and tell Hezekiah the captain of my people, Thus saith the LORD, the God of David thy father, I have heard thy prayer, I have seen thy tears: behold, I will heal thee: on the third day thou

**shalt go up unto the house of the LORD.**

**2KI\_20:6 And I will add unto thy days fifteen years; and I will deliver thee and this city out of the hand of the king of Assyria; and I will defend this city for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.**

**2KI\_20:7 And Isaiah said, Take a lump of figs. And they took and laid [it] on the boil, and he recovered.**

**2KI\_20:8 And Hezekiah said unto Isaiah, What [shall be] the sign that the LORD will heal me, and that I shall go up into the house of the LORD the third day?**

**2KI\_20:9 And Isaiah said, This sign shalt thou have of the LORD, that the LORD will do the thing that he hath spoken: shall the shadow go forward ten degrees, or go back ten degrees?**

**2KI\_20:10 And Hezekiah answered, It is a light thing for the shadow to go down ten degrees: nay, but let the shadow return backward ten degrees.**

**2KI\_20:11 And Isaiah the prophet cried unto the LORD: and he brought the shadow ten degrees backward, by which it had gone down in the dial of Ahaz.**

**2KI\_20:12 At that time Berodachbaladan, the son of Baladan, king of Babylon, sent letters and a present unto Hezekiah: for he had heard that Hezekiah had been sick.**

**2KI\_20:13 And Hezekiah hearkened unto them, and showed them all the house of his precious things, the silver, and the gold, and the spices, and the precious ointment, and [all] the house of his armour, and all that was found in his treasures: there was nothing in his house, nor in all his dominion, that Hezekiah showed them not.**

**2KI\_20:14 Then came Isaiah the prophet unto king Hezekiah, and said unto him, What said these men? and from whence came they unto thee? And Hezekiah said, They are come from a far country, [even] from Babylon.**

**2KI\_20:15 And he said, What have they seen in thine house? And Hezekiah answered, All [the things] that [are] in mine house have they seen: there is nothing among my treasures that I have not showed them.**

**2KI\_20:16 And Isaiah said unto Hezekiah, Hear the word of the LORD.**

**2KI\_20:17 Behold, the days come, that all that [is] in thine house, and that which thy fathers have laid up in store unto this day, shall be carried into Babylon: nothing shall be left, saith the LORD.**

**2KI\_20:18 And of thy sons that shall issue from thee, which thou shalt beget, shall they take away; and they shall be eunuchs in the palace of the king of Babylon.**

**2KI\_20:19 Then said Hezekiah unto Isaiah, Good [is] the word of the LORD which thou hast spoken. And he said, [Is it] not [good], if peace and truth be in my days?**

**2KI\_20:20 And the rest of the acts of Hezekiah, and all his might, and how he made a pool, and a conduit, and brought water into the city, [are] they not written in the book of the chronicles of the kings of Judah?**

**2KI\_20:21 And Hezekiah slept with his fathers: and Manasseh his son reigned in his stead.**

**2KI\_21:1 Manasseh [was] twelve years old when he began to reign, and reigned fifty and five years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Hephzibah.**

**2KI\_21:2 And he did [that which was] evil in the sight of the LORD, after the abominations of the heathen, whom the LORD cast out before the children of Israel.**

**2KI\_21:3** For he built up again the high places which Hezekiah his father had destroyed; and he reared up altars for Baal, and made a grove, as did Ahab king of Israel; and worshipped all the host of heaven, and served them.

**2KI\_21:4** And he built altars in the house of the LORD, of which the LORD said, In Jerusalem will I put my name.

**2KI\_21:5** And he built altars for all the host of heaven in the two courts of the house of the LORD.

**2KI\_21:6** And he made his son pass through the fire, and observed times, and used enchantments, and dealt with familiar spirits and wizards: he wrought much wickedness in the sight of the LORD, to provoke [him] to anger.

**2KI\_21:7** And he set a graven image of the grove that he had made in the house, of which the LORD said to David, and to Solomon his son, In this house, and in Jerusalem, which I have chosen out of all tribes of Israel, will I put my name for ever:

**2KI\_21:8** Neither will I make the feet of Israel move any more out of the land which I gave their fathers; only if they will observe to do according to all that I have commanded them, and according to all the law that my servant Moses commanded them.

**2KI\_21:9** But they hearkened not: and Manasseh seduced them to do more evil than did the nations whom the LORD destroyed before the children of Israel.

**2KI\_21:10** And the LORD spake by his servants the prophets, saying,

**2KI\_21:11** Because Manasseh king of Judah hath done these abominations, [and] hath done wickedly above all that the Amorites did, which [were] before him, and hath made Judah also to sin with his idols:

**2KI\_21:12** Therefore thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Behold, I [am] bringing [such] evil upon Jerusalem and Judah, that whosoever heareth of it, both his ears shall tingle.

**2KI\_21:13** And I will stretch over Jerusalem the line of Samaria, and the plummet of the house of Ahab: and I will wipe Jerusalem as [a man] wipeth a dish, wiping [it], and turning [it] upside down.

**2KI\_21:14** And I will forsake the remnant of mine inheritance, and deliver them into the hand of their enemies; and they shall become a prey and a spoil to all their enemies;

**2KI\_21:15** Because they have done [that which was] evil in my sight, and have provoked me to anger, since the day their fathers came forth out of Egypt, even unto this day.

**2KI\_21:16** Moreover Manasseh shed innocent blood very much, till he had filled Jerusalem from one end to another; beside his sin wherewith he made Judah to sin, in doing [that which was] evil in the sight of the LORD.

**2KI\_21:17** Now the rest of the acts of Manasseh, and all that he did, and his sin that he sinned, [are] they not written in the book of the chronicles of the kings of Judah?

**2KI\_21:18** And Manasseh slept with his fathers, and was buried in the garden of his own house, in the garden of Uzza: and Amon his son reigned in his stead.

**2KI\_21:19** Amon [was] twenty and two years old when he began to reign, and he reigned two years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Meshullemeth, the daughter of Haruz of Jotbah.

**2KI\_21:20** And he did [that which was] evil in the sight of the LORD, as his father Manasseh did.

**ACT\_8:23** For I perceive that thou art in the gall of bitterness, and [in] the bond of iniquity.

**ACT\_8:24** Then answered Simon, and said, Pray ye to the Lord for me, that none of these things which ye have spoken come upon me.

**ACT\_8:25** And they, when they had testified and preached the word of the Lord, returned to Jerusalem, and preached the gospel in many villages of the Samaritans.

**ACT\_8:26** And the angel of the Lord spake unto Philip, saying, Arise, and go toward the south unto the way that goeth down from Jerusalem unto Gaza, which is desert.

**ACT\_8:27** And he arose and went: and, behold, a man of Ethiopia, an eunuch of great authority under Candace queen of the Ethiopians, who had the charge of all her treasure, and had come to Jerusalem for to worship,

**ACT\_8:28** Was returning, and sitting in his chariot read Esaias the prophet.

**ACT\_8:29** Then the Spirit said unto Philip, Go near, and join thyself to this chariot.

**ACT\_8:30** And Philip ran thither to [him], and heard him read the prophet Esaias, and said, Understandest thou what thou readest?

**ACT\_8:31** And he said, How can I, except some man should guide me? And he desired Philip that he would come up and sit with him.

**ACT\_8:32** The place of the scripture which he read was this, He was led as a sheep to the slaughter; and like a lamb dumb before his shearer, so opened he not his mouth:

**ACT\_8:33** In his humiliation his judgment was taken away: and who shall declare his generation? for his life is taken from the earth.

**ACT\_8:34** And the eunuch answered Philip, and said, I pray thee, of whom speaketh the prophet this? of himself, or of some other man?

**ACT\_8:35** Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same scripture, and preached unto him Jesus.

**ACT\_8:36** And as they went on [their] way, they came unto a certain water: and the eunuch said, See, [here is] water; what doth hinder me to be baptized?

**ACT\_8:37** And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.

**ACT\_8:38** And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him.

**ACT\_8:39** And when they were come up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught away Philip, that the eunuch saw him no more: and he went on his way rejoicing.

**ACT\_8:40** But Philip was found at Azotus: and passing through he preached in all the cities, till he came to Caesarea.

**ACT\_9:1** And Saul, yet breathing out threatenings and slaughter against the disciples of the Lord, went unto the high priest,

**ACT\_9:2** And desired of him letters to Damascus to the synagogues, that if he found any of this way, whether they were men or women, he might bring them bound unto Jerusalem.

**PSA\_78:19** Yea, they spake against God; they said, Can God furnish a table in the wilderness?

**PSA\_78:20** Behold, he smote the rock, that the waters gushed out, and the streams overflowed; can he give bread also? can he provide flesh for his people?

**PSA\_78:21** Therefore the LORD heard [this], and was wroth: so a fire was kindled against Jacob, and anger also came up against Israel;

**PSA\_78:22** Because they believed not in God, and trusted not in his salvation:

**PSA\_78:23** Though he had commanded the clouds from above, and opened the doors of heaven,

**PSA\_78:24** And had rained down manna upon them to eat, and had given them of the corn of heaven.

**PSA\_78:25** Man did eat angels' food: he sent them meat to the full.

**PRO\_17:9** He that covereth a transgression seeketh love; but he that repeateth a matter separateth [very] friends.

**PRO\_17:10** A reproof entereth more into a wise man than an hundred stripes into a fool.

**LUKJ\_8:15** But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep [it], and bring forth fruit with patience.

**LUKJ\_8:16** No man, when he hath lighted a candle, covereth it with a vessel, or putteth [it] under a bed; but setteth [it] on a candlestick, that they which enter in may see the light.

**LUKJ\_8:17** For nothing is secret, that shall not be made manifest; neither [any thing] hid, that shall not be known and come abroad.

**LUKJ\_8:18** Take heed therefore how ye hear: for whosoever hath, to him shall be given; and whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he seemeth to have.
